A person who violates the provisions of this subsection 4 is guilty of a fourth degree felony and, notwithstanding the 5 provisions of Section 31-18-15 NMSA 1978, shall be sentenced to a basic sentence of imprisonment of nine years. When a 6 7 separate finding of fact made by a court or jury shows beyond a 8 reasonable doubt that a child depicted in the visual or print 9 medium is a child under the age of thirteen, the basic sentence shall be increased by one year, and the sentence imposed by 10 this subsection shall be the first year served and shall not be 11 12 suspended or deferred; provided that when the offender is a youthful offender, the sentence imposed by this subsection may 13 be increased by one year. 14

B. It is unlawful for a person to intentionally distribute any obscene visual or print medium depicting any prohibited sexual act or simulation of such an act if that person knows or has reason to know that the obscene medium depicts any prohibited sexual act or simulation of such act and if that person knows or has reason to know that one or more of the participants in that act is a child under eighteen years of age. A person who violates the provisions of this subsection is guilty of a third degree felony <u>and</u>, <u>notwithstanding the</u> <u>provisions of Section 31-18-15 NMSA 1978</u>, <u>shall be sentenced to</u> <u>a basic sentence of imprisonment of nine years</u>. 1 separate finding of fact made by a court or jury shows beyond a 2 reasonable doubt that a child depicted in the visual or print 3 medium is a child under the age of thirteen, the basic sentence 4 shall be increased by one year, and the sentence imposed by this subsection shall be the first year served and shall not be 5 suspended or deferred; provided that when the offender is a 6 7 youthful offender, the sentence imposed by this subsection may be increased by one year. 8

C. It is unlawful for a person to intentionally cause or permit a child under eighteen years of age to engage in any prohibited sexual act or simulation of such an act if that person knows, has reason to know or intends that the act may be recorded in any obscene visual or print medium or performed publicly. A person who violates the provisions of this subsection is guilty of a third degree felony, unless the child is under the age of thirteen, in which event the person is guilty of a second degree felony.

D. It is unlawful for a person to intentionally manufacture any obscene visual or print medium depicting any prohibited sexual act or simulation of such an act if one or more of the participants in that act is a child under eighteen years of age. A person who violates the provisions of this subsection is guilty of a second degree felony. <u>When a</u> <u>separate finding of fact made by a court or jury shows beyond a</u> <u>reasonable doubt that a child depicted in the visual or print</u>
