The fund shall consist of transfers, 19 20 distributions, appropriations, gifts, grants, donations and bequests made to the fund. Income from the fund shall be 21 credited to the fund, and money in the fund shall not revert 22 or be transferred to any other fund at the end of a fiscal 23 year. Money in the fund is appropriated to the fire 24 protection grant council for the purposes of making 25

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1 distributions approved by the council for the critical needs 2 of municipal fire departments and county fire districts. 3 Expenditures from the fund shall be made on warrant of the 4 secretary of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers 5 signed by the marshal." FIRE PROTECTION GRANT COUNCIL--DUTIES.--The "fire protection grant council" is created. 9 Α. 10 The council consists of: (1) a representative of the New Mexico 11 municipal league; 12 13 (2) a representative of the New Mexico association of counties; 14 15 (3) two members appointed by the fire services council, who shall serve at the pleasure of the 16 council; 17 three members, one from each (4) 18 congressional district, appointed by the governor who shall 19 20 serve at the pleasure of the governor; and the marshal, who shall serve as a (5) 21 nonvoting advisory member. Applications for grant assistance from the fire 16 protection grant fund shall be made by fire districts to the council in accordance with the requirements of the council. 17 Using criteria developed by the council, the council shall 18 evaluate applications and prioritize those applications most 19 20 in need of grant assistance from the fund. To the extent that money in the fund is available, the council shall award 21 grant assistance for those prioritized applications. 22

E. In awarding grant assistance, the council may
require conditions and procedures necessary to ensure that
the money is expended in the most prudent manner.

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1	F. When considering applications for grant		
2	assistance to pay stipends to volunteer firefighters, the		
3	council shall:		
4	(1) ensure the proposed stipends will comply		
5	with the federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 and United		
6	States department of labor requirements for maintaining		
7	volunteer status;		
8	(2) require a basic level of training before		
9	a volunteer may receive a stipend;		
10	(3) consider whether the fire district		
11	requires a service commitment from its volunteer firefighters		
12	in exchange for stipends; and		
13	(4) weight the applications against other		
14	criteria or requirements determined by the council."
