16	WHEREAS, law enforcement officers are trained to the
17	highest standards to protect and serve the public; and
18	WHEREAS, both active duty law enforcement officers and
19	retired law enforcement officers play significant roles in
20	safeguarding communities; and
21	WHEREAS, since its initial passage in 2004, the federal
22	Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004, which allows
23	qualified law enforcement officers and qualified retired or
24	separated law enforcement officers to carry a concealed firearm
25	in any jurisdiction in the United States or United States

WHEREAS, the federal Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004 is a no-cost benefit to communities by allowing qualified active duty and retired law enforcement officers to carry concealed weapons to continue the core law enforcement officer mission of protecting the public; and

9 WHEREAS, criminals are never off duty, nor are they 10 retired, and they will be armed in prohibited areas despite any 11 laws to the contrary; and

WHEREAS, active duty and retired law enforcement officers should not be put in the position of not being able to defend themselves or others because of restrictions on where concealed weapons can be carried; and

WHEREAS, a New Mexico Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act would serve to complement the benefits of the federal Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that an interim legislative committee that considers criminal justice issues be requested to hear testimony on the benefits of passing a Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act in New Mexico that is modeled on the federal Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004; and
