### ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 226-ASSEMBLYMAN ROBERTS

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to peace officers. (BDR 23-148)

AN ACT relating to peace officers; revising the membership of the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Existing law creates the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission consisting of 9 members appointed by the Governor and sets forth the powers and duties of the Commission relating to the training and education of persons whose primary duty is law enforcement. (NRS 289.500, 289.510) The Commission is required under existing law to appoint an Executive Director. (NRS 289.520) This bill revises the membership of the Commission to: (1) reduce the number of members from counties other than Clark and Washoe from three members to two members; and (2) add one member who is a mental health professional.

# THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** NRS 289.500 is hereby amended to read as follows: 289.500 1. The Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission, consisting of nine members appointed by the Governor, is hereby created. The Governor shall appoint:

- (a) Two members from Clark County, one of whom must be from a metropolitan police department created pursuant to chapter 280 of NRS if one exists in Clark County;
  - (b) One member from Washoe County;
- (c) [Three] Two members from counties other than Clark and Washoe Counties;

- (d) One member from a state law enforcement agency that primarily employs peace officers required to receive training as category I peace officers;
  - (e) One member who is a category II peace officer; [and]
  - (f) One member who is a category III peace officer [...]; and
  - (g) One member who is a mental health professional.
- 2. Members of the Commission serve terms of 2 years. Members serve without compensation, but are entitled to the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided for state officers and employees generally.
- 3. The Governor shall make the appointments to the Commission from recommendations submitted by Clark County, Washoe County, professional organizations of sheriffs and police chiefs of this State and employee organizations that represent only peace officers of this State who are certified by the Commission.
