## B. As used in this section:

- (1) "pretrial risk assessment instrument"
  means an objective, standardized analysis of information about
  an arrested person that accurately measures the arrested
  person's probability of appearing in court as required and the
  arrested person's potential risk of criminal conduct while on
  pretrial release pending trial; and
- (2) "validated" means developed through peerreviewed research and statistical analysis based on the
  characteristics of the population being assessed as enumerated
  in this section.
