Ε. create, implement and continually evaluate the 8 effectiveness of a framework for targeted, individualized 9 10 interventions for individuals who are incarcerated in a county or municipal correctional facility and adult and 11 juvenile offenders who have behavioral health diagnoses, 12 which framework shall address those persons' behavioral 13 health needs while they are incarcerated and connect them to 14 15 resources and services immediately upon release;

F. establish criteria for determining individual eligibility for behavioral health services; and

18 G. maintain a management information system in 19 accordance with standards for reporting clinical and fiscal 20 information."
