RELATING TO CRIMINAL JUSTICE; ABOLISHING TIME LIMITS FOR
PROSECUTING CERTAIN OFFENSES AGAINST CHILDREN; REPEALING
SECTIONS 30-1-9.1 AND 30-1-9.2 NMSA 1978 (BEING LAWS 1987,
CHAPTER 117, SECTION 1 AND LAWS 2003, CHAPTER 257, SECTION 1).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 30-1-8 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1963, Chapter 303, Section 1-8, as amended) is amended to read:

"30-1-8. TIME LIMITATIONS FOR COMMENCING PROSECUTION.--A person shall not be prosecuted, tried or punished in any court of this state unless the indictment is found or information or complaint is filed within the time as provided:

- A. for a second degree felony, within six years from the time the crime was committed;
- B. for a third or fourth degree felony, within five .211322.1

years from the time the crime was committed;

- for a misdemeanor, within two years from the time the crime was committed;
- for a petty misdemeanor, within one year from the time the crime was committed;
- for any crime against or violation of Section 51-1-38 NMSA 1978, within three years from the time the crime was committed:
- for a felony pursuant to Section 7-1-71.3, 7-1-72 or 7-1-73 NMSA 1978, within five years from the time the crime was committed; provided that for a series of crimes involving multiple filing periods within one calendar year, the limitation shall begin to run on December 31 of the year in which the crimes occurred;
- for an identity theft crime pursuant to Section 30-16-24.1 NMSA 1978, within five years from the time the crime was discovered:
- for any crime not contained in the Criminal Code or where a limitation is not otherwise provided for, within three years from the time the crime was committed; [and]
- for a capital felony or a first degree violent felony, no limitation period shall exist and prosecution for these crimes may commence at any time after the occurrence of the crime; and
