A MEMORIAL

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REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO CONVENE A TASK
FORCE TO ASSESS AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO PROVIDE
INCENTIVES FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER RETENTION FOR TWENTYFIVE YEARS OR FOR LATERAL HIRING OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS
FROM OUT-OF-STATE AGENCIES TO NEW MEXICO LAW ENFORCEMENT
AGENCIES.

WHEREAS, crime rates in New Mexico for violent crime and property crime are significantly above national averages; and WHEREAS, there are not enough law enforcement officers to adequately address crime in New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic, national calls for police reform, statutory changes and local law enforcement agreements with the United States department of justice have impacted law enforcement officers, adding to staff shortages; and

WHEREAS, Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham has called attention to the serious problem of a shortage of law enforcement officers during the 2022 legislative session with a budget request of one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000) and an additional one thousand law enforcement officers across the state; and

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WHEREAS, a task force of interested parties, convened by the department of public safety, could study incentives to create a path for retention and recruitment of law enforcement officers; and

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WHEREAS, programs and initiatives, including the implementation of a deferred retirement option plan, and return-to-work provisions to allow an officer to continue to draw pension benefits while working and contributing to law enforcement pension funds or to delay retirement benefits for a bigger payout later are options to be explored;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF 11 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the 12 department of public safety be requested to convene a task 13 force to assess and make recommendations to provide 14 incentives for law enforcement officer retention for twenty-15 five years or for lateral hiring of law enforcement officers 16 from out-of-state agencies to New Mexico law enforcement 17 agencies; and 18

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be composed of representatives from the Albuquerque police department, a small police department from a rural area, the New Mexico state police, the New Mexico state fraternal order of police lodge, the New Mexico sheriffs' association, the public employees retirement association, the New Mexico association of counties, the New Mexico municipal league, the office of

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the governor, the senate, the house of representatives, the New Mexico state police association and three representatives from statewide community organizations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force present its findings and recommendations to the appropriate legislative interim committee that addresses courts, corrections and justice issues by November 1, 2022; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be 8 transmitted to the co-chairs of the legislative interim 9 committee that addresses courts, corrections and justice 10 issues, the chief of the Albuquerque police department, the 11 chief of a small police department from a rural area, chosen by the task force, the acting chief of the New Mexico state police, the executive directors of the New Mexico sheriffs' association, the public employees retirement association, the New Mexico association of counties and the New Mexico municipal league, the governor, the president pro tempore of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives and the presidents of the New Mexico state police association and the New Mexico state fraternal order of police lodge.____ HM 35/a Page 3

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
