SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the Nevada Early Childhood Advisory Council. (BDR 38-862)

AN ACT relating to children; revising the membership of the Nevada Early Childhood Advisory Council; requiring the Council to annually submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law establishes the Nevada Early Childhood Advisory Council and sets forth the minimum membership of the Council, who are required to be appointed by the Governor. The Governor is authorized to appoint such additional members to the Council as the Governor determines are necessary. (NRS 432A.076) Section 1 of this bill requires that the membership of the Council include a member who is a representative of the pediatric mental, physical or behavioral health care industry. Section 1 also requires the Council to annually submit a report to the Governor and to the Legislature, which must include a summary of the activities of the Council and any recommendations for improvements to the early childhood system in this State.





THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. NRS 432A.076 is hereby amended to read as 2 follows: 3 432A.076 1. The Nevada Early Childhood Advisory Council 4 is hereby established as the state advisory council on early childhood education and care required to be established pursuant to 5 42 U.S.C. § 9837b(b)(1)(A)(i). The membership of the Council 6 7 must be appointed by the Governor and include, without limitation: (a) One member who is a representative of the Division of 8 9 Public and Behavioral Health of the Department whose duties 10 include responsibility for child care; (b) One member who is a representative of the Department of 11 12 Education: 13 (c) One member who is a representative of the Department of 14 Education whose duties include responsibilities for programs under 15 section 619 or part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education 16 Act, 20 U.S.C. §§ 1400 et seq.; 17 (d) One member who is a representative of the boards of trustees 18 of the school districts in this State: (e) One member who is a representative of the Nevada System 19 20 of Higher Education; 21 (f) One member who is a representative of local providers of 22 early childhood education and developmental services; 23 (g) One member who is a representative of Head Start agencies 24 in this State, including, without limitation, migrant and seasonal 25 Head Start programs and Indian Head Start programs; 26 (h) One member who is appointed or designated pursuant to 42 27 U.S.C. § 9837b(a)(3)(A); 28 (i) One member who is a representative of the Aging and 29 Disability Services Division of the Department; 30 (j) One member who is a representative of a nonprofit organization located in southern Nevada that provides early 31 32 childhood education programs; (k) One member who is a representative of a nonprofit 33 organization located in northern Nevada that provides early 34 35 childhood education programs; [and] 36 (1) One member who is a representative of the pediatric 37 mental, physical or behavioral health care industry; and 38 (m) Such other members as the Governor determines are 39 appropriate. The Council shall: 40 2.





(a) Work to strengthen state-level coordination and collaboration
 among the various sectors and settings of early childhood education
 programs.

4 (b) Conduct periodic statewide assessments of needs relating to 5 the quality and availability of programs and services for children 6 who are in early childhood education programs.

7 (c) Identify opportunities for and barriers to coordination and 8 collaboration among early childhood education programs funded in 9 whole or in part by the Federal Government, the State or a local 10 government.

(d) Develop recommendations for:

12 (1) Increasing the participation of children in early childhood 13 education programs funded in whole or in part by the Federal 14 Government, the State or a local government, including, without 15 limitation, providing information on such programs to 16 underrepresented and special populations;

17 (2) The establishment or improvement of core elements of 18 the early childhood system in this State, including, without 19 limitation, a statewide unified system for collecting data relating to 20 early childhood education programs;

21 (3) A statewide professional development system for 22 teachers engaged in early childhood education; and

23 (4) The establishment of statewide standards for early24 childhood education programs in this State.

(e) Assess the capacity and effectiveness of institutions of
higher education in this State in developing teachers in the field of
early childhood education.

(f) Establish, in cooperation with the State Board of Education,
 guidelines for evaluating the school readiness of children. The
 guidelines must:

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(1) Be based on national school readiness indicators;

32 33 (2) Address the following components of school readiness:

- (I) Physical and developmental health; (II) Social and emotional development;

- (III) Approaches to learning;

36 37 (IV) Language and early literacy development; and

(V) Cognition and general knowledge.

38 (g) Develop recommendations for increasing parental
 39 involvement and family engagement in early childhood education
 40 programs.

41 (h) Perform such other duties relating to early childhood 42 education programs as designated by the Governor.

43 3. On or before December 1 of each year, the Council shall 44 submit a report to the Governor and to the Director of the 45 Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Legislative





Committee on Health Care and the Legislative Committee on 1 2 Education, if the report is received during an odd-numbered year, or to the next session of the Legislature, if the report is received 3 during an even-numbered year. The report must include, without 4 limitation, a summary of the activities of the Council and any 5 recommendations for improvements to the early childhood system 6 7 in this State. 4. The Council may accept gifts, grants and donations from any 8 9 source for the support of the Council in carrying out the provisions 10 of this section.

11 **Sec. 1.5.** The provisions of subsection 1 of NRS 218D.380 do 12 not apply to any provision of this act which adds or revises a 13 requirement to submit a report to the Legislature.

14 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2019.

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
