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AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE; PROVIDING FOR MINIMUM TRAINING AND CREDENTIALING STANDARDS FOR PROFESSIONAL DIRECT HOME CARE SERVICES PROVIDERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

- SECTION 1. [NEW MATERIAL] PROFESSIONAL DIRECT HOME CARE SERVICES--CERTIFICATION--COURSE OF STUDY--DISCIPLINE.--
- An individual who provides professional direct home care services shall possess a current certification in direct home care issued by the department.
- В. The department shall create a program through which an individual who has passed an examination after fulfilling a department-approved course of study may receive triennial credentialing and recredentialing.
- The department shall establish by rule the .195197.1

1	standards for approval of a course of study in professional
2	direct home care services. Those standards shall include:
3	(l) training in key competencies that the
4	department shall establish by rule; and
5	(2) accreditation by a national professional
6	direct home care services accrediting body.
7	D. A person who violates a provision of this
8	section shall be subject to discipline pursuant to the Uniform
9	Licensing Act.
10	E. For the purposes of this section:
11	(1) "department" means the regulation and
12	licensing department; and
13	(2) "professional direct home care services"
14	means services provided by an individual who performs those
15	services in a residential setting for pay, including:
16	(a) personal care, including dressing,
17	bathing, eating, ambulating, toileting and hygiene;
18	(b) administration of medication; and
19	(c) meal preparation.
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
