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RELATING TO CAPITAL OUTLAY; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TO LOCAL STREETS AND ROADS, OTHER HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION MATTERS AND FOR TRANSPORTATION-RELATED EQUIPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS. -- Unless otherwise provided in specific sections or subsections of this act, the appropriations in this act are from the general fund to the department of transportation for expenditure in fiscal years 2020 through 2022. Unless otherwise provided, any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining of any appropriation in this act shall revert to the general fund after completion of the project or at the end of fiscal year 2022, whichever occurs first.
