11 RELATING TO CANNABIS REGULATION; REQUIRING A SEED-TO-SALE
12 TRACKING SYSTEM; REQUIRING A WEBSITE DASHBOARD THAT INCLUDES
13 REPORTS ON ENFORCEMENT OF THE CANNABIS REGULATION ACT AND
14 SUPPLY CHAIN ACTIVITY.
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16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

17 SECTION 1. Section 26-2C-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2021
18 (1st S.S.), Chapter 4, Section 1) is amended to read:

19 "26-2C-1. SHORT TITLE.--~~[Sections 1 through 42 of this~~
20 ~~act]~~ Chapter 26, Article 2C NMSA 1978 may be cited as the
21 "Cannabis Regulation Act"."

22 SECTION 2. A new section of the Cannabis Regulation Act
23 is enacted to read:

24 "[NEW MATERIAL] SEED-TO-SALE TRACKING SYSTEM.--

25 A. The division shall develop and maintain a seed-

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1 to-sale tracking system that tracks cannabis from either the
2 seed or immature plant stage through the sale of cannabis or
3 cannabis product to a consumer to ensure that no cannabis or
4 cannabis product is grown, processed, produced, manufactured,
5 sold, resold or otherwise transferred in New Mexico except as
6 allowed in the Cannabis Regulation Act; provided that the
7 tracking system shall not apply to cannabis grown for personal
8 use.

9 B. The tracking system shall include any cannabis
10 product recalls, and the division shall issue a health and
11 safety advisory when a cannabis product is recalled."

12 SECTION 3. A new section of the Cannabis Regulation Act
13 is enacted to read:

14 "[NEW MATERIAL] WEBSITE DASHBOARD--COMPLIANCE AND
15 ENFORCEMENT--SUPPLY CHAIN ACTIVITY.--

16 A. The division shall conduct at least two
17 compliance checks each year at each cannabis retailer and shall
18 conduct one or more compliance checks on other cannabis
19 establishments each year.

20 B. The division shall maintain on its website a
21 dashboard with information that includes:

22 (1) compliance-check records, recall records
23 and records of minors in possession of cannabis; provided that
24 the website shall not include the name of any minor;

25 (2) an online method for submitting anonymous

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1 tips related to licensing violations;

2 (3) compliance checks, including:

3 (a) the number of compliance checks
4 conducted by cannabis establishment type;

5 (b) the number of underage compliance
6 checks;

7 (c) the number of underage sales
8 violations, including the name of the license violator, how
9 many violations were the result of underage compliance checks
10 or tips and the penalties imposed for each violation;

11 (d) a description of black- or gray-
12 market enforcement activities undertaken by the division or law
13 enforcement agencies, including the dates of the activities,
14 any violations found and the result of those violations if
15 known; and

16 (e) the number of cannabis product
17 recalls by licensee and product type;

18 (4) a summary of supply chain activity,
19 including:

20 (a) cannabis and cannabis product sales;

21 (b) number of cultivated plants;

22 (c) total weight of wet and dry
23 harvested plants;

24 (d) average price per gram;

25 (e) number of licenses in each category;

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(f) number of cannabis plants and products recalled and public safety advisories issued; and
(g) maps showing locations of cannabis establishments by type; and
(5) any other information determined by the division."

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2023.

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
