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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. Section 61-12C-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1991,
19	Chapter 147, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
20	"61-12C-3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Massage Therapy

22	A. "board" means the massage therapy board;

8	(6) accredited post-secondary educational
9	institutions;
10	$[B_{\bullet}]$ <u>D.</u> "department" means the regulation and
11	licensing department;
12	$[C_{\bullet}]$ <u>E.</u> "jurisprudence" means the statutes and
13	rules of the state pertaining to the practice of massage
14	therapy;
15	[ <del>D.</del> ] <u>F.</u> "massage therapist" means [ <del>a person</del> ] <u>an</u>
16	individual licensed to practice massage therapy pursuant to the
17	Massage Therapy Practice Act;
18	$[E_{\bullet}]$ <u>G.</u> "massage therapy" means the treatment of
19	soft tissues for therapeutic purposes, primarily comfort and
20	relief of pain; it is a health care service that includes
21	gliding, kneading, percussion, compression, vibration,
22	friction, nerve strokes, stretching the tissue and exercising
23	the range of motion and may include the use of oils, salt
24	glows, hot or cold packs or hydrotherapy. Synonymous terms for
25	massage therapy include massage, therapeutic massage, body
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1 massage, myomassage, bodywork, body rub or any derivation of 2 those terms. "Massage therapy" does not include the diagnosis or treatment of illness or disease or any service or procedure 3 for which a license to practice medicine, nursing, 4 chiropractic, physical therapy, occupational therapy, 5 acupuncture or podiatry is required by law; and 6 7 [F.] H. "massage therapy school" means a facility providing an educational program in massage therapy that is 8 9 registered with the board." SECTION 2. Section 61-12C-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1991, 10 Chapter 147, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read: 11 12 "61-12C-5. LICENSE [OR REGISTRATION] REQUIRED.--[A person] An individual shall not provide or Α. 13 14 offer to provide massage therapy for compensation unless that [person] individual is a massage therapist. 15 [A person] An individual shall not use the title B. 16 of or [represent himself to be] make any representation as 17 being a massage therapist or use any other title, 18 abbreviations, letters, figures, signs or devices that indicate 19 the [person] individual is a massage therapist unless [he] the 20 individual is a massage therapist. 21 [C. A person shall not provide or offer to provide 22 massage therapy training as a massage therapy instructor unless 23 he is registered as a massage therapy instructor pursuant to 24 Section 61-12C-9 NMSA 1978. 25

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1	D. A person shall not maintain, manage or operate a
2	massage therapy school offering education, instruction or
3	training in massage therapy unless the school is a registered

5	SECTION 3. Section 61-12C-5.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2001,
6	Chapter 121, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
7	"61-12C-5.1. EXEMPTIONSNothing in the Massage Therapy
8	Practice Act shall be construed to prevent:
9	A. qualified members of other recognized
10	professions that are licensed or regulated under New Mexico law
11	from rendering services within the scope of their licenses or
12	regulations; provided they do not represent themselves as
13	massage therapists;
14	B. students from rendering massage therapy services
15	within the course of study of [an approved] a registered
16	massage therapy school; and [ <del>under the supervision of a</del>
17	licensed massage therapy instructor;
18	C. visiting massage therapy instructors from
19	another state or territory of the United States, the District
20	of Columbia or a foreign nation from teaching massage therapy;
21	provided the instructor is duly licensed or registered, if
22	required, and is qualified in the instructor's place of
23	residence for the practice of massage therapy. The board shall
24	establish by rule the duration of stay for a visiting massage

A. adopt and file, in accordance with the State Rules Act, rules necessary to carry out the provisions of the Massage Therapy Practice Act, in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform Licensing Act;

B. provide for the evaluation of the qualifications of applicants for licensure <u>as a massage therapist</u> or registration <u>as a massage therapy school</u> under the Massage Therapy Practice Act;

C. provide for the issuance of <u>massage therapist</u> licenses [<del>or registrations</del>] to applicants who meet the requirements of the Massage Therapy Practice Act;

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1	D. establish minimum curricula for massage therapy
2	schools and provide for the issuance and revocation of massage
3	therapy school registrations;
4	<u>E.</u> establish instructor qualifications for hands-on
5	massage therapy instruction within the minimum curricula;

16	[6.] I. bring an action for injunctive relief in
17	district court seeking to enjoin a person from violating the
18	provisions of the Massage Therapy Practice Act;
19	$[H_{\bullet}]$ <u>J.</u> issue cease and desist orders to persons
20	violating the provisions of the Massage Therapy Practice Act or
21	any rule adopted by the board pursuant to that act;

Section 61-12C-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1991, 6 7 Chapter 147, Section 9, as amended) is amended to read: 8 "61-12C-9. REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE OF MASSAGE 9 THERAPISTS [AND REGISTRATION OF MASSAGE THERAPY INSTRUCTORS].--10 The board shall issue a license to practice Α. massage therapy to any [person] individual who files a 11 12 completed application, accompanied by the required fees, and 13 who submits satisfactory evidence that the applicant: 14 has reached the age of majority; (1)(2) has completed all educational requirements 15 established by the board; and 16 bracketed material] = delete has completed at least six hundred fifty 17 (3) hours [in length] of education that includes at least five 18 19 hundred hours of massage therapy instruction. 20 [B. SECTION 6. Section 61-12C-13 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1991, Chapter 147, Section 13, as amended) is amended to read: "61-12C-13. EXAMINATIONS.--

10 A. The board shall establish by rule the required
11 examinations for licensure as a massage therapist and the
12 procedures for taking and retaking them. The board shall
13 determine the passing grade on examinations.

B. The board shall specify by rule the general areas of competency to be covered by examinations for licensure and ensure that the examinations measure adequately both an applicant's competency and knowledge of related statutory requirements. Professional testing services may be utilized for the examinations."

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licenses [and massage therapy instructor registrations] shall
 expire biennially. [Massage therapy school registrations shall
 expire annually.] Expiration dates shall be established by
 rule.

B. The board may establish continuing [educational]
education requirements as a condition of the renewal of massage
therapy licenses [and massage therapy instructor
registrations].

9 <u>C. All courses offered by continuing education</u>
10 providers shall be acceptable to meet continuing education
11 requirements regardless of the location where the course is
12 offered.

D. A continuing education provider who is an
individual who was an active New Mexico registered independent
massage therapy instructor on the effective date of this 2019
act shall submit to the board a syllabus and one-time fee for
any course not previously approved by the board.

E. Within thirty days of application, the board may approve or deny the application of an individual who is not a continuing education provider to offer a particular continuing education course; provided that the individual submits:

(1) a copy of any relevant license; (2) proof of a minimum of two years' experience in the area of instruction;

(3) a course syllabus for the proposed course;

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1	(4) a resume; and
2	(5) a one-time fee to be determined by the
3	board by rule.
4	[ <del>C.</del> ] <u>F.</u> A license [ <del>or registration</del> ] shall be
5	renewed by submitting a renewal application on a form provided
6	by the board.
7	[ <del>D.</del> ] <u>G.</u> A sixty-day grace period shall be allowed
8	each [ <del>license or registration holder</del> ] <u>licensee</u> after the end of
9	the renewal period, during which time a license [ <del>or</del>
10	registration] may be renewed upon payment of the renewal fee
11	and a late fee as prescribed by the board."
12	SECTION 8. Section 61-12C-18 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1991,
13	Chapter 147, Section 18, as amended) is amended to read:
14	"61-12C-18. INACTIVE STATUS
15	A. A massage therapy license [ <del>or massage therapy</del>
16	instructor registration] not renewed at the end of the sixty-
17	day grace period shall be placed on inactive status for a
18	period not to exceed two years. At the end of two years, if
19	the license [ <del>or registration</del> ] has not been reactivated, it
20	shall automatically expire.
21	B. If within a period of two years from the date
22	the license [ <del>or registration</del> ] was placed on inactive status the
23	[massage therapist or massage therapy instructor] licensee
24	wishes to resume practice, the [board shall be notified]
25	licensee shall notify the board in writing, and, upon proof of
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completion of any continuing education or refresher courses prescribed by rule of the board and payment of an amount set by the board in lieu of all lapsed renewal fees, the license [or registration] shall be restored in full."

SECTION 9. Section 61-12C-21 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1991, Chapter 147, Section 21, as amended) is amended to read:

"61-12C-21. ADVERTISING.--A massage therapist [massage therapist instructor] or massage therapy school [licensed or registered pursuant to the Massage Therapy Practice Act] shall include the number of the license or registration and the designation as a "licensed massage therapist" ["registered massage therapy instructor"] or "registered massage therapy school" in any advertisement of massage therapy services as established by board rule."

SECTION 10. Section 61-12C-24 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1991, Chapter 147, Section 24, as amended) is amended to read:

"61-12C-24. [DENIAL] SUSPENSION, REVOCATION AND REINSTATEMENT OF LICENSES.--

A. Pursuant to the Uniform Licensing Act, the board may take disciplinary action against [<del>a person</del>] <u>an individual</u> licensed [<del>or registered</del>] pursuant to the Massage Therapy Practice Act.

B. The board has authority to take an action set forth in Section 61-1-3 NMSA 1978 upon a finding by the board that the licensee [registrant or applicant]:

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1	(1) is guilty of fraud, deceit or
2	misrepresentation;
3	(2) attempted to use as [ <del>his</del> ] <u>the licensee's</u>
4	own the license [ <del>or registration</del> ] of another;
5	(3) allowed the use of [ <del>his</del> ] <u>the licensee's</u>
6	license [ <del>or registration</del> ] by another;
7	(4) has been adjudicated as mentally
8	incompetent by regularly constituted authorities;
9	(5) has been convicted of [ <del>any offense</del>
10	punishable by incarceration in a state penitentiary or federal
11	prison] a crime that substantially relates to the
12	qualifications, functions or duties of a massage therapist. A
13	copy of the record of conviction, certified by the clerk of the
14	court entering the conviction, is conclusive evidence of
15	conviction;
16	(6) is guilty of unprofessional or unethical
17	conduct or a violation of the code of ethics;
18	(7) is habitually or excessively using
19	controlled substances or alcohol;
20	(8) is guilty of false, deceptive or
21	misleading advertising;
22	(9) is guilty of aiding, assisting or
23	advertising [ <del>any</del> ] <u>an</u> unlicensed [ <del>or unregistered</del>
24	person] <u>individual</u> in the practice of massage therapy;
25	(10) is grossly negligent or incompetent in
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1 the practice of massage therapy;

(11) has had a license [or registration] to practice massage therapy revoked, suspended or denied in any jurisdiction, territory or possession of the United States or another country for acts of the licensee [or registrant] similar to acts described in this section. A certified copy of the record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence of the conviction; or

9 (12) is guilty of failing to comply with a
10 provision of the Massage Therapy Practice Act or rules of the
11 board adopted pursuant to that act and filed in accordance with
12 the State Rules Act.

C. Disciplinary proceedings may be instituted by sworn complaint of any [person] <u>individual</u>, including members of the board, and shall conform with the provisions of the Uniform Licensing Act.

D. The board [may] <u>shall</u> establish the guidelines for the disposition of disciplinary cases. Guidelines may include [<del>but shall not be limited to</del>] minimum and maximum fines, periods of probation, conditions of probation or reissuance of a license [<del>or registration</del>].

E. [License and registration holders] Licensees who have been found culpable and sanctioned by the board shall be responsible for the payments of all costs of the disciplinary proceedings."

SECTION 14. A new section of the Massage Therapy Practice Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] SCOPE OF PRACTICE.--The practice of massage therapy consists of the assessment of the soft tissue structures of the body; the treatment and prevention of physical dysfunction and pain of soft tissue; and joint movement within normal physiologic range of motion to relieve pain or to develop, maintain, rehabilitate or augment physical function."
