8	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the	
9	"Long-Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act".	
10	SECTION 2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Long-Term Care	
11	Facility Dementia Training Act:	
12	A. "department" means the department of health;	
13	B. "direct care service" means services provided	
14	to long-term care facility residents that maintain or improve	
15	the health and quality of life of the residents;	
16	C. "direct care service staff member" means a	
17	person:	
18	(1) employed by or contracted with a	
19	long-term care facility, either directly or through a	
20	third-party agreement, to provide in-person direct care	
21	services to long-term care facility residents; or	
22	(2) contracted with a long-term care	
23	facility, either directly or through a third-party agreement,	
24	to provide at least ten hours per week in direct care

1 D. "long-term care facility" means every long-term 2 care facility licensed by the state. 3 SECTION 3. TRAINING REQUIRED.--4 Each long-term care facility and long-term care Α. 5 facility contractor that is subject to the Long-Term Care 6 Facility Dementia Training Act shall provide training from the department's current list of approved standardized 7 8 training programs and continuing education as prescribed by 9 the department to each direct care service staff member that 10 it employs on: standards approved by the department for (1) 11 recognizing and treating Alzheimer's disease and dementia; 12 13 (2) person-centered care; (3) activities of daily living; and 14 15 (4) any other subjects within the scope of long-term care facility dementia training identified by the 16 department pursuant to the Long-Term Care Facility Dementia 17 Training Act. 18 B. Training may be online or in-person and shall 19 20 be a training program of at least four hours and approved by the department pursuant to Section 5 of the Long-Term Care 21 Facility Dementia Training Act. 22 C. A person conducting the training shall have: 23 at least two years of work experience 24 (1)related to Alzheimer's disease, dementia, health care, 25

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1 gerontology or other related field; and 2 successfully completed training (2) 3 equivalent to the requirements provided in the Long-Term Care 4 Facility Dementia Training Act, including passage of any 5 skills competency or knowledge test required by the 6 department pursuant to Subsection B of Section 4 of the Long-Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act. 7 8 D. Every direct care service staff member shall complete the requirements for and obtain certification as 9 10 provided in Subsection E of this section. Ε. A direct care service staff member: 11 hired after January 1, 2022 shall 12 (1) complete the training required pursuant to this section 13 within sixty days of the start of employment; 14 15 (2) hired prior to January 1, 2022 who has 16 not received training within the past twenty-four months equivalent to the requirements set forth in the Long-Term 17 Care Facility Dementia Training Act shall complete training 18 within sixty days of January 1, 2022; 19 20 (3) hired prior to January 1, 2022 who received training within the past twenty-four months 21 equivalent to the requirements set forth in the Long-Term 22 Care Facility Dementia Training Act shall be issued a 23 training certificate by the department; and 24 25 (4) who has successfully obtained a training

HSEIC/CS HB 250/A Page 3 certificate but has had a lapse of dementia-related direct care service employment for twenty-four consecutive months or more shall complete training within sixty days of the start of employment.

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5 F. Every long-term care facility contractor that 6 is subject to the Long-Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act shall provide a copy of every direct care service staff 7 member's dementia training certificate obtained pursuant to 8 Paragraph (3) of Subsection E of this section or Section 5 of 9 the Long-Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act to every 10 long-term care facility where that staff member provides 11 direct care service. 12

SECTION 4. DEPARTMENT OVERSIGHT AND RULEMAKING.--In
consultation with the aging and long-term services
department, the department shall:

A. identify, approve, publish a list of and periodically review online or in-person standardized training programs that meet the requirements of the Long-Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act;

B. develop or approve and periodically review
required evaluation instruments that demonstrate competency
and knowledge gained in training topics;

C. promulgate rules:

(1) for evaluation and continuing education on the training topics for treatment and care of persons with

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1 Alzheimer's disease or dementia; and as necessary to carry out the Long-Term 2 (2) 3 Care Facility Dementia Training Act; 4 issue interpretative guidance as necessary to D. 5 ensure compliance with the Long-Term Care Facility Dementia 6 Training Act; oversee and approve all long-term care facility 7 Ε. 8 dementia training programs related to the Long-Term Care 9 Facility Dementia Training Act; 10 F. issue training certificates pursuant to Paragraph (3) of Subsection E of Section 3 of the Long-Term 11 Care Facility Dementia Training Act; and 12 G. give notice of the requirements of the Long-13 Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act to long-term care 14 facilities within ninety days of the effective date of that 15 16 act. DEMENTIA TRAINING CERTIFICATES.--The SECTION 5. 17 provider of training conducted pursuant to the Long-Term Care 18 Facility Dementia Training Act shall issue a certificate to 19 20 staff upon completion of initial training. The certificate shall be valid so long as the certificate holder meets the 21 continuing education requirements set forth by the department 22 pursuant to the Long-Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act 23 and the certificate holder has not had a lapse of dementia-24 related direct care service employment for twenty-four 25

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1	consecutive months or more. The certificate shall be valid	
2	among long-term care facilities. Each long-term care facility	
3	and long-term care facility contractor that is subject to the	
4	Long-Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act shall be	
5	responsible for maintaining documentation regarding completed	
6	dementia training, evaluation and continuing education for
