16	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION
17	A. An aggregate total of ninety-four million seven
18	hundred eighty-two thousand nine hundred forty-two dollars
19	(\$94,782,942) is appropriated from the general fund to the
20	Indian affairs department for expenditure in fiscal years 2021
21	through 2025 for the following purposes:
22	(1) sixty-six million six hundred eighty-two
23	thousand nine hundred forty-two dollars (\$66,682,942) to plan,
24	design, renovate, expand, construct, equip and furnish
25	libraries and education centers statewide for Indian nations,

3	technical university in McKinley county;
4	(7) one million five hundred thousand dollars
5	(\$1,500,000) for a curriculum and materials development center

7	(8) one million five hundred thousand dollars
8	(\$1,500,000) for a curriculum and materials development center
9	for the Mescalero Apache Tribe in Otero county;
10	(9) one million five hundred thousand dollars
11	(\$1,500,000) for an education resource center for the Dzil
12	Ditl'looi school of empowerment, action and perseverance
13	charter school on the Navajo Nation in McKinley county;
14	(10) two million five hundred thousand dollars
15	(\$2,500,000) for an education resource center and one million
16	dollars (\$1,000,000) for an early childhood center at the
17	Pueblo of Jemez in Sandoval county; and
18	(11) five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for the

21	B. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance of an
22	appropriation made for a project pursuant to this section shall
23	revert to the tribal infrastructure project fund within six
24	months of completion of the project, but no later than fiscal
25	year 2025.
