
ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 199—COMMITTEE ON
HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

(ON BEHALF OF THE SUNSET SUBCOMMITTEE)

FEBRUARY 26, 2015

Referred to Committee on Health and Human Services

SUMMARY—Makes various changes to certain advisory committees and programs relating to health care. (BDR 38-552)

AN ACT relating to public health; abolishing certain advisory committees and bodies within the Department of Health and Human Services; revising provisions governing the State Program for Wellness and the Prevention of Chronic Disease; revising provisions governing the Medical Care Advisory Group within the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department; requiring the State Board of Health to establish a program to promote awareness of early screening for preventable or inheritable disorders; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 Existing law requires the Sunset Subcommittee of the Legislative Commission
2 to review certain boards and commissions in this State to determine whether the
3 board or commission should be terminated, modified, consolidated or continued.
4 (NRS 232B.210-232B.250) **Sections 1-3** of this bill change the name of the
5 Medical Care Advisory Group to the Medical Care Advisory Committee, and
6 extend the terms of its members from 1 year to 2 years, as recommended by the
7 Sunset Subcommittee.
8 **Section 4** of this bill transfers the requirement to raise awareness for certain
9 chronic diseases from the Advisory Committee for the Prevention and Treatment of
10 Stroke and Heart Disease to the State Program for Wellness and the Prevention of
11 Chronic Disease.



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12 **Section 6** of this bill requires the State Board of Health to establish a program
13 to promote public awareness of the importance of early screening for preventable or
14 inheritable disorders.

15 **Section 8** of this bill abolishes the Nevada Academy of Health, the Advisory
16 Committee to the Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee and the Drug Use Review
17 Board, the Advisory Committee Concerning Sickle Cell Anemia, the Advisory
18 Committee for the Prevention and Treatment of Stroke and Heart Disease and the
19 Advisory Committee on the Arthritis Prevention and Control Program, as
20 recommended by the Sunset Subcommittee.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 422.151 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 422.151 1. The Medical Care Advisory ~~{Group}~~ *Committee*
3 is hereby created within the Division.

4 2. The function of the Medical Care Advisory ~~{Group}~~
5 *Committee* is to:

6 (a) Advise the Division regarding the provision of services for
7 the health and medical care of welfare recipients.

8 (b) Participate, and increase the participation of welfare
9 recipients, in the development of policy and the administration of
10 programs by the Division.

11 **Sec. 2.** NRS 422.153 is hereby amended to read as follows:

12 422.153 1. The Medical Care Advisory ~~{Group}~~ *Committee*
13 consists of the Chief Medical Officer and:

14 (a) A person who:

15 (1) Holds a license to practice medicine in this state; and

16 (2) Is certified by the Board of Medical Examiners in a
17 medical specialty.

18 (b) A person who holds a license to practice dentistry in this
19 state.

20 (c) A person who holds a certificate of registration as a
21 pharmacist in this state.

22 (d) A member of a profession in the field of health care who is
23 familiar with the needs of persons of low income, the resources
24 required for their care and the availability of those resources.

25 (e) An administrator of a hospital or a clinic for health care.

26 (f) An administrator of a facility for intermediate care or a
27 facility for skilled nursing.

28 (g) A member of an organized group that provides assistance,
29 representation or other support to recipients of Medicaid.

30 (h) A recipient of Medicaid.

31 2. The Director shall appoint each member required by
32 ~~{paragraphs (a) to (h), inclusive, of}~~ subsection 1 to serve for a term
33 of ~~{1-year.}~~ *2 years.*



1 3. Members of the Medical Care Advisory ~~{Group}~~ *Committee*
2 serve without compensation, except that while engaged in the
3 business of the Advisory ~~{Group,}~~ *Committee*, each member is
4 entitled to receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses
5 provided for state officers and employees generally.

6 **Sec. 3.** NRS 422.155 is hereby amended to read as follows:

7 422.155 1. The Director shall appoint a Chair of the Medical
8 Care Advisory ~~{Group}~~ *Committee* from among its members.

9 2. The Administrator or the designee of the Administrator shall
10 serve as Secretary for the Medical Care Advisory ~~{Group,}~~
11 *Committee*.

12 3. The Medical Care Advisory ~~{Group,}~~ *Committee*:

13 (a) Shall meet at least once each calendar year.

14 (b) May, upon the recommendation of the Chair, form
15 subcommittees for decisions and recommendations concerning
16 specific problems within the scope of the functions of the Medical
17 Care Advisory ~~{Group,}~~ *Committee*.

18 **Sec. 4.** NRS 439.517 is hereby amended to read as follows:

19 439.517 Within the limits of available money, the Division
20 shall establish the State Program for Wellness and the Prevention of
21 Chronic Disease to increase public knowledge and raise public
22 awareness relating to wellness and chronic diseases and to educate
23 the residents of this State about:

24 1. Wellness, including, without limitation, behavioral health,
25 proper nutrition, maintaining oral health, increasing physical fitness,
26 preventing obesity and tobacco use; and

27 2. The prevention of chronic diseases, including, without
28 limitation, *arthritis*, asthma, cancer, diabetes, cardiovascular disease
29 *, stroke, heart disease* and oral disease.

30 **Sec. 5.** NRS 439B.220 is hereby amended to read as follows:

31 439B.220 The Committee may:

32 1. Review and evaluate the quality and effectiveness of
33 programs for the prevention of illness.

34 2. Review and compare the costs of medical care among
35 communities in Nevada with similar communities in other states.

36 3. Analyze the overall system of medical care in the State to
37 determine ways to coordinate the providing of services to all
38 members of society, avoid the duplication of services and achieve
39 the most efficient use of all available resources.

40 4. Examine the business of providing insurance, including the
41 development of cooperation with health maintenance organizations
42 and organizations which restrict the performance of medical
43 services to certain physicians and hospitals, and procedures to
44 contain the costs of these services.

45 5. Examine hospitals to:



- 1 (a) Increase cooperation among hospitals;
- 2 (b) Increase the use of regional medical centers; and
- 3 (c) Encourage hospitals to use medical procedures which do not
- 4 require the patient to be admitted to the hospital and to use the
- 5 resulting extra space in alternative ways.
- 6 6. Examine medical malpractice.
- 7 7. Examine the system of education to coordinate:
- 8 (a) Programs in health education, including those for the
- 9 prevention of illness and those which teach the best use of available
- 10 medical services; and
- 11 (b) The education of those who provide medical care.
- 12 8. Review competitive mechanisms to aid in the reduction of
- 13 the costs of medical care.
- 14 9. Examine the problem of providing and paying for medical
- 15 care for indigent and medically indigent persons, including medical
- 16 care provided by physicians.
- 17 10. Examine the effectiveness of any legislation enacted to
- 18 accomplish the purpose of restraining the costs of health care while
- 19 ensuring the quality of services, and its effect on the subjects listed
- 20 in subsections 1 to 9, inclusive.
- 21 11. Determine whether regulation by the State will be
- 22 necessary in the future by examining hospitals for evidence of:
- 23 (a) Degradation or discontinuation of services previously
- 24 offered, including without limitation, neonatal care, pulmonary
- 25 services and pathology services; or
- 26 (b) A change in the policy of the hospital concerning contracts,
- 27 ↪ as a result of any legislation enacted to accomplish the purpose of
- 28 restraining the costs of health care while ensuring the quality of
- 29 services.
- 30 12. Study the effect of the acuity of the care provided by a
- 31 hospital upon the revenues of the hospital and upon limitations upon
- 32 that revenue.
- 33 13. Review the actions of the Director in administering the
- 34 provisions of this chapter and adopting regulations pursuant to those
- 35 provisions. The Director shall report to the Committee concerning
- 36 any regulations proposed or adopted pursuant to this chapter.
- 37 14. Identify and evaluate, with the assistance of an advisory
- 38 group, the alternatives to institutionalization for providing long-term
- 39 care, including, without limitation:
- 40 (a) An analysis of the costs of the alternatives to
- 41 institutionalization and the costs of institutionalization for persons
- 42 receiving long-term care in this State;
- 43 (b) A determination of the effects of the various methods of
- 44 providing long-term care services on the quality of life of persons
- 45 receiving those services in this State;



1 (c) A determination of the personnel required for each method
2 of providing long-term care services in this State; and

3 (d) A determination of the methods for funding the long-term
4 care services provided to all persons who are receiving or who are
5 eligible to receive those services in this State.

6 15. Evaluate, with the assistance of an advisory group, the
7 feasibility of obtaining a waiver from the Federal Government to
8 integrate and coordinate acute care services provided through
9 Medicare and long-term care services provided through Medicaid in
10 this State.

11 16. Evaluate, with the assistance of an advisory group, the
12 feasibility of obtaining a waiver from the Federal Government to
13 eliminate the requirement that elderly persons in this State
14 impoverish themselves as a condition of receiving assistance for
15 long-term care.

16 17. Conduct investigations and hold hearings in connection
17 with its review and analysis and exercise any of the investigative
18 powers set forth in NRS 218E.105 to 218E.140, inclusive.

19 18. Apply for any available grants and accept any gifts, grants
20 or donations to aid the Committee in carrying out its duties pursuant
21 to this chapter.

22 19. Direct the Legislative Counsel Bureau to assist in its
23 research, investigations, review and analysis.

24 20. Recommend to the Legislature as a result of its review any
25 appropriate legislation.

26 ~~21. Prescribe duties and make requests, in addition to those set~~
27 ~~forth in NRS 439B.250, of the Nevada Academy of Health~~
28 ~~established pursuant to that section.~~

29 **Sec. 6.** NRS 442.008 is hereby amended to read as follows:

30 442.008 1. The State Board of Health, upon the
31 recommendation of the Chief Medical Officer:

32 (a) *Shall establish a program to promote public awareness of*
33 *the importance of early screening for preventable or inheritable*
34 *disorders, including, without limitation, sickle cell anemia;*

35 (b) Shall adopt regulations governing examinations and tests
36 required for the discovery in infants of preventable or inheritable
37 disorders, including tests for the presence of sickle cell anemia; and

38 ~~(b)~~ (c) May require the Division to provide for the services of
39 a laboratory in accordance with NRS 442.009 to determine the
40 presence of certain preventable or inheritable disorders in an infant
41 pursuant to this section.

42 2. Any physician, midwife, nurse, obstetric center or hospital
43 of any nature attending or assisting in any way any infant, or the
44 mother of any infant, at childbirth shall make or cause to be made an
45 examination of the infant, including standard tests, to the extent



1 required by regulations of the State Board of Health as is necessary
2 for the discovery of conditions indicating such disorders.

3 3. If the examination and tests reveal the existence of such
4 conditions in an infant, the physician, midwife, nurse, obstetric
5 center or hospital attending or assisting at the birth of the infant
6 shall immediately:

7 (a) Report the condition to the Chief Medical Officer or the
8 representative of the Chief Medical Officer, the local health officer
9 of the county or city within which the infant or the mother of the
10 infant resides, and the local health officer of the county or city in
11 which the child is born; and

12 (b) Discuss the condition with the parent, parents or other
13 persons responsible for the care of the infant and inform them of the
14 treatment necessary for the amelioration of the condition.

15 4. An infant is exempt from examination and testing if either
16 parent files a written objection with the person or institution
17 responsible for making the examination or tests.

18 **Sec. 7.** 1. The amendment to NRS 422.153 in section 2 of
19 this act which extends the term of members of the Medical Care
20 Advisory Committee applies only to any appointment made on or
21 after July 1, 2015.

22 2. As soon as practicable after July 1, 2015, the Director of the
23 Department of Health and Human Services shall appoint to the
24 Medical Care Advisory Committee the members required by
25 subsection 1 of NRS 422.153, as amended by section 2 of this act.

26 3. In making the initial appointments described in subsection 2,
27 the Director shall appoint members to staggered terms of 1 and 2
28 years.

29 **Sec. 8.** NRS 422.4055, 439.491, 439.4911, 439.4913,
30 439.4915, 439.4917, 439.4919, 439.492, 439.493, 439.494, 439.503,
31 439B.250 and 442.118, are hereby repealed.

32 **Sec. 9.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2015.
