10	A JOINT MEMORIAL
11	AFFIRMING THE COMMITMENT OF THE LEGISLATURE TO PROTECT CHILDREN
12	IN NEW MEXICO FROM ABUSE AND NEGLECT.
13	
14	WHEREAS, violence against children includes all forms of
15	violence against people under eighteen years of age, which may
16	involve physical, sexual and emotional abuse and neglect; and
17	WHEREAS, there were fourteen thousand one hundred thirty-
18	nine calls received in 2018 by the statewide central intake
19	pertaining to possible crimes against children in the city of
20	Albuquerque, all of which were investigated by Albuquerque
21	police department officers; and
22	WHEREAS, in 2019, the average number of cases being
23	reviewed by the Albuquerque police department's crimes against
24	children unit was two hundred twenty-six cases per week; and
25	WHEREAS, the Children's Code allows for accused

perpetrators to access minor victims' records and evidence as an exception to its confidentiality section; and

WHEREAS, access to juvenile records by a potential perpetrator could place the victim at risk for additional trauma and provide suspects access to private interviews, safe house interviews, videos, reports, limited medical information and photos; and

WHEREAS, strengthening the Children's Code to amend its confidentiality section to prevent accused perpetrators from accessing minor victims' records and evidence and providing a specific Inspection of Public Records Act exception for law enforcement investigations could clarify existing law and better protect access to a child victim's records; and

WHEREAS, defining "lewd and lascivious conduct" in New Mexico law could allow for law enforcement agencies to bring charges against individuals exhibiting these behaviors in public and thereby potentially identify child predators and prevent exposure of juvenile victims to these acts; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexico legislature is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and protecting them from abuse and maltreatment; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of legislators to periodically revisit legislation with the aim of strengthening laws that protect vulnerable populations and protecting the children of New Mexico from abuse and neglect;
