ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 110–COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

(ON BEHALF OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION)

PREFILED FEBRUARY 7, 2017

Referred to Committee on Education

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing education. (BDR 34-327)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to education; requiring the Department of Education to establish a pilot program to provide competency-based education; requiring the State Board of Education to adopt regulations relating to the pilot program; establishing the Competency-Based Education Network; revising provisions governing the requirements for a pupil to receive credit for a course of study without attending the classes for the course; requiring the Department of Education to conduct a public awareness regarding competency-based campaign education; authorizing the Department to distribute certain money through a competitive grants program to carry out the pilot program to provide competency-based education; requiring the Competency-Based Education Network to prepare a comprehensive report relating to competencybased education; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Section 1.2 of this bill requires the Department of Education to establish a pilot program to provide competency-based education and requires the State Board of Education to adopt regulations that prescribe the process for submission of an application by a school district or charter school to participate in the pilot program and the qualifications and conditions for participation by a school in the pilot program. **Section 1.1** of this bill defines "competency-based education" to mean a





7 system of instruction by which a pupil advances to a higher level of learning when 8 the pupil demonstrates mastery of a concept or skill, regardless of the time, place or ġ pace at which the pupil progresses.

10 Section 1.4 of this bill requires the Department to establish a Competency-11 Based Education Network and prescribes the membership and duties of the 12 Network, including a requirement that the Network submit a report to the Governor 13 and the Legislature on the implementation of competency-based education once 14 each biennium.

15 **Section 1.6** of this bill requires the Department of Education to: (1) conduct a public campaign to raise awareness about competency-based education; and (2) 16 17 conduct at least one meeting with the superintendents of the school districts relating 18 to competency-based education. Section 1.6 also authorizes the Department to use 19 money appropriated by the 2017 Legislature to the Account for Programs for Innovation and the Prevention of Remediation to carry out the pilot program to provide competency-based education.

20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 20 31 32 33 45 36 37 38 39 Existing law provides that a pupil may be granted credit for certain courses in lieu of course attendance if the pupil: (1) demonstrates proficiency on certain examinations; and (2) applies to the board of trustees of the school district in which the pupil attends school to be granted credit. (NRS 389.171) Section 1.8 of this bill provides that a pupil may also be granted credit in lieu of course attendance if the pupil demonstrates proficiency to meet the objectives of a course or of a particular area or areas of a course: (1) through a portfolio of the pupil's work; (2) through the pupil's performance of a task that is designed to measure the proficiency of the pupil; or (3) as measured by criteria prescribed by the State Board of Education. Section 1.8 also requires the State Board to adopt regulations that: (1) provide that a pupil may apply to the governing body of the charter school in which the pupil is enrolled to be granted credit in lieu of course attendance; and (2) prescribe other criteria that may be used to determine whether a pupil has achieved proficiency in a course.

Section 4 of this bill requires the Competency-Based Education Network to prepare a comprehensive report with its findings and recommendations on or before April 1, 2022, which must be posted on the Internet website of the Department of Education and submitted to the Governor, the Legislative Committee on Education 40 and the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for distribution to the next 41 regular session of the Legislature.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Chapter 389 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 1.1 to 1.6, inclusive, of 2 3 this act.

4 Sec. 1.1. As used in sections 1.1 to 1.6, inclusive, of this act, "competency-based education" means a system of instruction by which a pupil advances to a higher level of learning when the 5 6 pupil demonstrates mastery of a concept or skill, regardless of the 7 8 time, place or pace at which the pupil progresses.

Sec. 1.2. 1. The Department shall establish a pilot program 9 to provide competency-based education. 10

The State Board shall adopt regulations that prescribe: 11 2.





(a) The process for submission of an application by the board 1 2 of trustees of a school district or the governing body of a charter 3 school to participate in the pilot program; and (b) The qualifications and conditions for participation by a 4 school in the pilot program, including, without limitation: 5 6 (1) A commitment by the school district or charter school to 7 implement competency-based education for not less than 5 years; (2) Evidence of support for the implementation of 8 competency-based education by the community served by the 9 10 school district or charter school; and (3) A commitment to participate in the Competency-Based 11 Education Network established by section 1.4 of this act. 12 13 3. A school selected to participate in the pilot program to 14 provide competency-based education shall: 15 (a) Implement a system of instruction by which a pupil 16 advances to a higher level of learning when the pupil 17 demonstrates mastery of a concept or skill; 18 (b) Establish concrete skills on which a pupil will be evaluated 19 that include explicit, measurable and transferable learning 20 objectives; 21 (c) Ensure that assessment is a meaningful and positive 22 *learning experience for pupils;* (d) Ensure that pupils receive timely and differentiated support 23 based upon their individual learning needs; and 24 25 (e) Ensure that pupils are able to apply knowledge learned, create new knowledge and develop important skills and 26 27 dispositions relating to such knowledge. 28 Sec. 1.4. 1. The Department shall establish a Competency-29 **Based Education Network.** 30 The Competency-Based Education Network must consist of *2*. 31 the following members: (a) The principal of each school selected to participate in the 32 33 pilot program established pursuant to section 1.2 of this act. 34 (b) At least one teacher who teaches in each school selected to 35 participate in the pilot program established pursuant to section 1.2 of this act, selected by the principal of the school. 36 (c) The Chancellor of the Nevada System of Higher Education 37 38 or his or her designee. 39 (d) The Chancellor of Western Governors University Nevada 40 or his or her designee. 41 (e) One teacher who does not teach in a school selected to participate in the pilot program established pursuant to section 1.2 42 of this act, selected by the Nevada State Education Association to 43 44 represent the Association.





1 (f) One parent or guardian of a pupil who is enrolled in a 2 school selected to participate in the pilot program established 3 pursuant to section 1.2 of this act, selected by the Nevada Parent 4 Teacher Association to represent the Association.

5 (g) One parent or guardian of a pupil who is not enrolled in a 6 school selected to participate in the pilot program established 7 pursuant to section 1.2 of this act, selected by the Nevada Parent 8 Teacher Association to represent the Association.

3. The Competency-Based Education Network shall:

10 (a) Study approaches to converting requirements regarding the 11 amount of time a pupil is required to spend in a classroom into 12 competency measures;

13 (b) Study tools for use in personalized learning and 14 competency-based education;

15 (c) Study approaches to ensure appropriate examinations are 16 prescribed by the State Board pursuant to NRS 389.171;

17 (d) Study strategies for improving competency-based education 18 through the use of technology;

19 (e) Study professional development relating to competency-20 based education and other support to assist educators in 21 transitioning to a system of competency-based education;

(f) Provide support and share data and best practices among
schools participating in the pilot program established pursuant to
section 1.2 of this act;

(g) Identify barriers and possible solutions to implementing a
statewide system of competency-based education;

27 (h) Develop evidence-based recommendations for the 28 continued implementation of a system of competency-based 29 education; and

(i) On or before January 31 of every even-numbered year,
submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature on the
implementation of a system of competency-based education in this
State.

4. The Competency-Based Education Network shall initially meet at the call of the Superintendent of Public Instruction. After the first meeting, the Network shall meet at the call of the Chair.

5. At the first meeting of the Competency-Based Education Network, the members of the Network shall elect a Chair by majority vote.

40 6. A majority of the members of the Competency-Based 41 Education Network constitutes a quorum for the transaction of 42 business, and a majority of those members present at any meeting 43 is sufficient for any official action taken by the Network.



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1 7. The Department of Education shall provide the 2 Competency-Based Education Network with such staff as is 3 necessary to carry out the duties of the Network.

Members of the Competency-Based Education Network 4 8. serve without compensation, and travel and per diem expenses 5 6 may not be reimbursed. 7

Sec. 1.6. 1. The Department of Education shall:

(a) Conduct a public campaign to raise awareness about 8 9 *competency-based education.*

10 (b) Conduct one or more meetings with the superintendents of 11 the school districts for the purpose of increasing:

(1) Understanding of competency-based education; and

13 (2) Interest in implementing a system of competency-based 14 education.

15 To the extent that money is available for that purpose, the 2. Department of Education may, through a competitive grants 16 program, distribute any money appropriated by the 2017 17 18 Legislature to the Account for Programs for Innovation and the Prevention of Remediation created by NRS 387.1247 to carry out 19 the pilot program to provide competency-based education 20 established pursuant to section 1.2 of this act. Grants must be 21 22 awarded by the Department to schools selected to participate in the 23 program based upon money available. 24

Sec. 1.8. NRS 389.171 is hereby amended to read as follows:

25 389.171 1. A pupil may be granted credit for a specific course of study without having attended the regularly scheduled 26 27 classes in the course if the pupil demonstrates his or her proficiency 28 to meet the:

29 (a) Objectives of the course through the pupil's performance on 30 an examination prescribed by the State Board;

31 (b) Objectives of a particular area or areas of the course in 32 which the pupil is deficient through the pupil's performance on an 33 examination developed by the principal and the pupil's teacher who provides instruction in the course that is designed to measure the 34 35 proficiency of the pupil in that particular area or areas; for

36 (c) Objectives of the course through the pupil's performance on 37 an examination that the principal determines is as rigorous or more rigorous than the examination prescribed by the State Board 38 pursuant to paragraph (a), including, without limitation, an advanced 39 placement examination in the subject area of the course [+]; 40

(d) Objectives of the course through a portfolio of the pupil's 41 42 work:

43 (e) Objectives of a particular area or areas of the course 44 through the pupil's performance of a task that is designed to



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1 measure the proficiency of the pupil in that particular area or 2 areas; or (f) Objectives of the course as measured against the criteria 3 4 prescribed by the State Board pursuant to paragraph (d) of 5 subsection 2. 6 2 The State Board shall adopt regulations that prescribe the: 7 (a) Form on which a pupil may apply to the board of trustees of 8 a school district in which the pupil attends school or the governing 9 body of the charter school in which the pupil is enrolled to be 10 granted credit pursuant to subsection 1; (b) Courses of study for which pupils may be granted credit 11 12 pursuant to subsection 1; [and] 13 (c) Minimum score on the examination prescribed pursuant to 14 paragraph (a) of subsection 1 that is required to demonstrate 15 proficiency in a course **H**; and 16 (d) Criteria, other than the criteria described in paragraphs (a) 17 to (e), inclusive, of subsection 1, that may be used to determine 18 whether a pupil has achieved proficiency in a course. 19 Sec. 2. (Deleted by amendment.) Sec. 3. 20 (Deleted by amendment.) 21 Sec. 4. In addition to the report required by section 1.4 of this 22 act, the Competency-Based Education Network shall, on or before 23 April 1, 2022: 24 Complete a comprehensive report with its findings and any 1. 25 recommendations relating to competency-based education; 2. Post a copy of the report on the Internet website maintained 26 27 by the Department of Education: and 28 3. Submit a copy of the report to the Governor, the Legislative 29 Committee on Education and the Director of the Legislative Counsel 30 Bureau for transmittal to the next regular session of the Legislature. 31 Sec. 5. The provisions of subsection 1 of NRS 218D.380 do not apply to any provision of this act which adds or revises a 32 33 requirement to submit a report to the Legislature. 34 Sec. 6. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval 35 for the purposes of adopting regulations and performing any other administrative tasks that are necessary to carry out the provisions of 36 37 this act, and on July 1, 2017, for all other purposes.
