WHEREAS, Representative Salazar began his political career as a commissioner for Rio Arriba county; and

WHEREAS, during the early days of his political career, Representative Salazar was a participant in a historic event that is recognized and discussed to this day; and

WHEREAS, in June 1967, during his tenure as a county commissioner, Representative Salazar was held hostage for a few hours by Reies Lopez Tijerina in the infamous Rio Arriba county courthouse raid in Tierra Amarilla; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure in the house of representatives, Representative Salazar gained a breadth of experience by serving on many standing and interim committees; and

WHEREAS, Representative Salazar was the chair of the house rules and order of business committee and is a member of the house agriculture and water resources committee and the house appropriations and finance committee; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure, Representative Salazar also served on the house consumer and public affairs committee; the house energy and natural resources committee; the house health and government affairs committee; the house health, government

WHEREAS, Native American issues have been at the forefront of Representative Salazar's support from the beginning of his legislative tenure; and

WHEREAS, Representative Salazar has been a staunch supporter of education throughout his career, supporting funding to advance all of New Mexico's colleges and universities; and

WHEREAS, Representative Salazar has led a rich and varied political career and has experienced historically significant events in his lifetime; and

WHEREAS, interviewing and recording Representative Salazar discussing his political career and participation in historical events and archiving this information for posterity would be a valuable service in retaining New Mexico's history;
