WHEREAS, Jackson enlisted in the United States army and served two tours during the Vietnam War; and

WHEREAS, Jackson's first tour of duty was from July 1966 to July 1967 and his second tour of duty was from January 1968 to December 1969; and

WHEREAS, Jackson was stationed in Pleiku, South Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, Jackson was assigned to the first airborne army brigade first air cavalry division; and

WHEREAS, Jackson was a door gunner on a Huey gunship; and WHEREAS, as a staunch advocate for his fellow veterans, Jackson was instrumental in an ongoing effort to locate a veterans' center in Thoreau; and

WHEREAS, Jackson was a public servant who was independentminded, strong-willed and outspoken, but was always a supporter of Native Americans, McKinley county residents, all New Mexicans and Americans; and

WHEREAS, Jackson was a man of strong character with a sense of humor and an outreaching spirit; and

WHEREAS, Jackson served as director of the Navajo film and media program and director of the department of Navajo veterans affairs and in several executive positions with the Thoreau chapter; and

WHEREAS, in 2008, Jackson was appointed by Governor Bill .209655.2
