16	SECTION 1. A new section of the Public Health Act is

19	A. The department shall promulgate rules to develop
20	a universal prenatal substance exposure screening tool. The
21	screening tool shall:
22	(1) be a survey performed by a health care
23	provider during every prenatal checkup; and
24	(2) include questions that investigate whether
25	a pregnant patient has consumed any drugs or alcohol during the

1 patient's pregnancy.

B. All answers provided by pregnant patients in
response to the universal prenatal substance exposure screening
tool shall be confidential. Evidence of prenatal substance
exposure that results from the screening tool shall not subject
a pregnant patient to the requirements of the Family Services
Act.

8 C. If a pregnant patient's answers to the universal
9 prenatal substance exposure screening tool indicate risk of
10 prenatal substance exposure, the health care provider
11 administering the screening tool shall refer the patient to a
12 provider that offers prenatal substance use treatment."
