"intern" means an individual who is a student 2 or a young and beginning farmer or rancher employed by an 3 agricultural business pursuant to the program; and "program" means the New Mexico agricultural 4 G. 5 workforce development program. SECTION 3. AGRICULTURAL WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM 6 7 CREATED--GENERAL PROVISIONS--RULEMAKING.--Α. The "New Mexico agricultural workforce 8 development program" is created and shall be administered by 9 10 the department. The department shall establish policies for the program that specify, at a minimum: 11 (1) criteria for selecting agricultural 12 businesses for participation in the program, including the 13 ability of a business to effectively supervise an intern and 14 15 offer the intern an opportunity to obtain meaningful work experience through the business; 16 (2) criteria for an internship to qualify 17 under the program, including requirements that the 18 internship: 19 20 (a) provide an intern with at least one hundred thirty hours of work experience; 21 (b) not exceed one year in duration per 22 intern; and 23 24 (c) pay an intern an hourly wage rate 25 that is no less than the minimum wage rate established in

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1 Section 50-4-22 NMSA 1978; criteria for an agricultural business to 2 (3) 3 use in selecting qualified interns; provided that an immediate family member shall not be eligible to qualify as 4 5 an intern; (4) the process and timetable for selecting 6 7 qualified agricultural businesses and qualified interns; (5) accounting requirements for tracking 8 internship costs; and 9 10 (6) the process for an agricultural business to seek reimbursement. 11 Subject to appropriations by the legislature, 12 Β. the board, on behalf of the department, may reimburse a 13 participating agricultural business in an amount not to 14 15 exceed fifty percent of the actual cost to the business of 16 participating in the program. Actual cost includes the wages paid to an intern, a reasonable allocation of fixed overhead 17 expenses and all incidental costs directly related to the 18 Based on the annual appropriation for the 19 internship. 20 program, the director shall determine how many internships may be approved, the amount of reimbursement per internship 21 and whether an agricultural business may be reimbursed for 22 more than one intern in the same calendar year; provided that 23 an agricultural business shall not be reimbursed for more 24 than three internships in the same calendar year. 25
