SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to charter schools. (BDR 34-529)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to education; revising requirements for teachers who provide instruction at a charter school; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

¹ Under existing law, at least 70 percent of teachers who provide instruction at a charter school must demonstrate experience and qualifications through licensure or subject matter expertise. Existing law provides that teachers who teach certain subjects at a charter school must be licensed. Under existing law, a charter school may employ a person to teach who does not have a license or subject matter expertise if the person meets certain requirements. (NRS 388A.518) **Section 1** of this bill instead requires that all teachers who provide instruction at a charter school be licensed to teach in this State. **Sections 2-7** of this bill make conforming changes related to the requirement

9 Sections 2-7 of this bill make conforming changes related to the requirement 10 that all teachers providing instruction at a charter school have a license. Section 8 11 of this bill provides that a teacher who is employed to teach at a charter school on 12 or before July 1, 2021, and who does not have a license to teach may continue to 13 teach at the charter school without obtaining a license until July 1, 2026.

6 The Department may prescribe a fee to be assessed against a 4. charter school for the costs incurred by the Department for tracking 7 8 and monitoring the status of a criminal case in accordance with the 9 requirements prescribed pursuant to this section. Any fee prescribed 10 pursuant to this section must be calculated to produce the revenue estimated to cover the costs related to tracking and monitoring the 11 12 status of a criminal case, but the amount of the fee for tracking and 13 monitoring the status of a criminal case must not exceed the actual 14 cost to the Department of tracking and monitoring the status of the 15 criminal case.

37 **Sec. 8.** Notwithstanding the amendatory provisions of this act, 38 a teacher who is employed by a charter school on or before July 1, 39 2021, to provide instruction at the charter school but not licensed to 40 teach, and who, because of that employment, is required by NRS 41 388A.518, as amended by section 1 of this act, to be licensed as a 42 teacher pursuant to chapter 391 of NRS, may continue to provide 43 instruction at the charter school without obtaining a license to teach 44 until July 1, 2026.





1 Sec. 9. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2021.
