POWERS AND DUTIES OF BOARD.--The board shall: approve or disapprove the appointment of the 21 director by the secretary; 22 develop and implement a planned program of: 23 (1) basic law enforcement training and 24 in-service law enforcement training, a portion of which may be 25

- (3) initial and in-service training for certified and commissioned law enforcement officers employed by the New Mexico state police division, municipal police departments and county sheriff offices that is specific to best practices for law enforcement and school interactions;
  - D. report annually to the governor;
- in its discretion, accept donations, Ε. contributions, grants or gifts from whatever source for the benefit of the academy, which donations, contributions, grants or gifts are appropriated for the use of the academy;
- adopt, publish and file, in accordance with the provisions of the State Rules Act, all regulations and rules concerning the operation of the academy and the implementation and enforcement of the provisions of the Law Enforcement Training Act and the Public Safety Telecommunicator Training Act;
  - issue, grant, deny, renew, suspend or revoke a:
- (1) peace officer's certification for any cause set forth in the provisions of the Law Enforcement Training Act; and
- telecommunicator's certification for any (2) just cause set forth in the Public Safety Telecommunicator .213237.1
