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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. [ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] SHORT TITLEThis act may be
18	cited as the "New Mexico Reconnect Scholarship Act".
19	SECTION 2. [ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] DEFINITIONSAs used in the
20	New Mexico Reconnect Scholarship Act:
21	A. "community college" means a branch community
22	college of a four-year state educational institution, a two-
23	year state educational institution or a community college or
24	technical and vocational institute established pursuant to
25	Chapter 21, Article 13 or 16 NMSA 1978, respectively;

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1 Β. "department" means the higher education 2 department; C. "student" means a resident of New Mexico who is 3 enrolled or will be enrolled in a community college in New 4 Mexico at the time the scholarship is awarded; and 5 "student aid" means aid offered by the community D. 6 7 college to the student on a per-semester basis. Aid includes scholarships, grants, bequests and other forms of need-based 8 9 aid and does not include student loans, except for loans issued by the department which may be waived in exchange for a period 10 of service to the state.. 11 12 SECTION 3. [NEW MATERIAL] CONDITIONS FOR ELIGIBILITY .-- A 13 New Mexico reconnect scholarship may be awarded to an 14 individual who: complies with the rules adopted by the 15 Α. department pursuant to the New Mexico Reconnect Scholarship 16 17 Act; is a resident of New Mexico and has been a 18 Β. 19 resident for at least the past year; 20 C. submits to the intended community college a completed: 21 New Mexico reconnect scholarship (1)22 application form developed by the community college or the 23 department; or 24 free application for federal student aid 25 (2) .211099.1 - 2 -

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1 provided pursuant to the federal Higher Education Act of 1965; 2 D. is: at least twenty-four years old; 3 (1) (2) 4 married; a graduate or professional student; 5 (3) (4) a veteran; 6 7 (5) a member of the United States armed forces: 8 9 (6) an orphan; a ward of the court; 10 (7) a person who has at least one legal (8) 11 12 dependent other than a spouse; or an emancipated minor; 13 (9) 14 Ε. has not earned an associate's, baccalaureate, master's or doctorate degree; and 15 has an adjusted gross income of less than F. 16 thirty-six thousand dollars (\$36,000) per year. 17 SECTION 4. [NEW MATERIAL] SCHOLARSHIP AUTHORIZED--18 ADMINISTRATION--PREFERENCE IN SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS.--19 20 Α. The department shall administer the New Mexico Reconnect Scholarship Act and shall adopt all rules necessary 21 to administer that act. 22 Scholarships shall be awarded to qualified 23 Β. applicants. Qualifications and preferences in scholarship 24 awards shall be determined by the department pursuant to its 25 .211099.1 - 3 -

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1 adopted rules.

2	SECTION 5. [ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] DURATION OF SCHOLARSHIPEach
3	scholarship is for a period of one academic semester. A
4	scholarship may be renewed until the award recipient has
5	received four consecutive semester scholarship awards or until
6	the student graduates from an eligible community college with
7	an associate's degree or certificate, whichever occurs first.
8	SECTION 6. [ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] TERMINATION OF SCHOLARSHIPA
9	New Mexico reconnect scholarship awarded pursuant to the New
10	Mexico Reconnect Scholarship Act is terminated upon occurrence
11	of:
12	A. withdrawal of the award recipient from the
13	community college;
14	B. failure of the award recipient to maintain a
15	minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a scale of 4.0
16	in the immediately preceding semester;
17	C. failure to be enrolled in at least nine hours of
18	course credits per semester;
19	D. failure to complete at least six hours of course
20	credits in a semester in which the student received a
21	scholarship pursuant to the New Mexico Reconnect Scholarship
22	Act;
23	E. failure to maintain continuous enrollment in
24	classes leading to an associate's degree or certificate; or
25	F. substantial noncompliance by the award recipient
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with the New Mexico Reconnect Scholarship Act or the rules adopted by the department pursuant to that act.

SECTION 7. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] ORDER OF SCHOLARSHIP AWARD.---Subject to the amount of money in the New Mexico reconnect scholarship fund, the amount of New Mexico reconnect scholarship awards shall not exceed the cost of tuition and mandatory fees charged to all students for coursework leading to completion of the eligible program of study at the eligible community college attended less all other student aid provided to students, which aid shall be credited first to tuition and mandatory fees.

SECTION 8. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] FUND CREATED.--The "New Mexico reconnect scholarship fund" is created in the state treasury. Money in the fund is appropriated to the department to administer the New Mexico Reconnect Scholarship Act. Money in the fund shall revert to the general fund at the end of a fiscal year. Money in the fund shall be disbursed on warrants signed by the secretary of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers signed by the secretary of higher education or the secretary's authorized representative.

SECTION 9. APPROPRIATION.--Five million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$5,800,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the New Mexico reconnect scholarship fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2020 to carry out the provisions of the New Mexico Reconnect Scholarship Act. Up to seventy-five .211099.1

	5	SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
