SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing education. (BDR 34-946)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to education; [prohibiting the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada from assessing tuition charges against certain students;] prohibiting the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada from assessing registration fees, <u>certain</u> fees associated with course enrollment and laboratory fees against certain students; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1[Existing law prohibits the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada from assessing2tuition charges against certain students, including, without limitation, students whose families3have been bona fide residents of this State for at least 12 months before the student4matriculates at a university, state college or community college. (NRS 396.540) Section 1.5 of5this bill prohibits the Board of Regents from assessing tuition charges against students who6are members of a federally recognized Indian tribe or nation or are certified by such a tribe or7nation or by the Bureau of Indian Affairs as being a descendant of an enrolled member of the8tribe or nation, regardless of membership status, and who are not bona fide residents of this9State.]

10 Section [1] 1.2 of this bill requires the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada to grant a waiver of registration fees, per-credit fees or other fees associated with course enrollment and laboratory fees for a Native American student who demonstrates that the 11 12 13 student: (1) is a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe or nation, all or part of which 14 15 16 is located in this State, or who is certified by the enrollment department of such a tribe or The neutron is the second of the end of the end of the end of the end of the tribe of the neutron of the tribe or nation, regardless of membership status; (2) is eligible for enrollment in a school within the Nevada System of Higher Education; (3) has been a resident of this State for at least 1 year; fand (4) has maintained at least a 2.0 grade point average, on a 4.0 scale, each 17 18 19 semester, or the equivalent of a 2.0 grade point average if a different scale is used []; and (5) 20 has completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Section 1.4 of this bill 21 requires the Board of Regents to prepare and submit an annual report to the Director of

the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Nevada Legislature concerning the number of students eligible and the total funding available for such a waiver.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 396 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto la new 1 section to read as follows:] the provisions set forth as sections 1.2 and 1.4 of this 2 3 act. 4 Sec. 1.2. 1. The Board of Regents shall grant a waiver of the payment of 5 registration fees, laboratory fees and any other mandatory fees assessed each 6 semester against a student who is Native American and demonstrates that the 7 student: 8 (a) Is a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe or nation, all or part of which is located within the boundaries of this State, or who is certified by the 9 enrollment department of such a tribe or nation or by the Bureau of Indian 10 Affairs as being a descendant of an enrolled member of such a tribe or nation, all 11 12 or part of which is located within the boundaries of this State, regardless of 13 *membership status;* (b) Is eligible for enrollment in a school within the System; 14 15 (c) Has been a resident of this State for not less than 1 year; [and] 16 (d) Has maintained at least a 2.0 grade point average, on a 4.0 scale, each semester or the equivalent of a 2.0 grade point average if a different scale is used 17 [+]; and18 (e) Has completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid provided for 19 by 20 U.S.C. § 1090. 20 21 The amount of the waiver must be equal to: 2. (a) If the student is entitled to receive any federal educational benefits for a 22 23 semester, the balance of registration fees, laboratory fees and any other 24 mandatory fees assessed against the student that remain unpaid after the student's account has been credited with the full amount of the federal educational benefits to which the student is entitled for that semester; or 25 26 27 (b) If the student is not entitled to receive any federal educational benefits for 28 a semester, the full amount of the registration fees, laboratory fees and any other 29 mandatory fees assessed against the student for that semester. 30 3. The waiver must be granted to a student who enrolls in any program offered by a school within the System, including, without limitation, a trade or 31 32 vocational program, a graduate program or a professional program. 4. For the purpose of assessing fees and charges against a person to whom 33 34 such a waiver is granted, the person shall be deemed to be a bona fide resident of 35 this State. 36 5. The Board of Regents may request documentation confirming that the 37 student is a member or descendant of a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe H or nation, all or part of which is located within the boundaries of this 38 39 State. 40 Sec. 1.4. The Board of Regents shall, on or before September 1 of each calendar year, prepare and submit a report to the Director of the Legislative 41 42 Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Nevada Legislature that includes, without 43 *limitation, aggregated data for:* 1. The number of students that qualify for a waiver of registration fees, 44 45 laboratory fees and any other mandatory fees pursuant to section 1.2 of this act.

29	any provision of this act which adds or revises a requirement to submit a
30	report to the Legislature.
31	Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2021.
