19	A. Unlawful carrying of a firearm in the state
20	capitol consists of carrying a firearm in the state capitol
21	except by:
22	(1) a law enforcement officer, whether on duty
23	or off duty;
24	(2) legislative security personnel pursuant to
25	policies adopted by the New Mexico legislative council;
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(3) active duty members of the United States
 armed services or the New Mexico national guard when the
 carrying of a firearm is in the course of their official
 duties; and

5 the governor and the lieutenant governor. (4) Subsection A of this section shall not apply to 6 Β. 7 persons who, with the permission of the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee, are 8 9 carrying firearms for display purposes so long as such firearms are not loaded and have a trigger lock that is engaged on the 10 firearm. 11

C. The legislative council service shall conspicuously post notices at the state capitol that state that it is unlawful to carry a firearm in the state capitol.

D. As used in this section:

(1) "law enforcement officer" means a federal, state, tribal or municipal police officer, county sheriff, deputy sheriff, conservation officer, motor transportation enforcement officer or other federal, state, county or municipal employee authorized by federal or state law to enforce criminal statutes;

(2) "legislative security personnel" means a person employed by the legislative council service to provide security services at the state capitol and on the premises of the state capitol; and

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1 (3) "state capitol" means the building in 2 which the legislature is housed and includes all buildings under the exclusive control and custody of the New Mexico 3 legislative council pursuant to Section 2-3-4 NMSA 1978. 4 Whoever commits unlawful carrying of a firearm 5 Ε. in the state capitol is guilty of a petty misdemeanor." 6 7 SECTION 2. Section 29-19-8 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003, Chapter 255, Section 8) is amended to read: 8 9 "29-19-8. LIMITATION ON LICENSE.--10 Nothing in the Concealed Handgun Carry Act shall Α. be construed as allowing a licensee in possession of a valid 11 12 concealed handgun license to carry a concealed handgun into or on premises where to do so would be in violation of state or 13 federal law. 14 Nothing in the Concealed Handgun Carry Act shall 15 Β. be construed as allowing a licensee in possession of a valid 16 concealed handgun license to carry a concealed handgun on 17 18 school premises, as provided in Section 30-7-2.1 NMSA 1978. 19 C. Nothing in the Concealed Handgun Carry Act shall 20 be construed as allowing a licensee in possession of a valid concealed handgun license to carry a concealed handgun on the 21 premises of a preschool. 22 D.
