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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE
18	CREATEDMEMBERSHIPSUBCOMMITTEESSTAFF
19	A. The "public works committee" is created as a
20	permanent legislative interim committee that consists of
21	eighteen members.
22	B. The speaker of the house of representatives
23	shall appoint nine members of the house to serve as members of
24	the public works committee. The speaker shall make
25	appointments so that the two major political parties have the
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C. The committees' committee of the senate shall appoint nine members of the senate to serve as members of the public works committee, unless the senate appointments are made in the interim, in which case the president pro tempore of the senate shall make the appointments in consultation with, and with the agreement of, a majority of the members of the committees' committee. The committees' committee or the president pro tempore, as appropriate, shall make appointments so that the two major political parties have the same proportional representation on the public works committee as exists in the senate, except insofar as is necessary to ensure that at least one member from each party is appointed.

D. The speaker of the house of representatives and the committees' committee, or the president pro tempore of the senate, as appropriate:

(1) shall select the public works committee's chair and vice chair, whose seats in those positions shall rotate each year; and

(2) may remove a member from the committee for nonattendance.

E. The public works committee shall not take any action rejected by a majority of the committee members from .208612.1 - 2 -

2	F. The public works committee may create
3	subcommittees. The committee shall name to any subcommittee it
4	creates at least three members, including one member from the
5	house of representatives, one member from the senate and one
6	member of the minority party from either chamber. The
7	subcommittee may make expenditures only if the committee pre-
8	approves them and if that approval is reflected in the
9	committee's meeting minutes.
10	G. The legislative council service and the
11	legislative finance committee shall provide staff for the
12	public works committee.
13	SECTION 2. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE
14	ADDITIONAL POWERS AND DUTIESCAPITAL PROJECT REVIEW
15	A. As used in this section:
16	(1) "capital project":
17	(a) means: 1) the acquisition, repair,
18	alteration, demolition, renovation, construction,
19	reconstruction, furnishing or equipping by an eligible entity
20	of a public building or public work located wholly in New
21	Mexico; 2) the acquisition by an eligible entity of heavy
22	equipment; or 3) the acquisition, repair, alteration,
23	furnishing or equipping by an eligible entity of information
24	technology; and
25	(b) includes the purchase of the
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1 following, if directly related to the project: 1) planning, 2 design and professional services in the fields of engineering, surveying, architecture or landscape architecture; 2) rights of 3 way or easements; 3) land or other property for the public 4 building or public work; 4) water rights; 5) site improvements 5 to public property; 6) long-term equipment for the public 6 7 building or public work; and 7) fixtures; and "eligible entity" means: 8 (2) 9 (a) a state agency or institution; a political subdivision of the 10 (b) state; or 11 12 (c) a federally recognized tribe or pueblo located wholly or partially in New Mexico. 13 The public works committee shall review 14 Β. proposals for capital outlay funding of capital projects and 15 shall review the status of projects with authorization for 16 capital outlay funding. To carry out its duties, the committee 17 18 may: engage an eligible entity or state agency 19 (1)20 to which money for a capital project is or would be appropriated; 21 (2) hold hearings to receive from the officers 22 and employees of eligible entities testimony on proposals for 23 funding of capital projects; 24 request that an eligible entity submit 25 (3) .208612.1 - 4 -

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1 information on, or data supporting the funding of, a capital 2 project; and evaluate proposals for funding of capital 3 (4) projects submitted to the committee. 4 C. The public works committee shall study and 5 review capital projects: 6 7 (1)that will fill critical health and safety needs; 8 9 (2) that will create jobs in New Mexico; that have funding available from other 10 (3) state and non-state sources, including local, state and federal 11 12 agencies and instrumentalities; (4) that, if necessary, will or may be phased 13 and for which funding to complete at least one full, functional 14 phase is available; 15 for which sponsoring entities can provide (5) 16 for project operation and maintenance upon completion; 17 (6) that are included in infrastructure 18 19 capital improvement plans adopted by state agencies or local 20 governments; for which capital outlay funding is an (7) 21 appropriate source of funding; and 22 (8) that meet other criteria, as determined by 23 the committee. 24 SECTION 3.
