AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH; ENACTING THE PRIMARY CARE COUNCIL ACT; CREATING A PRIMARY CARE COUNCIL; ASSIGNING DUTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

- SECTION 1. [NEW MATERIAL] SHORT TITLE.--This act may be cited as the "Primary Care Council Act".
- SECTION 2. [NEW MATERIAL] DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Primary Care Council Act:
- "department" means the human services department;
- "primary care" means integrated, accessible В. health care services, provided by clinicians accountable for addressing the majority of a patient's personal health care needs, developing a sustained partnership with patients and practicing in the context of family and community; and

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1	C. "secretary" means the secretary of human

3	SECTION 3. [NEW MATERIAL] PRIMARY CARE COUNCIL CREATED
4	DUTIES
5	A. The secretary shall create the "primary care
6	council" to:
7	(1) develop a shared description of primary
8	care practitioners and services;
9	(2) analyze annually the proportion of health
10	care delivery expenditures allocated to primary care statewide;
11	(3) review national and state models of
12	optimal primary care investment with the objectives of
13	increasing access to primary care, improving the quality of
14	primary care services and lowering the cost of primary care
15	delivery statewide;
16	(4) review New Mexico state and county data
17	and information about barriers to accessing primary care
18	services faced by New Mexico residents;
19	(5) recommend policies, regulations and
20	legislation to increase access to primary care, improve the
21	quality of primary care services and lower the cost of primary
22	care delivery while reducing overall health care costs;
23	(6) coordinate efforts with the graduate
24	medical education expansion review board and other primary care
25	workforce development initiatives to devise a plan that

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addresses primary care workforce shortages within the state;

- (7) report annually to the interim legislative health and human services committee and the legislative finance committee on ways that primary care investment could increase access to primary care, improve the quality of primary care services, lower the cost of primary care delivery, address the shortage of primary care providers and reduce overall health care costs; and
- (8) develop and present to the secretary a five-year plan to determine how primary care investment could increase access to primary care, improve the quality of primary care services, lower the cost of primary care delivery, address the shortage of primary care providers and reduce overall health care costs.
- B. The primary care council shall include nine voting members and thirteen advisory members, appointed by the secretary, and shall consist of:
 - (1) one member from the department;
 - (2) one member from the department of health;
- (3) one member from the office of superintendent of insurance;
- (4) one member from a statewide organization representing federally qualified health centers in New Mexico;
- (5) five members from statewide organizations representing primary care providers or statewide health

professional societies or associations; and

- (6) thirteen nonvoting members representing health care and other stakeholders, in an advisory capacity.
- C. The chair of the primary care council shall be elected by the voting members of the council.
 - D. The council shall meet at the call of the chair.
- E. Members of the council shall not be paid per diem and mileage or other compensation for their services.
- F. The secretary shall provide staff support for the council in the performance of its duties.
- G. A simple majority of the voting members of the council constitutes a quorum.
- H. The council shall hold its first meeting no later than October 1, 2021.

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
