A MEMORIAL

SUPPORTING THE COMPLETION OF A BORDER BARRIER ALONG THE NEW MEXICO AND MEXICO BORDER AND INCREASING PUBLIC SAFETY WHILE ENCOURAGING LEGAL IMMIGRATION OF THOSE SEEKING REFUGE IN THE UNITED STATES AS ASYLUM SEEKERS.

WHEREAS, the border along the United States and Mexico spans approximately one thousand nine hundred fifty-one miles, with the border along New Mexico and Mexico spanning approximately one hundred seventy-nine miles; and

WHEREAS, the border along New Mexico and Mexico lacks completed barricades on approximately fifty-one and threetenths miles of the border; and

WHEREAS, the federal government has not adequately prioritized the protection of the southern border of New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, in recent years, border crossings have resulted in a humanitarian crisis and unnecessary human suffering; and

WHEREAS, fentanyl is primarily produced by Mexican drug cartels or smuggled by Chinese fentanyl producers through the Mexican border; and

WHEREAS, young minority children are being separated from their parents and trafficked into the United States; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico youth have been targeted by Mexican gangs and have become addicted to lethal doses of fentanyl and other drugs, creating a public health crisis; and

WHEREAS, a drug bust in Albuquerque involving Mexican fentanyl was the largest drug bust in New Mexico history;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the house of representatives be requested to support the completion of the border barrier along the border of New Mexico and Mexico; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the house of representatives be requested to support urgent congressional reform to federal immigration laws to encourage legal immigration of those who are seeking refuge in the United States as asylum seekers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that initiatives to stop the trafficking of illegal drugs across the New Mexico border and to apprehend dangerous criminals be supported; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the president of the United States, the governor .224326.1
