20	A. The "interagency pharmaceuticals purchasing
21	council" is created and is administratively attached to the
22	general services department. The council shall utilize
23	existing constituent agency resources to review and coordinate
24	cost-containment strategies for the procurement of
25	pharmaceuticals and pharmacy benefits and the pooling of risk

Pursuant to 2 its review of these strategies and related data, the council 3 shall decide by vote which cost-containment strategies it will recommend. Constituent agencies shall make their own 4 procurement decisions. The secretary of general services shall 5 serve as director of the council and shall be responsible for 6 7 the coordination of the day-to-day activities of the council. Β. The interagency pharmaceuticals purchasing 8 9 council shall be composed of the following eleven members serving as voting, ex-officio members: 10 (1) the secretary of human services or the 11 12 secretary's designee; the secretary of health or the secretary's 13 (2) 14 designee; the secretary of children, youth and (3) 15 families or the secretary's designee; 16 (4) the secretary of corrections or the 17 secretary's designee; 18 19 (5) the director of the risk management 20 division of the general services department or the director's designee; 21 (6) the executive director of the retiree 22 health care authority or the executive director's designee; 23 the executive director of the public (7) 24 school insurance authority or the executive director's 25 .209295.1 - 2 -

2 (8) the superintendent of the Albuquerque public school district or the superintendent's designee; 3 the president of the university of New 4 (9) 5 Mexico or the president's designee; and two members, appointed by the governor, 6 (10)7 who are officers of, or representative of organizations that 8 represent, county, municipal or local government entities that 9 participate in consolidated purchasing of pharmaceuticals or pharmacy benefits with other constituent agencies. 10 The interagency pharmaceuticals purchasing C. 11 12 council shall convene its first meeting by September 1, 2018 at the call of the secretary of general services. After the 13 initial meeting of the council, the council shall meet at least 14 once quarterly at the call of the secretary of general 15 services. Meetings of the council shall be subject to the Open 16 Meetings Act. In addition to notice provided pursuant to that 17 act, the secretary of general services shall provide written 18 19 notice of each scheduled meeting of the council to the director 20 of the legislative finance committee at least ten days before each meeting. 21 D. D. The interagency pharmaceuticals purchasing council shall utilize existing constituent agency resources to review and coordinate cost-containment strategies for the procurement of pharmaceuticals and pharmacy benefits and the .209295.1

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1 pooling of risk for pharmacy services by the constituent 2 agencies. The cost-containment strategies that the council shall examine shall include: 3 the benchmarking of pricing for 4 (1)5 pharmaceuticals and pharmacy benefits to the pricing that the state's medical assistance plans achieve for pharmaceuticals 6 7 and pharmacy benefits; provided that the human services department shall seek federal authorization prior to making any 8 9 changes to medical assistance pharmaceuticals purchasing or pharmacy benefits; 10 active medical management to optimize 11 (2) 12 health outcomes and reduce costs; the establishment of a common formulary (3) 13 14 for all pharmaceuticals and pharmacy benefits plans offered by constituent agencies; 15 (4) a single purchase agreement for all 16 constituent agencies' pharmaceuticals and pharmacy benefits; 17 (5) common procurement of expert services, 18 19 including, at minimum, pharmacy benefits management, pharmacy 20 benefits management oversight services, medical direction and actuarial services; 21 (6) identifying any opportunities to 22 consolidate purchasing among two or more constituent agencies; 23 identifying any opportunities for pooling (7) 24 risk among two or more constituent agencies or populations the 25 .209295.1

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constituent agencies serve;

2 identifying any opportunities for (8) 3 consolidating purchasing with other entities and states of the United States; 4

ensuring that all agencies, programs, 5 (9) clinics, hospitals and other health-related centers and 6 7 entities, including those identified by the human services department pursuant to Paragraph (3) of Subsection A of Section 8 27-2-12.13 NMSA 1978, that are eligible for pharmaceutical 9 discounts pursuant to Section 340B of the federal Public Health 10 Service Act participate in that Section 340B federal 11 12 pharmaceutical price discount program;

identifying any opportunities for (10)13 14 maximizing the use of generic pharmaceuticals where safe and cost-effective to do so; 15

(11) negotiating advantageous pricing and incentives with insurers, pharmacy benefits managers, pharmacies, manufacturers, distributors and vendors of pharmaceuticals and other third-party entities involved in supplying pharmaceuticals, pharmacy benefits and management services to the council's constituent entities; and

(12)identifying any other opportunities for maximizing efficiency and a high standard of health care quality.

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1 review and validate the council's progress. It shall 2 incorporate this information into its budget and policy 3 analysis and recommendations. As used in this section, "constituent agency" 4 F. 5 means: (1)the human services department, including 6 7 any medical assistance program it administers; the department of health; 8 (2) the children, youth and families 9 (3) 10 department; the corrections department; (4) 11 12 (5) the risk management division of the general services department; 13 14 the retiree health care authority; (6) the public school insurance authority; (7) 15 (8) the publicly funded health care program of 16 the Albuquerque public school district; 17 the university of New Mexico health (9) 18 19 benefits program for university employees and retirees; 20 (10)the university of New Mexico hospitals; or 21 (11)any local, county or municipal government 22 that opts to participate in consolidated pharmaceuticals or 23 pharmacy benefit purchasing. 24 - 6 -25 .209295.1

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
