24 Sec. 13. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
25 the Division of State Library, Archives and Public Records of the Department
26 of Administration the sum of \$500,000 for books and other research materials.

27 Sec. 14. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
28 the Domestic Violence Resource Center in Reno, Nevada the sum of \$1,000,000
29 for its programs and services.

30 Sec. 15. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
31 Friends of Gem Theater the sum of \$1,000,000 for the restoration of the Gem
32 Theater in Pioche, Nevada.

33 Sec. 16. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
34 the Gay and Lesbian Community Center of Southern Nevada, Inc. the sum of
35 \$1,000,000 for its programs and services.

36 Sec. 17. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
37 Green Our Planet the sum of \$3,000,000 for its programs for school gardens.

38 Sec. 18. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
39 the International Gaming Institute of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, the
40 sum of \$500,000 for the "Expanding the Leaderverse" initiative to increase the
41 diversity of the leadership of the gaming industry.

42 Sec. 19. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
43 the Leadership Institute of Nevada the sum of \$250,000 for educational
44 training, support and programming for first-generation college students.

45 Sec. 20. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
46 the Legal Aid Center of Southern Nevada the sum of \$4,000,000 for a capital
47 improvement project.

48 Sec. 21. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
49 the Legal Aid Center of Southern Nevada the sum of \$250,000 for programs
50 and services relating to tenants' rights.

51 Sec. 22. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
52 The Neon Museum the sum of \$1,000,000 for a capital improvement project.

1 Sec. 23. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
2 the Nevada Arts Council created by NRS 233C.025 the sum of \$500,000 for its
3 programs and activities.

4 Sec. 24. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
5 the Nevada Blind Children's Foundation the sum of \$1,000,000 for its
6 programs and services.

7 Sec. 25. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
8 the Nevada Clean Energy Fund formed pursuant to NRS 701B.985 the sum of
9 \$1,000,000 to use for obtaining federal money to assist with carrying out
10 qualified clean energy projects and economic policies pursuant to NRS
11 701B.930 to 701B.995, inclusive.

12 Sec. 26. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
13 the Pioneer Center for the Performing Arts the sum of \$1,000,000 for a capital
14 improvement project.

15 Sec. 27. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
16 the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada the sum of
17 \$1,000,000 for activities to stabilize transit operations.

18 Sec. 28. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
19 the Roseman University of Health Sciences the sum of \$1,000,000 for
20 recruitment of students.

21 Sec. 29. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
22 Special Olympics Nevada the sum of \$250,000 for its programs.

23 Sec. 30. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
24 the Tahoe-Douglas Visitors Authority the sum of \$1,200,000 for providing
25 microtransit service.

26 Sec. 31. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
27 United Way of Northern Nevada and the Sierra the sum of \$1,200,000 for its
28 United Readers Program.

29 Sec. 32. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
30 the Greenspun College of Urban Affairs of the University of Nevada, Las
31 Vegas the sum of \$1,000,000 for tourist safety initiatives.

32 Sec. 33. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
33 Vegas PBS the sum of \$4,000,000 for digital educational materials and
34 activities related to the Outdoor Nevada television program.

35 Sec. 34. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
36 the Interim Finance Committee the sum of \$2,500,000 for allocation to the
37 nonprofit corporation formed to establish an art museum in Las Vegas,
38 Nevada, upon a showing to the Committee:

39 1. That the corporation has been incorporated under the laws of this
40 State as a nonprofit corporation; and

41 2. That the purpose of the corporation is to establish an art museum in
42 Las Vegas, Nevada.

43 Sec. 35. Except for a state agency, as defined in NRS 223.470, upon
44 acceptance of the money appropriated by this act, the entity that accepts the
45 money agrees to:

46 1. Prepare and transmit a report to the Interim Finance Committee on or
47 before December 20, 2024, that describes each expenditure made from the
48 money appropriated by this act from the date on which the money was
49 received by the entity through December 1, 2024;

50 2. Prepare and transmit a final report to the Interim Finance Committee
51 on or before September 19, 2025, that describes each expenditure made from
52 the money appropriated by this act from the date on which the money was
53 received by the entity through June 30, 2025; and

3. Upon request of the Legislative Commission, make available to the Legislative Auditor any of the books, accounts, claims, reports, vouchers or other records of information, confidential or otherwise, of the entity, regardless of their form or location, that the Legislative Auditor deems necessary to conduct an audit of the use of the money appropriated by this act.

Sec. 36. Any remaining balance of the appropriations made by sections 1 to 34, inclusive, of this act must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2025, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after September 19, 2025, by either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 19, 2025.

Sec. 37. Section 1 of Assembly Bill No. 522 of this session is hereby amended to read as follows:
