SUMMARY—Creates the Division of Supplier Diversity within the Office of Economic Development. (BDR 18-572)

AN ACT relating to economic development; creating the Division of Supplier Diversity in the Office of Economic Development; requiring the Executive Director of the Office of Economic Development to appoint the Administrator of the Division; setting forth the duties of the Division; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

#### Legislative Counsel's Digest:

123456789 Existing law creates, within the Office of the Governor, the Office of Economic Development, which consists of the Division of Economic Development and the Division of Motion Pictures. (NRS 231.043) Section 2 of this bill creates a Division of Supplier Diversity within the Office of Economic Development. 3. All state and local governmental agencies shall cooperate with the Division of Supplier Diversity in carrying out the provisions of this section.

4. As used in this section, "local emerging small business" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 231.1402.

Sec. 2. NRS 231.043 is hereby amended to read as follows:

231.043 1. There is hereby created within the Office of the Governor the Office of Economic Development, consisting of:

(a) A Division of Economic Development; [and]

(b) A Division of Motion Pictures []; and

(c) A Division of Supplier Diversity.

The Governor shall propose a budget for the Office. 2.

3. Employees of the Office are not in the classified or unclassified service of this State and serve at the pleasure of the Executive Director.

48 Sec. 3. The provisions of NRS 354.599 do not apply to any additional 49 expenses of a local government that are related to the provisions of this act.

**Sec. 4.** The provisions of subsection 1 of NRS 218D.380 do not apply to any 50 51 provision of this act which adds or revises a requirement to submit a report to the 52 Legislature. 53

**Sec. 5.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2021.
