18	SECTION 1. Section 60-2C-8.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1997,

23	A. The governing body of a municipality may hold a
24	hearing to determine if fireworks restrictions should be
25	imposed within the boundaries of the incorporated municipality

this section, the governing body of a municipality shall issue
a proclamation declaring extreme or severe drought conditions

proclamation may:

(1) [shall] ban the sale and use of missile-type rockets, helicopters, aerial spinners, stick-type rockets and ground audible devices within the affected drought area; [and

A proclamation shall explain restrictions on the sale or use of fireworks and permitted sales or uses of fireworks.

D. A municipal governing body's proclamation shall be effective for thirty days and the governing body may issue succeeding proclamations if [extreme or severe drought] conditions warrant. A proclamation may be modified or rescinded within its thirty-day period by the governing body upon conducting an emergency hearing to determine if [weather] fire danger conditions have improved.

The governing body of a county may hold a Ε. hearing to determine if fireworks restrictions should be imposed within the unincorporated portions of the county affected by extreme or severe drought conditions or emergency or heightened fire danger conditions. The findings of the governing body shall be based on current drought indices published by the national weather service, information supplied .205208.2

Pursuant to any hearing under Subsection E of this section, the governing body of a county shall issue a proclamation declaring extreme or severe drought conditions or <u>emergency or heightened fire danger conditions</u> within the unincorporated portions of the county if the governing body determines such conditions exist. The governing body's proclamation <u>may</u>:

[The] A county governing body's proclamation 1 declaring an extreme or severe drought or heightened fire 2 danger condition shall be issued no less than [twenty] ten days 3 prior to a holiday for which fireworks may be sold, [The] and a 4 proclamation of an emergency fire danger may be issued at any 5 time. A proclamation shall explain restrictions on the sale or 6 use of fireworks and permitted sales or uses of fireworks. 7 [Except as otherwise provided in this н. 8 subsection] A county governing body's proclamation shall be 9 effective for thirty days, and the [county] governing body may 10 issue succeeding proclamations if [extreme or severe drought] 11 conditions warrant. A proclamation may be modified or 12 rescinded within its thirty-day period by the governing body 13 upon conducting an emergency hearing to determine if [weather] 14 fire danger conditions have improved. 15 The fire marshal division of the public I. 16 regulation commission may hold a hearing to determine if 17 fireworks restrictions should be imposed within the boundaries 18 of any area of the state affected by extreme or severe drought 19 conditions or emergency or heightened fire danger conditions. 20 The findings of the fire marshal division shall be based on 21 current drought indices published by the national weather 22 service, information supplied by the United States forest 23 service and any other relevant information. 24
