1 AN ACT 2 RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS; AMENDING CERTAIN DEFINITIONS IN THE LEGISLATIVE LOTTERY TUITION SCHOLARSHIP 3 4 ACT; CHANGING CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS FOR ELIGIBILITY FOR THE 5 LEGISLATIVE LOTTERY TUITION SCHOLARSHIP; LOWERING THE NUMBER 6 OF REQUIRED CREDIT HOURS FOR FALL AND SPRING SEMESTERS FOR 7 LOTTERY SCHOLARSHIPS; PROVIDING AN EXCEPTION TO THE MINIMUM 8 CREDIT-HOUR ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT IN THE OPPORTUNITY 9 SCHOLARSHIP ACT; EXEMPTING DUAL CREDIT CLASSES FROM COUNTING 10 TOWARD THE OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP CREDIT-HOUR CAP; PROVIDING 11 FOR A SHORT-TERM CHANGE IN THE CALCULATION OF THE OPPORTUNITY 12 SCHOLARSHIP DISTRIBUTION. 13

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: SECTION 1. Section 21-21N-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2014, Chapter 80, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:

"21-21N-2. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Legislative Lottery Tuition Scholarship Act:

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A. "community college" means a branch community
college of a four-year state educational institution, a
two-year state educational institution or a community college
or technical and vocational institute established pursuant to
Chapter 21, Article 13 or 16 NMSA 1978, respectively;

24B. "comprehensive institution" means eastern25New Mexico university, western New Mexico university,SB 239DescriptionDescription

New Mexico highlands university or northern New Mexico 2 college;

C. "department" means the higher education department;

D. "full time" means thirty or more credit hours each year in state educational institutions and twenty-four or more credit hours each year in community colleges;

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Ε. "fund" means the lottery tuition fund;

"program semesters" means those semesters for 9 F. 10 which a qualified student may receive a tuition scholarship, which includes the summer semester and excludes the first 11 semester of attendance at a public post-secondary educational 12 institution; 13

G. "public post-secondary educational institution" 14 15 means a four-year state educational institution or a community college; 16

"qualified student" means a full-time student 17 Η. who graduated from a public or accredited private New Mexico 18 high school or completed the requirements of a home-based or 19 20 nonpublic secondary educational program in New Mexico or received a high school equivalency credential while 21 maintaining residency in New Mexico and who: 22

> (1) either:

(a) within sixteen months of graduation from or completion of a secondary educational program SB 239

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SECTION 2. Section 21-21N-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2014, Chapter 80, Section 3, as amended by Laws 2019, Chapter 33, Section 1 and by Laws 2019, Chapter 54, Section 2) is amended to read:

"21-21N-3. TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS AUTHORIZED--QUALIFIED STUDENTS.--

10 Α. To the extent that funds are made available by the legislature from the fund, the boards of regents or 11 governing bodies of public post-secondary educational 12 institutions and tribal colleges shall award tuition 13 scholarships in department-approved amounts to qualified 14 15 students attending their respective public post-secondary educational institutions. 16

B. A qualified student is eligible to receive the tuition scholarship for a maximum of seven fall and spring 18 program semesters and a maximum of three summer semesters, or 19 20 no more than three and one-half years for a bachelor's degree, in an amount determined pursuant to the provisions of Section 21-21N-4 NMSA 1978. 22

C. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a 23 tuition scholarship may be awarded to a qualified student 24 who: 25

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1 (1) maintains residency in New Mexico; 2 maintains a grade point average of 2.5 (2) 3 or higher on a 4.0 scale; and 4 (3) completes: 5 for a student attending a four-year (a) 6 public post-secondary educational institution or a tribal college, thirty credit hours, which may be apportioned among 7 fall through summer semesters, with no fewer than twelve 8 credit hours in the fall and spring semesters and between 9 10 three and nine credit hours for summer semesters; provided that the department may provide by rule for exceptions to the 11 number of summer semester credit hours; and provided further 12 that a student is not required to attend summer semesters to 13 maintain eligibility; and provided further that credit-hour 14 15 limits do not apply to the last semester before graduation; 16 and for a student attending a two-year 17 (b) public post-secondary educational institution, twenty-four 18 credit hours, which may be apportioned among fall through 19 20 summer semesters, with no fewer than nine credit hours in the fall and spring semesters and between three and nine credit 21 hours for summer semesters; provided that the department may 22 provide by rule for exceptions to the number of summer 23 semester credit hours; and provided further that a student is 24

not required to attend summer semesters to maintain

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SB 239 Page 5 eligibility; and provided further that credit-hour limits do not apply to the last semester before graduation.

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3 D. For students with disabilities who may require accommodations, the department, in consultation with the 4 5 student and the office at the public post-secondary educational institution or the tribal college that serves 6 students with disabilities, shall review both the definition 7 of "full time" and the maximum number of consecutive program 8 semesters of eligibility and adjust either or both as deemed 9 10 reasonable and appropriate, based on the student's disability In no case, however, shall "full time" mean fewer 11 needs. than six credit hours per semester during the fall and spring 12 semesters or three credit hours per summer semester, if 13 attending, and in no case shall eligibility extend beyond 14 15 fourteen consecutive program semesters. The definition of "qualified student" notwithstanding, a New Mexico resident 16 who had to leave the state to receive an education pursuant 17 to the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act 18 shall be eligible for a tuition scholarship if the student 19 20 graduated from an accredited high school in another state and otherwise meets the qualifications for a tuition scholarship 21 pursuant to the definition of "qualified student" and this 22 section." 23

24SECTION 3. Section 21-21R-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2022,25Chapter 42, Section 2) is amended to read:SB 239

1 "21-21R-2. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Opportunity

3 Chapter 42, Section 3) is amended to read:

"21-21R-3. CONDITIONS FOR ELIGIBILITY.--

A. A scholarship may be awarded to an eligiblestudent who:

7 (1) has not earned a baccalaureate degree at8 the time the scholarship is awarded;

9 (2) is enrolled in at least six credit hours 10 per semester and no more than eighteen credit hours per fall 11 or spring semester; except that the credit-hour limits do not 12 apply to a student in the last semester before graduation;

13 (3) is enrolled in at least three and no
14 more than nine credit hours per summer semester; provided
15 that a student is not required to attend a summer semester to
16 maintain eligibility;

17 (4) maintains a cumulative grade point18 average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale; and

19 (5) has complied with other rules
20 promulgated by the department to carry out the provisions of
21 the Opportunity Scholarship Act.

B. A scholarship may be awarded for the summer
semester; provided that the student enrolls in at least three
and no more than nine credit hours; and provided further that
the summer semester is not required to maintain eligibility; SB 239

and provided further that credit-hour limits do not apply to a student in the last semester before graduation.

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C. A scholarship may be awarded for one credit-bearing certificate or certificates, only one associate degree and only one bachelor's degree per student.

D. A scholarship for a credit-bearing certificate may only be awarded where data indicates that the certificate is in high demand by New Mexico employers as determined by the department in consultation with the workforce solutions department.

E. Students with disabilities or exceptional mitigating circumstances may petition for a waiver of eligibility, credit-hour limits or other requirements on a per semester basis. The lead financial aid officer of the public post-secondary institution or tribal college shall exercise professional judgment in consideration of any request for a waiver."

18 SECTION 5. Section 21-21R-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2022,
19 Chapter 42, Section 4) is amended to read:

"21-21R-4. SCHOLARSHIP AUTHORIZED--ADMINISTRATION.--

A. The department shall administer the Opportunity
Scholarship Act and shall promulgate rules to carry out the
provisions of that act.

B. Scholarships shall be awarded to qualified eligible students in an amount not to exceed one hundred SB 239

percent of tuition and fees after all other state financial aid has been applied. Qualifications shall be determined by rule of the department.

C. Prior to June 1 of each year, based on the
amount appropriated by the legislature from the opportunity
scholarship fund and on the projected enrollment at all
public post-secondary educational institutions and tribal
colleges, the department shall:

9 (1) determine the total amount of money10 available for all scholarships for eligible students;

11 (2) determine the award amount for public 12 post-secondary educational institutions and tribal colleges; 13 and

14 (3) notify all public post-secondary
15 educational institutions and tribal colleges of the
16 determinations made pursuant to Paragraphs (1) and (2) of
17 this subsection.

D. In determining distribution and award amountsfor the scholarships, the department shall:

20 (1) distribute to all public post-secondary 21 educational institutions and tribal colleges an amount not to 22 exceed the remaining balance in the opportunity scholarship 23 fund; and

 Paragraph (1) of this subsection, distribute to each public SB 239 Page 10

1 post-secondary educational institution and tribal college an 2 amount based on the projected enrollment at each public 3 post-secondary educational institution and tribal college. 4 Ε. Prior to June 1 of each year through fiscal 5 year 2028, the department shall determine the maximum distribution to each public post-secondary educational 6 institution and tribal college based on the annual increase 7 in the higher education price index for the mountain region." 8 SECTION 6. Section 21-21R-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2022, 9 10 Chapter 42, Section 5) is amended to read: "21-21R-5. DURATION OF SCHOLARSHIP AUTHORIZED.--11 A. Each scholarship is for a period of one 12 semester, including the summer semester. A scholarship may 13 be renewed if the eligible student continues to meet the 14 15 conditions of eligibility. Scholarships may be provided to an eligible 16 Β. student until the eligible student receives a credit-bearing 17 certificate or certificates. 18 C. Scholarships may be provided to an eligible 19 20 student for up to ninety credit hours for the completion of one associate degree; provided that dual credit courses that 21 an eligible student previously completed shall not count 22 toward the credit-hour cap. 23 Scholarships may be provided to an eligible D. 24 student for up to one hundred sixty credit hours for the 25
