18	SECTION 1. Section 9-1-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1977,
19	Chapter 248, Section 4) is amended to read:
20	"9-1-4. CABINET DEPARTMENTSSTRUCTURE
21	A. Except as otherwise provided by law for its
22	internal structure, the executive branch shall adhere to the
23	following standard terms:

1 appointed by the governor with the consent of the senate and 2 who shall serve at [his] the governor's pleasure; 3 the principal unit of a department is a (2) 4 "division", headed by a "director" who shall be appointed by 5 the secretary with the approval of the governor and who shall 6 serve at the secretary's pleasure; 7 the principal unit of a division is a (3) 8 "bureau", headed by a "chief" who is employed by the secretary 9 and who is covered by, and subject to, the provisions of the 10 Personnel Act; and 11 (4) the principal unit of a bureau is a 12 "section", headed by a "supervisor" who is employed by the 13 secretary and who is covered by, and subject to, the provisions 14 of the Personnel Act. 15 An appointed secretary shall serve and have all Β. 16 of the duties, responsibilities and authority of that office 17 during the period of time prior to final action by the senate 18 confirming or rejecting [his] the secretary's appointment. 19 C. No later than thirty days from the date of 20 confirmation or the effective date of this 2021 act, whichever 21 is later, a secretary shall file a signed affidavit with the 22 governor stating the secretary's name and that the secretary is 23 a resident of the state of New Mexico and will maintain an 24 uninterrupted residency within the state for the term of the 25 secretary's appointment.
