16	SECTION 1. Section 50-11-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1991,
17	Chapter 244, Section 1) is amended to read:

25	service for wages or other remuneration under a contract of
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hire, written or oral, express or implied, and includes a
 person employed by the state or a political subdivision of the
 state;

B. "employer" means a person that has one or more employees and includes an agent of an employer and the state or a political subdivision of the state; [and]

14	(3) who provides wellness, care coordination
15	or disease prevention and management services directly to an
16	insured under a health insurance plan or to an enrollee of a
17	managed care health plan;
18	E. "health facility" means a public hospital,
19	profit or nonprofit private hospital, general or special
20	hospital, outpatient facility, maternity home or shelter, adult
21	daycare facility, nursing home, intermediate care facility,
22	boarding home not under the control of an institution of higher
23	learning, child care center, shelter care home, diagnostic and
24	treatment center, rehabilitation center, infirmary, community
25	mental health center, residential treatment center, day
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1 treatment center, health service organization operating as a 2 freestanding hospice or home health agency and a clinical laboratory that is accredited pursuant to 42 U.S.C. Section 3 263a but that is not a laboratory in a physician's office or in 4 a hospital defined pursuant to 42 U.S.C. Section 1395x; 5 F. "nonprofit corporation" means a corporation no 6 7 part of the income or profit of which is distributable to its members, directors or officers; and 8 9 [C.] <u>G.</u> "person" means an individual, sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation, association or any 10 other legal entity." 11 12 SECTION 3. A new section of the Employee Privacy Act is 13 enacted to read: "[NEW MATERIAL] EXEMPTIONS.--14 The provisions of the Employee Privacy Act do 15 Α. 16 not apply to: an employer of a health care practitioner 17 (1)18 or of a health care worker; or 19 (2)an employer that is a nonprofit 20 corporation whose stated mission includes at least one of the following: 21 tobacco use prevention; (a) 22 (b) smoking cessation; 23 (c) support for smoke-free environments; 24 25 (d) education regarding the health .198560.2 - 5 -

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1	consequences of tobacco use or the addictive properties of
2	nicotine; and
3	(e) the prevention, treatment or cure of
4	disease or illness associated with the use of tobacco or
5	exposure to tobacco products.
6	B. An employer exempted from the Employee Privacy
7	Act pursuant to Subsection A of this section shall be subject
8	to that act with respect to an employee hired on or before June
9	30, 2015."
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
