18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:					
19	SECTION 1. Section 51-1-8 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1936					
20	(S.S.), Chapter 1, Section 6, as amended) is amended to read:					
21	"51-1-8. CLAIMS FOR BENEFITS					
22	A. Claims for benefits shall be made in accordance					
23	with such regulations as the secretary may prescribe. Each					
24	employer shall post and maintain printed notices, in places					
25	readily accessible to employees, concerning their rights to					
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file claims for unemployment benefits upon termination of their employment. Such notices shall be supplied by the division to each employer without cost to the employer.

A representative designated by the secretary as Β. a claims examiner shall promptly examine the application and each weekly claim and, on the basis of the facts found, shall determine whether the claimant is unemployed, the week with respect to which benefits shall commence, the weekly benefit amount payable, the maximum duration of benefits, whether the claimant is eligible for benefits pursuant to Section 51-1-5 NMSA 1978 and whether the claimant shall be disqualified pursuant to Section 51-1-7 NMSA 1978. With the approval of the secretary, the claims examiner may refer, without determination, claims or any specified issues involved therein that raise complex questions of fact or law to a hearing officer for the division for a fair hearing and decision in accordance with the procedure described in Subsection D of this section. The claims examiner shall promptly notify the claimant and any other interested party of the determination and the reasons therefor. Unless the claimant or interested party, within fifteen calendar days after the date of notification or mailing of the determination, files an appeal from the determination, the determination shall be the final decision of the division; provided that the claims examiner may reconsider a nonmonetary determination if additional

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1 information not previously available is provided or obtained or 2 whenever the claims examiner finds an error in the application of law has occurred, but no redetermination shall be made more 3 than twenty days from the date of the initial nonmonetary 4 5 determination. Notice of a nonmonetary redetermination shall be given to all interested parties and shall be subject to 6 7 appeal in the same manner as the original nonmonetary 8 determination. If an appeal is pending at the time a 9 redetermination is issued, the appeal, unless withdrawn, shall be treated as an appeal from the redetermination. 10

C. In the case of a claim for waiting period credit or benefits, "interested party", for purposes of determinations and adjudication proceedings and notices thereof, means:

(1) in the event of an issue concerning a separation from work for reasons other than lack of work, the claimant's most recent employer or most recent employing unit;

(2) in the event of an issue concerning a separation from work for lack of work, the employer or employing unit from whom the claimant separated for reasons other than lack of work if the claimant has not worked and earned wages in insured work or bona fide employment other than self-employment in an amount equal to or exceeding five times the claimant's weekly benefit amount; or

(3) in all other cases involving the allowance or disallowance of a claim, the secretary, the claimant and any
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employing unit directly involved in the facts at issue.

D. Upon appeal by any party, a hearing officer 3 designated by the secretary shall afford the parties reasonable opportunity for a fair hearing to be held de novo, and the hearing officer shall issue findings of fact and a decision [which] that affirms, modifies or reverses the determination of the claims examiner or tax representative on the facts or the law, based upon the evidence introduced at such hearing, including the documents and statements in the claim or tax records of the division. All hearings shall be held in accordance with regulations of the secretary and decisions issued promptly in accordance with time lapse standards promulgated by the secretary of the United States department of labor. The parties shall be duly notified of the decision, together with the reasons therefor, which shall be deemed to be the final decision of the department, unless within fifteen days after the date of notification or mailing of the decision further appeal is initiated pursuant to Subsection H of this section.

Ε. Except with the consent of the parties, no hearing officer or members of the board of review, established in Subsection F of this section, or secretary shall sit in any administrative or adjudicatory proceeding in which:

either of the parties is related to the (1)hearing officer, member of the board of review or secretary by .191218.4SA - 4 -

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affinity or consanguinity within the degree of first cousin;

(2) the hearing officer, member of the board of review or secretary was counsel for either party in that action; or

(3) the hearing officer, member of the board of review or secretary has an interest [which] that would prejudice the rendering of an impartial decision.

The secretary, any member of the board of review or appeal tribunal hearing officer shall withdraw from any proceeding in which the hearing officer, member of the board of review or secretary cannot accord a fair and impartial hearing or when a reasonable person would seriously doubt whether the hearing officer, board member or secretary could be fair and impartial. Any party may request a disqualification of any appeal tribunal hearing officer or board of review member by filing an affidavit with the board of review or appeal tribunal promptly upon discovery of the alleged grounds for disqualification, stating with particularity the grounds upon which it is claimed that the person cannot be fair and impartial. The disqualification shall be mandatory if sufficient factual basis is set forth in the affidavit of disgualification. If a member of the board of review is disqualified or withdraws from any proceeding, the remaining members of the board of review may appoint an appeal tribunal hearing officer to sit on the board of review for the proceeding involved.

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1 F. There is established within the department, for 2 the purpose of providing higher level administrative appeal and review of determinations of a claims examiner or decisions 3 issued by a hearing officer pursuant to Subsection B or D of 4 this section, a "board of review" consisting of three members. 5 Two members shall be appointed by the governor with the consent 6 7 of the senate. The members so appointed shall hold office at the pleasure of the governor for terms of four years. One 8 9 member appointed by the governor shall be a person who, on account of previous vocation, employment or affiliation, can be 10 classed as a representative of employers, and the other member 11 12 appointed by the governor shall be a person who, on account of previous vocation, employment or affiliation, can be classed as 13 a representative of employees. The third member shall be an 14 employee of the department appointed by the secretary who shall 15 serve as [chairman] chair of the board. Either member of the 16 board of review appointed by the governor who has missed two 17 consecutive meetings of the board may be removed from the board 18 by the governor. Actions of the board shall be taken by 19 20 majority vote. If a vacancy on the board in a position appointed by the governor occurs between sessions of the 21 legislature, the position shall be filled by the governor until 22 the next regular legislative session. The board shall meet at 23 the call of the secretary. Members of the board appointed by 24 the governor shall be paid per diem and mileage in accordance 25

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with the Per Diem and Mileage Act for necessary travel to attend regularly scheduled meetings of the board of review for the purpose of conducting the board's appellate and review duties.

G. The board of review shall hear and review all cases appealed in accordance with Subsection H of this section. The board of review may modify, affirm or reverse the decision of the hearing officer or remand any matter to the claims examiner, tax representative or hearing officer for further proceedings. Each member appointed by the governor shall be compensated at the rate of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each case reviewed up to a maximum compensation of twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000) in any one fiscal year.

H. Any party aggrieved by a final decision of a hearing officer may file, in accordance with regulations prescribed by the secretary, an application for appeal and review of the decision with the secretary. The secretary shall review the application and shall, within fifteen days after receipt of the application, either affirm the decision of the hearing officer, reverse the decision of the hearing officer, modify the decision of the hearing officer, remand the matter to the hearing officer, tax representative or claims examiner for an additional hearing or refer the decision to the board of review for further review and decision on the merits of the appeal. If the secretary affirms, reverses or modifies the

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1 decision of the hearing officer, that decision shall be the 2 final administrative decision of the department and any appeal therefrom shall be taken to the district court in accordance 3 with the provisions of Subsections M and N of this section. If 4 5 the secretary remands a matter to a hearing officer, tax representative or claims examiner for an additional hearing, 6 7 judicial review shall be permitted only after issuance of a final administrative decision. If the secretary refers the 8 decision of the hearing officer to the board of review for 9 further review, the board's decision on the merits of the 10 appeal shall be the final administrative decision of the 11 12 department, which may be appealed to the district court in accordance with the provisions of Subsections M and N of this 13 14 section. If the secretary takes no action within fifteen days of receipt of the application for appeal and review, the 15 decision shall be promptly scheduled for review by the board of 16 review as though it had been referred by the secretary. 17 The secretary may request the board of review to review a decision 18 19 of a hearing officer that the secretary believes to be 20 inconsistent with the law or with applicable rules of interpretation or that is not supported by the evidence, and 21 the board of review shall grant the request if it is filed 22 within fifteen days of the issuance of the decision of the 23 hearing officer. The secretary may also direct that any 24 pending determination or adjudicatory proceeding be removed to 25 .191218.4SA

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the board of review for a final decision. If the board of review holds a hearing on any matter, the hearing shall be conducted by a quorum of the board of review in accordance with regulations prescribed by the secretary for hearing appeals. The board of review shall promptly notify the interested parties of its findings of fact and decision. A decision of the board of review on any disputed matter reviewed and decided by it shall be based upon the law and the lawful rules of interpretation issued by the secretary, and it shall be the final administrative decision of the department, except in cases of remand. If the board of review remands a matter to a hearing officer, claims examiner or tax representative, judicial review shall be permitted only after issuance of a final administrative decision.

I. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section granting any party the right to appeal, benefits shall be paid promptly in accordance with a determination or a decision of a claims examiner, hearing officer, secretary, board of review or reviewing court, regardless of the pendency of the period to file an appeal or petition for judicial review that is provided with respect thereto in Subsection D or M of this section or the pendency of any such filing or petition until such determination or decision has been modified or reversed by a subsequent decision. The provisions of this subsection shall apply to all claims for benefits pending on

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1 the date of its enactment.

2 J. If a prior determination or decision allowing 3 benefits is affirmed by a decision of the department, including the board of review or a reviewing court, the benefits shall be 4 paid promptly regardless of any further appeal [which] that may 5 thereafter be available to the parties, and no injunction, 6 7 supersedeas, stay or other writ or process suspending the payment of benefits shall be issued by the secretary or board 8 9 of review or any court, and no action to recover benefits paid to a claimant shall be taken. If a determination or decision 10 allowing benefits is finally modified or reversed, the 11 12 appropriate contributing [employer's account] employer will be relieved of benefit charges in accordance with Subsection [B] A 13 of Section 51-1-11 NMSA 1978. 14

K. The manner in which disputed claims shall be presented, the reports thereon required from the claimant and from employers and the conduct of hearings and appeals shall be in accordance with rules prescribed by the secretary for determining the rights of the parties, whether or not the rules conform to common law or statutory rules of evidence and other technical rules of procedure. A hearing officer or the board of review may refer to the secretary for interpretation any question of controlling legal significance, and the secretary shall issue a declaratory interpretation, which shall be binding upon the decision of the hearing officer and the board .191218.4SA

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of review. A full and complete record shall be kept of all proceedings in connection with a disputed claim. All testimony at any hearing upon a disputed claim shall be recorded but need not be transcribed unless the disputed claim is appealed to the district court.

L. Witnesses subpoenaed pursuant to this section shall be allowed fees at a rate fixed by the secretary. Such fees and all administrative expenses of proceedings involving disputed claims shall be deemed a part of the expense of administering the Unemployment Compensation Law.

Any determination or decision of a claims Μ. examiner or hearing officer or by a representative of the tax section of the department in the absence of an appeal therefrom as provided by this section shall become final fifteen days after the date of notification or mailing thereof, and judicial review thereof shall be permitted only after any party claiming to be aggrieved thereby has exhausted the remedies as provided in Subsection H of this section. The division and any employer or claimant who is affected by the decision shall be joined as a party in any judicial action involving the decision. A11 parties shall be served with an endorsed copy of the petition within thirty days from the date of filing and an endorsed copy of the order granting the petition within fifteen days from entry of the order. Service on the department shall be made on the secretary or [his] the secretary's designated legal

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representative either by mail with accompanying certification of service or by personal service. The division may be represented in a judicial action by an attorney employed by the department or, when requested by the secretary, by the attorney general or any district attorney.

Ν. The final decision of the secretary or board of review upon any disputed matter may be reviewed both upon the law, including the lawful rules of interpretation issued by the secretary, and the facts by the district court of the county wherein the person seeking the review resides upon certiorari, unless it is determined by the district court where the petition is filed that, as a matter of equity and due process, venue should be in a different county. For the purpose of the review, the division shall return on certiorari the reports and all of the evidence heard by it on the reports and all the papers and documents in its files affecting the matters and things involved in such certiorari. The district court shall render its judgment after hearing, and either the department or any other party affected may appeal from the judgment to the court of appeals in accordance with the rules of appellate procedure. Certiorari shall not be granted unless applied for within thirty days from the date of the final decision of the secretary or board of review. Certiorari shall be heard in a summary manner and shall be given precedence over all other civil cases except cases arising under the Workers'

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Compensation Act. It is not necessary in any proceedings before the division to enter exceptions to the rulings, and no bond shall be required in obtaining certiorari from the district court, but certiorari shall be granted as a matter of right to the party applying therefor."

SECTION 2. Section 51-1-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003, Chapter 47, Section 11, as amended) is amended to read:

"51-1-11. FUTURE RATES BASED ON BENEFIT EXPERIENCE.--

A. The division shall maintain a separate account for each contributing employer and shall credit the contributing employer's account with all contributions paid by that employer under the Unemployment Compensation Law. Nothing in the Unemployment Compensation Law shall be construed to grant an employer or individuals in the employer's service prior claims or rights to the amounts paid by the employer into the fund.

B. Benefits paid to an individual shall be charged against the accounts of the individual's base-period employers on a pro rata basis according to the proportion of the individual's total base-period wages received from each employer, except that no benefits paid to a claimant as extended benefits under the provisions of Section 51-1-48 NMSA 1978 shall be charged to the account of any base-period employer who is not on a reimbursable basis and who is not a governmental entity and, except as the secretary shall by rule

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prescribe otherwise, in the case of benefits paid to an individual who:

(1) left the employ of a base-period employer who is not on a reimbursable basis voluntarily without good cause in connection with the individual's employment;

(2) was discharged from the employment of a base-period employer who is not on a reimbursable basis for misconduct connected with the individual's employment;

(3) is employed part time by a base-period employer who is not on a reimbursable basis and who continues to furnish the individual the same part-time work while the individual is separated from full-time work for a nondisqualifying reason; or

(4) received benefits based upon wages earned from a base-period employer who is not on a reimbursable basis while attending approved training under the provisions of Subsection E of Section 51-1-5 NMSA 1978.

C. The division shall not charge a contributing or reimbursing base-period employer's account with any portion of benefit amounts that the division can bill to or recover from the federal government as either regular or extended benefits.

D. The division shall not charge a contributing base-period employer's account with any portion of benefits paid to an individual for dependent allowance or because the .191218.4SA

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1 individual to whom benefits are paid:

2 (1) separated from employment due to
3 domestic abuse, as "domestic abuse" is defined in Section
4 40-13-2 NMSA 1978; or

5 (2) voluntarily left work to relocate
6 because of a spouse, who is in the military service of the
7 United States or the New Mexico national guard, receiving
8 permanent change of station orders, activation orders or unit
9 deployment orders.

E. All contributions to the fund shall be pooled and available to pay benefits to any individual entitled thereto, irrespective of the source of the contributions.

F. For each calendar year, if, as of the computation date for that year, an employer's account has been chargeable with benefits throughout the preceding thirty-six months, the secretary shall classify the employer in accordance with its actual experience of benefits charged against its accounts. For such an employer, the contribution rate shall be determined pursuant to Subsection I of this section on the basis of the employer's record and the condition of the fund as of the computation date for the calendar year. If, as of the computation date for a calendar year, an employer's account has not been chargeable with benefits throughout the preceding thirty-six months, the contribution rate for that employer for the calendar year

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1 shall be two percent, except that:

2 an individual, type of organization or (1)3 employing unit that acquires all or part of the trade or business of another employing unit, pursuant to Paragraphs 4 (2) and (3) of Subsection E of Section 51-1-42 NMSA 1978, 5 that has a rate of contribution less than two percent shall 6 7 be entitled to the transfer of the reduced rate to the extent 8 permitted under Subsection H of this section; 9 (2) an employer that, at the time of establishing an account, is in business in another state or 10 states and that is not currently doing business in New Mexico 11 12 may elect, pursuant to Paragraph (3) of this subsection, to receive a beginning contribution rate of two percent or a 13 contribution rate based on the current contribution rate 14 schedule in Paragraph (4) of Subsection I of this section, 15 whichever is lower, if: 16 (a) the employer has been in operation 17 in the other state or states for at least three years 18 immediately preceding the date of becoming a liable employer 19 20 in New Mexico, throughout which an individual in the employer's employ could have received benefits if eligible; 21 and 22 (b) the employer provides the 23 authenticated account history as defined by rule of the 24 secretary from information accumulated from operations in the

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other state or all the other states to compute a current
 New Mexico rate; and

3 the election authorized in Paragraph (2) (3) of this subsection shall be made in writing within thirty 4 days after receiving notice of New Mexico liability and, if 5 not made timely, a two percent rate will be assigned; if the 6 7 election is made timely, the employer's account will receive the lesser of the computed rate determined by the condition 8 9 of the account for the computation date immediately preceding the New Mexico liable date, or two percent; rates for 10 subsequent years will be determined by the condition of the 11 12 account for the computation date.

G. An employer may make voluntary payments in addition to the contributions required under the Unemployment Compensation Law, which shall be credited to the employer's account in accordance with department rule. The voluntary payments shall be included in the employer's account as of the employer's most recent computation date if they are made on or before the following March 1. Voluntary payments when accepted from an employer shall not be refunded in whole or in part.

H. In the case of a transfer of an employing enterprise, notwithstanding any other provision of law, the experience history of the transferred enterprise shall be transferred from the predecessor employer to the successor .191218.4SA - 17 -

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1 under the following conditions and in accordance with the 2 applicable rules of the secretary: as used in this subsection: 3 (1) "employing enterprise" means a 4 (a) business activity engaged in by a contributing employing unit 5 in which one or more persons have been employed within the 6 7 current or the three preceding calendar quarters. An "employing enterprise" includes the employer's work force; 8 9 (b) "predecessor" means the owner and operator of an employing enterprise immediately prior to the 10 transfer of such enterprise; 11 12 (c) "successor" means any person that acquires an employing enterprise and continues to operate 13 14 such business entity; "experience history" means the (d) 15 experience rating record and reserve account, including the 16 actual contributions, benefit charges and payroll experience 17 of the employing enterprise; 18 (e) "common ownership" means that two 19 20 or more businesses are substantially owned, managed or controlled by the same person or persons; 21 (f) "knowingly" means having actual 22 knowledge of or acting with deliberate ignorance of or 23 reckless disregard for the prohibition involved; and 24 "violates or attempts to violate" 25 (g) .191218.4SA - 18 -

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1 includes an intent to evade, a misrepresentation or a willful
2 nondisclosure;

except as otherwise provided in this 3 (2) subsection, for the purpose of this subsection, two or more 4 employers who are parties to or the subject of any 5 transaction involving the transfer of an employing enterprise 6 7 shall be deemed to be a single employer and the experience history of the employing enterprise shall be transferred to 8 9 the successor employer if the successor employer has acquired by the transaction all of the business enterprises of the 10 predecessor; provided that: 11

(a) all contributions, interest and penalties due from the predecessor employer have been paid;
 (b) notice of the transfer has been given in accordance with the rules of the secretary during the calendar year of the transaction transferring the

employing enterprise or the date of the actual transfer of control and operation of the employing enterprise; (c) the successor shall notify the

division of the acquisition on or before the due date of the successor's first wage and contribution report. If the successor employer fails to notify the division of the acquisition within this time limit, the division, when it receives actual notice, shall effect the transfer of the experience history and applicable rate of contribution

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1 retroactively to the date of the acquisition, and the 2 successor shall pay a penalty of fifty dollars (\$50.00); and (d) where the transaction involves 3 only a merger, consolidation or other form of reorganization 4 without a substantial change in the ownership and controlling 5 interest of the business entity, as determined by the 6 7 secretary, the limitations on transfers stated in Subparagraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this paragraph shall not 8 9 apply. A party to a merger, consolidation or other form of reorganization described in this subparagraph shall not be 10 relieved of liability for any contributions, interest or 11 12 penalties due and owing from the employing enterprise at the time of the merger, consolidation or other form of 13 14 reorganization;

(3) the applicable experience history may be transferred to the successor in the case of a partial transfer of an employing enterprise if the successor has acquired one or more of the several employing enterprises of a predecessor but not all of the employing enterprises of the predecessor and each employing enterprise so acquired was operated by the predecessor as a separate store, factory, shop or other separate employing enterprise and the predecessor, throughout the entire period of the contribution with liability applicable to each enterprise transferred, has maintained and preserved payroll records that, together with

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1 records of contribution liability and benefit chargeability, 2 can be separated by the parties from the enterprises retained 3 by the predecessor to the satisfaction of the secretary or the secretary's delegate. A partial experience history 4 5 transfer will be made only if the successor: (a) notifies the division of the 6 7 acquisition, in writing, not later than the due date of the successor's first quarterly wage and contribution report 8 9 after the effective date of the acquisition; (b) files an application provided by 10 the division that contains the endorsement of the predecessor 11 12 within thirty days from the delivery or mailing of such application by the division to the successor's last known 13 14 address; and files with the application a Form (c) 15 ES-903A or its equivalent with a schedule of the name and 16 social security number of and the wages paid to and the 17 18 contributions paid for each employee for the three and 19 one-half year period preceding the computation date as 20 defined in Subparagraph (d) of Paragraph (3) of Subsection I of this section through the date of transfer or such lesser 21 period as the enterprises transferred may have been in 22 operation. The application and Form ES-903A shall be 23 supported by the predecessor's permanent employment records, 24 which shall be available for audit by the division. 25 The .191218.4SA

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1 application and Form ES-903A shall be reviewed by the 2 division and, upon approval, the percentage of the predecessor's experience history attributable to the 3 enterprises transferred shall be transferred to the 4 5 successor. The percentage shall be obtained by dividing the taxable payrolls of the transferred enterprises for such 6 7 three and one-half year period preceding the date of computation or such lesser period as the enterprises 8 9 transferred may have been in operation by the predecessor's entire payroll; 10

(4) if, at the time of a transfer of an employing enterprise in whole or in part, both the predecessor and the successor are under common ownership, then the experience history attributable to the transferred business shall also be transferred to and combined with the experience history attributable to the successor employer. The rates of both employers shall be recalculated and made effective immediately upon the date of the transfer;

(5) whenever a person, who is not currently an employer, acquires the trade or business of an employing enterprise, the experience history of the acquired business shall not be transferred to the successor if the secretary or the secretary's designee finds that the successor acquired the business solely or primarily for the purpose of obtaining a lower rate of contributions. Instead, the successor shall .191218.4SA

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1 be assigned the applicable new employer rate pursuant to this 2 section. In determining whether the business was acquired 3 solely or primarily for the purpose of obtaining a lower rate of contribution, the secretary or the secretary's designee 4 shall consider: 5 the cost of acquiring the 6 (a) 7 business; (b) whether the person continued the 8 9 business enterprise of the acquired business; (c) how long such business enterprise 10 was continued; and 11 12 (d) whether a substantial number of new employees were hired for performance of duties unrelated 13 14 to those that the business activity conducted prior to acquisition; 15 (6) if, following a transfer of experience 16 history pursuant to this subsection, the department 17 determines that a substantial purpose of the transfer of the 18 employing enterprise was to obtain a reduced liability for 19 20 contributions, then the experience rating accounts of the employers involved shall be combined into a single account 21 and a single rate assigned to the combined account; 22 (7) the secretary shall adopt such rules as 23 are necessary to interpret and carry out the provisions of 24 this subsection, including rules that: 25

The contributions, together with interest and penalties thereon imposed by the Unemployment Compensation Law, shall not be assessed nor shall action to collect the same be commenced more than four years after a report showing the amount of the contributions was due. In the case of a false or fraudulent contribution report with intent to evade contributions or a willful failure to file a report of all 18 contributions due, the contributions, together with interest and penalties thereon, may be assessed or an action to collect such contributions may be begun at any time. Before the expiration of such period of limitation, the employer and the secretary may agree in writing to an extension thereof and the period so agreed on may be extended by subsequent agreements in writing. In any case where the assessment has been made

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and action to collect has been commenced within four years of
 the due date of any contribution, interest or penalty,
 including the filing of a warrant of lien by the secretary
 pursuant to Section 51-1-36 NMSA 1978, such action shall not
 be subject to any period of limitation.

М. The secretary shall correct any error in the 6 7 determination of an employer's rate of contribution during the calendar year to which the erroneous rate applies, 8 9 notwithstanding that notification of the employer's rate of contribution may have been issued and contributions paid 10 pursuant to the notification. Upon issuance by the division 11 12 of a corrected rate of contribution, the employer shall have the same rights to review and redetermination as provided in 13 Subsection J of this section. 14

N. Any interest required to be paid on advances to this state's unemployment compensation fund under Title 12 of the Social Security Act shall be paid in a timely manner as required under Section 1202 of Title 12 of the Social Security Act and shall not be paid, directly or indirectly, by the state from amounts in the state's unemployment compensation fund."

SECTION 3. Section 51-1-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003, Chapter 47, Section 11, as amended by Section 2 of this act) is repealed and a new Section 51-1-11 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:

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"51-1-11. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTION RATES--BENEFITS CHARGEABLE--UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION FUND ADEQUATE RESERVE--RESERVE FACTOR--EXCESS CLAIMS PREMIUM--DEFINITIONS.--

Benefits paid to an individual shall be charged 4 Α. to the individual's base-period employers on a pro rata basis 5 according to the proportion of the individual's total base-6 7 period wages received from each employer, except that no benefits paid to a claimant as extended benefits under the 8 9 provisions of Section 51-1-48 NMSA 1978 shall be charged to any base-period employer who is not on a reimbursable basis 10 and who is not a governmental entity and, except as the 11 12 secretary shall by rule prescribe otherwise, in the case of benefits paid to an individual who: 13

(1) left the employ of a base-period employer who is not on a reimbursable basis voluntarily without good cause in connection with the individual's employment;

(2) was discharged from the employment of a base-period employer who is not on a reimbursable basis for misconduct connected with the individual's employment;

(3) is employed part time by a base-period employer who is not on a reimbursable basis and who continues to furnish the individual the same part-time work while the individual is separated from full-time work for a nondisqualifying reason; or

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1 (4) received benefits based upon wages 2 earned from a base-period employer who is not on a 3 reimbursable basis while attending approved training under the provisions of Subsection E of Section 51-1-5 NMSA 1978. 4 5 Β. The division shall not charge a contributing or reimbursing base-period employer with any portion of benefit 6 7 amounts that the division can bill to or recover from the 8 federal government as either regular or extended benefits. 9 C. The division shall not charge a contributing base-period employer with any portion of benefits paid to an 10 individual for dependent allowance or because the individual 11 12 to whom benefits are paid: separated from employment due to (1)13 14 domestic abuse, as "domestic abuse" is defined in Section 40-13-2 NMSA 1978; or 15 (2) voluntarily left work to relocate 16 because of a spouse, who is in the military service of the 17 United States or the New Mexico national guard, receiving 18 19 permanent change of station orders, activation orders or unit 20 deployment orders. D. All contributions to the fund shall be pooled 21 and available to pay benefits to any individual entitled 22 thereto, irrespective of the source of the contributions. 23 In the case of a transfer of an employing Ε. 24 enterprise, notwithstanding any other provision of law, the 25

(2) the applicable experience history may be transferred to the successor in the case of a partial transfer of an employing enterprise if the successor has acquired one or more of the several employing enterprises of a predecessor but not all of the employing enterprises of the predecessor and each employing enterprise so acquired was operated by the predecessor as a separate store, factory, shop or other separate employing enterprise and the predecessor, throughout the entire period of the contribution with liability

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1 applicable to each enterprise transferred, has maintained and 2 preserved payroll records that, together with records of 3 contribution liability and benefit chargeability, can be separated by the parties from the enterprises retained by the 4 predecessor to the satisfaction of the secretary or the 5 secretary's delegate. A partial experience history transfer 6 7 will be made only if the successor: (a) notifies the division of the 8 9 acquisition, in writing, not later than the due date of the successor's first quarterly wage and contribution report after 10 the effective date of the acquisition; 11 12 (b) files an application provided by the division that contains the endorsement of the predecessor 13 14 within thirty days from the delivery or mailing of such application by the division to the successor's last known 15 address: and 16 files with the application a form 17 (c) with a schedule of the name and social security number of and 18 the wages paid to and the contributions paid for each employee 19 20 for the three and one-half year period preceding the computation date through the date of transfer or such lesser 21 period as the enterprises transferred may have been in 22 operation. The application and form shall be supported by the 23 predecessor's permanent employment records, which shall be 24 available for audit by the division. The application and form 25 .191218.4SA

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1 shall be reviewed by the division and, upon approval, the 2 percentage of the predecessor's experience history attributable to the enterprises transferred shall be 3 transferred to the successor. The percentage shall be 4 obtained by dividing the taxable payrolls of the transferred 5 enterprises for such three and one-half year period preceding 6 7 the date of computation or such lesser period as the enterprises transferred may have been in operation by the 8 9 predecessor's entire payroll;

Instead, the successor shall be assigned the applicable new employer rate pursuant to this

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be less than two percent of the employer's payroll, the contribution rate shall be increased by two percent of the employer's payroll for the calendar year in which the violation occurs and the three subsequent calendar years; or (b) if the person is not an employer, the secretary may impose a civil penalty not to exceed three thousand dollars (\$3,000).

For each calendar year, if, as of the 8 F. 9 computation date for that year, an employer has been a contributing employer throughout the preceding twelve months, 10 the contribution rate for that employer shall be determined by 11 12 multiplying the employer's benefit ratio by the reserve factor as determined pursuant to Subsection H of this section; 13 provided that an employer's contribution rate shall not exceed 14 five and four-tenths percent. If an employer's contribution rate pursuant to Subsection F of this section is calculated to be greater than 13 five and four-tenths percent, notwithstanding the limitation 14 pursuant to Subsection F of this section, the employer shall 15 be charged an excess claims premium in addition to the 16 contribution rate applicable to the employer; provided that an 17 employer's excess claims premium shall not exceed one percent 18 of the employer's average payroll. The excess claims premium 19 20 shall be determined by multiplying the employer's excess claims rate by the employer's average payroll. The employer shall be granted an 15 opportunity for a fair hearing in accordance with rules 16 prescribed by the secretary, but an employer shall not have 17 standing, in any proceeding involving the employer's rate of 18 contributions or contribution liability, to contest the 19 20 chargeability to the employer of any benefits paid in accordance with a determination, redetermination or decision 21 pursuant to Section 51-1-8 NMSA 1978, except upon the ground 22 that the services on the basis of which such benefits were 23 found to be chargeable did not constitute services performed 24 in employment for the employer and only in the event that the 25

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1 employer was not a party to such determination,

2 redetermination or decision, or to any other proceedings under the Unemployment Compensation Law in which the character of 3 such services was determined. The employer shall be promptly 4 notified of the decision on the employer's application for 5 redetermination, which shall become final unless, within 6 7 fifteen days after the mailing of notice thereof to the employer's last known address or in the absence of mailing, 8 within fifteen days after the delivery of such notice, further 9 appeal is initiated pursuant to Subsection D of Section 51-1-8 10 NMSA 1978. 11

12 Κ. The division shall provide each contributing employer, within ninety days of the end of each calendar 13 quarter, a written determination of benefits chargeable to the 14 employer. Such determination shall become conclusive and 15 binding upon the employer for all purposes unless, within 16 thirty days after the mailing of the determination to the 17 employer's last known address or in the absence of mailing, 18 within thirty days after the delivery of such determination, 19 20 the employer files an application for review and redetermination, setting forth the employer's reason therefor. 21 The employer shall be granted an opportunity for a fair 22 hearing in accordance with rules prescribed by the secretary, 23 but an employer shall not have standing in any proceeding 24 involving the employer's contribution liability to contest the 25

L. The contributions and excess claims premiums, together with interest and penalties thereon imposed by the Unemployment Compensation Law, shall not be assessed nor shall action to collect the same be commenced more than four years after a report showing the amount of the contributions was due. In the case of a false or fraudulent contribution report with intent to evade contributions or a willful failure to file a report of all contributions due, the contributions and .191218.4SA

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1 excess claims premiums, together with interest and penalties 2 thereon, may be assessed or an action to collect such contributions may be begun at any time. Before the expiration 3 of such period of limitation, the employer and the secretary 4 may agree in writing to an extension thereof and the period so 5 agreed on may be extended by subsequent agreements in writing. 6 7 In any case where the assessment has been made and action to 8 collect has been commenced within four years of the due date 9 of any contribution, excess claims premium, interest or penalty, including the filing of a warrant of lien by the 10 secretary pursuant to Section 51-1-36 NMSA 1978, such action 11 12 shall not be subject to any period of limitation.

M. The secretary shall correct any error in the determination of an employer's rate of contribution during the calendar year to which the erroneous rate applies, notwithstanding that notification of the employer's rate of contribution may have been issued and contributions paid pursuant to the notification. Upon issuance by the division of a corrected rate of contribution, the employer shall have the same rights to review and redetermination as provided in Subsection J of this section.

N. Any interest required to be paid on advances to this state's unemployment compensation fund under Title 12 of the Social Security Act shall be paid in a timely manner as required under Section 1202 of Title 12 of the Social Security

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1 Act and shall not be paid, directly or indirectly, by the 2 state from amounts in the state's unemployment compensation 3 fund. 0. As used in this section: 4 "annual payroll" means the total amount 5 (1)of remuneration from an employer for employment during a 6 7 twelve-month period ending on a computation date; "average payroll" means the average of 8 (2) 9 the last four annual payrolls; "base-period employers" means the 10 (3) employers of an individual during the individual's base 11 12 period; "base-period wages" means the wages of (4) 13 an individual for insured work during the individual's base 14 period on the basis of which the individual's benefit rights 15 were determined: 16 "common ownership" means that two or 17 (5) more businesses are substantially owned, managed or controlled 18 19 by the same person or persons; "computation date" for each calendar 20 (6) year means the close of business on June 30 of the preceding 21 calendar year; 22 "employing enterprise" means a business (7) 23 activity engaged in by a contributing employing unit in which 24 one or more persons have been employed within the current or 25 .191218.4SA - 49 -

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1 the three preceding calendar quarters. An "employing 2 enterprise" includes the employer's work force; "experience history" means the benefit 3 (8) charges and payroll experience of the employing enterprise; 4 "knowingly" means having actual 5 (9) knowledge of or acting with deliberate ignorance of or 6 7 reckless disregard for the prohibition involved; "predecessor" means the owner and 8 (10) operator of an employing enterprise immediately prior to the 9 transfer of such enterprise; 10 (11) "successor" means any person that 11 12 acquires an employing enterprise and continues to operate such business entity; and 13 "violates or attempts to violate" 14 (12)includes an intent to evade, a misrepresentation or a willful 15 nondisclosure." 16 SECTION 4. 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1 Any nonprofit organization [which] that, Α. 2 pursuant to Paragraph (8) of Subsection F of Section 51-1-42 NMSA 1978, is subject to the Unemployment Compensation Law 3 shall pay contributions [under] in accordance with the 4 provisions of Section 51-1-9 NMSA 1978, unless it elects, in 5 accordance with this subsection, to pay to the division for 6 7 the fund an amount equal to the amount of regular benefits and of one-half of the extended benefits paid, that is 8 attributable to service in the employ of such nonprofit 9 organization, to individuals for weeks of unemployment that 10 begin during the effective period of such election. 11

(2) Any nonprofit organization [which] that makes an election in accordance with Paragraph (1) of this subsection will continue to be liable for payments in lieu of contributions until it files with the division a written notice terminating its election not later than thirty days prior to the beginning of the taxable year for which such termination shall first be effective.

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1 (3) Any nonprofit organization that has been 2 paying contributions under the Unemployment Compensation Law may change to a reimbursable basis by filing with the division 3 written notice of its election not later than thirty days 4 prior to the beginning of the taxable year for which its 5 election shall first be effective. Such election shall not be 6 7 terminated by the organization for the following two taxable 8 vears.

The division, in accordance with such 9 (4) regulations as the secretary may prescribe, shall notify each 10 nonprofit organization of any determination [which] that it 11 12 may make of the organization's status as an employer and of the effective date of any election [which] that the 13 organization makes and of any termination of such election. 14 Such determination shall be subject to reconsideration, appeal 15 and review in accordance with regulations of the secretary 16 governing appeals by employers of their liability under 17 Section 51-1-9 NMSA 1978. 18

B. Payments in lieu of contributions shall be made in accordance with the provisions of this subsection.

(1) At the end of each calendar quarter or at the end of any other period as determined by the secretary, the division shall bill each nonprofit organization or group of such organizations [which] that has elected to make payments in lieu of contributions for an amount equal to the .191218.4SA

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1 full amount of regular benefits plus one-half of the amount of 2 extended benefits paid during such quarter or other prescribed 3 period that is attributable to service in the employ of such 4 organization.

Effective with the calendar quarter 5 (2) beginning January 1, 1987 and each succeeding calendar 6 7 quarter, each employer that is liable for payments in lieu of contributions, including governmental entities, shall pay to 8 9 the division an amount equal to twenty-five percent of the total benefit charges made to each such employer during the 10 four calendar quarters ending the preceding June 30. C. Collection of past due payments of amounts in lieu of contributions shall be as provided in this subsection.

(1) Past due payments of amounts in lieu of contributions are subject to the same penalties that are applied to past due contributions [under] pursuant to Section 51-1-12 NMSA 1978.

(2) The provisions of Section 51-1-36 NMSA 1978 shall apply to all contributions or payments of amounts in lieu of contributions for which a nonprofit organization becomes liable pursuant to an election made [under] pursuant .191218.4SA

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1 to Subsection A of this section.

2 Any nonprofit organization that elects (3) to become liable for payments in lieu of contributions shall 3 be required, within thirty days after the effective date of 4 its election, to execute and file with the secretary a surety 5 bond or such other surety undertaking or security, which may 6 7 consist of a cash security deposit, in a form approved by the secretary. With the consent of the secretary, a cash security 8 9 deposit may be made in three annual installments. 9 (5) If any nonprofit organization that is not required to execute and file a surety bond or other 10 security is delinquent in making payments in lieu of 11 12 contributions as required [under] pursuant to Subsection B of this section or if any nonprofit organization that is required 13 to execute and maintain a surety bond or other security fails 14 to do so or is delinquent in making payments as required 15 [under] pursuant to Subsection B of this section, the 16 secretary may terminate the organization's election to make 17 payments in lieu of contributions effective as of the 18 beginning of the next taxable year and the termination shall 19 20 be effective until the organization executes and files with the department a surety bond or other security as required. 21

(6) Any bond or other surety undertaking or security required under this subsection shall be in force for a period of not less than two taxable years and shall be renewed with the approval of the secretary at such times as

Each employer who is liable for payments in lieu of contributions shall pay to the division for the fund 3 the amount of regular benefits plus the amount of one-half of 4 extended benefits paid that are attributable to service in the 5 employ of that employer in accordance with the provisions of 6 7 Subsection [B] <u>A</u> of Section 51-1-11 NMSA 1978, except that any employer that is liable for payments in lieu of contributions 8 9 shall not be relieved of charges for benefits paid to an individual who was separated from the employ of that employer 10 for any reason. 11

Two or more employers who have become liable for payments in lieu of contributions, in accordance with the 13 14 provisions of Subsection A of this section, Subsection B of Section 51-1-14 NMSA 1978 and Section 51-1-16 NMSA 1978, may 15 file a joint application for the establishment of a group 16 account for the purpose of sharing the cost of benefits paid 17 that are attributable to service in the employ of such 18 employers. Each application shall identify and authorize a 19 20 group representative to act as the group's agent for the purpose of this subsection. Upon its approval of the 21 application, the division shall establish a group account for 22 the employers effective as of the beginning of the calendar 23 quarter in which it receives the application and shall notify 24 the group's representative of the effective date of the 25

(3) equaled or exceeded six percent, regardless of the rate of insured unemployment in the two previous years; provided that the operation of this paragraph shall not activate the state "on indicator" any time after four weeks prior to the last week for which one hundred percent federal sharing funding is available under Section 2005(a) of Public Law No. 111-5, without regard to the extension of federal sharing for certain claims as provided under Section 2005(c) of that law; or

(4) with respect to benefits for weeks of unemployment beginning after July 1, 2003 and ending four

(2) twenty times the individual's average weekly benefit amount that was payable to the individual pursuant to this section for a week of total unemployment in the applicable benefit year; or

(3) forty-six times the individual's average weekly benefit amount that was payable to the individual

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1 pursuant to this section for a week of total unemployment in 2 the applicable benefit year reduced by the total amount of regular benefits that were paid, or deemed paid, to the 3 individual pursuant to this section with respect to the 4 benefit year; provided that the amount determined pursuant to 5 this paragraph shall be reduced by the total amount of 6 7 additional benefits paid, or deemed paid, to the individual under the provisions of this section for weeks of unemployment 8 9 in the individual's benefit year that began prior to the effective date of the extended benefit period that is current 10 in the week for which the individual first claims extended 11 12 benefits; and provided further, if the benefit year of an individual ends within an extended benefit period, the 13 remaining balance of the extended benefits that the individual 14 would, but for this paragraph, be entitled to receive in that 15 extended benefit period, with respect to weeks of unemployment 16 beginning after the end of the benefit year, shall be reduced, 17 but not below zero, by the product of the number of weeks for 18 which the individual received any amounts as readjustment 19 20 allowances within that benefit year multiplied by the individual weekly benefit amount for extended benefits. 21

24	individual may subsequently be determined to be entitled to
25	added regular benefits; or

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1 (b) if the individual's benefit year 2 has expired prior to such week, has no, or insufficient, wages on the basis of which the individual could establish a new 3 benefit year that would include such week; and 4 5 (c) has no right to unemployment benefits or allowances, as the case may be, under the Railroad 6 7 Unemployment Insurance Act, the Trade Expansion Act of 1962, the Trade Act of 1974, the Automotive Products Trade Act of 8 9 1965 and such other federal laws as are specified in regulations issued by the United States secretary of labor; 10 and has not received and is not seeking unemployment benefits 11 12 under the unemployment compensation law of Canada, but if the individual is seeking such benefits and the appropriate agency 13 finally determines that the individual is not entitled to 14 benefits under such law, the individual is considered an 15 exhaustee: and 16 (6) "state law" means the unemployment 17 insurance law of any state, approved by the United States 18 secretary of labor under Section 3304 of the Internal Revenue 19 Code of 1986." 20

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SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE.--

A. The effective date of the provisions of Section 2 of this act is January 1, 2014.

B. The effective date of the provisions of Sections 1 and 3 through 6 of this act is January 1, 2015.

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
