ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 231–ASSEMBLYWOMEN COHEN AND KRASNER

MARCH 11, 2021

Referred to Committee on Education

SUMMARY-Revises provisions governing education on the Holocaust and other genocides. (BDR 34-97)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets for its material is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to education; establishing the Account for Instruction on the Holocaust and Other Genocides in the State General Fund; authorizing the Council to Establish Academic Standards for Public Schools to establish standards of content and performance for instruction on the Holocaust and other genocides; imposing certain additional duties on the Governor's Advisory Council on Education Relating to the Holocaust; requiring the State Board of Education to appoint a subcommittee to conduct an interim study on providing curriculum on the Holocaust and other genocides; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law creates and sets forth the duties of the Governor's Advisory 123456789 Council on Education Relating to the Holocaust. (NRS 233G.020, 233G.040) Section 4 of this bill imposes additional duties on the Council relating to the provision of education in this State on issues relating to the Holocaust and other genocides.

Section 1 of this bill establishes the Account for Instruction on the Holocaust and Other Genocides in the State General Fund and requires that the money in the Account be expended only for the purpose of providing instruction on the Holocaust and other genocides.

10 Section 5 of this bill requires the State Board of Education to appoint a 11 subcommittee to study curriculum on instruction on the Holocaust and other 12 13 genocides during the 2021-2022 interim. Existing law creates the Council to Establish Academic Standards for Public Schools. (NRS 389.510) Section 2 of this 14 bill authorizes the Council to establish standards of content and performance for





15 instruction on the Holocaust and other genocides. Section 3 of this bill makes a

- 16 conforming change to indicate the placement of section 2 in the Nevada Revised
- 17 Statutes.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 388 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

1. The Account for Instruction on the Holocaust and Other 3 Genocides is hereby created in the State General Fund, to be 4 administered by the Superintendent of Public Instruction. The 5 Superintendent of Public Instruction may accept gifts and grants 6 of money from any source for deposit in the Account. Any money 7 from gifts and grants may be expended in accordance with the 8 9 terms and conditions of the gift or grant, or in accordance with 10 subsection 2. The interest and income earned on the sum of the money in the Account and any unexpended appropriations made 11 to the Account from the State General Fund must be credited to 12 13 the Account. Any money remaining in the Account at the end of the fiscal year does not revert to the State General Fund, and the 14 15 balance in the Account must be carried forward to the next fiscal 16 vear.

17 2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 1, the money in 18 the Account must be used only for providing instruction on the 19 Holocaust and other genocides as may be required by section 2 of 20 this act. The State Board shall adopt regulations governing the 21 distribution of money in the Account for this purpose.

22 Sec. 2. Chapter 389 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 23 thereto a new section to read as follows:

24 1. The Council may establish standards of content and 25 performance for instruction on the Holocaust and other 26 genocides.

27 2. If the Council establishes standards of content and 28 performance for instruction on the Holocaust and other 29 genocides, the board of trustees of a school district and the 30 governing body of a charter school shall provide instruction on the 31 Holocaust and other genocides that complies with the standards of 32 content and performance established by the Council pursuant to 33 this section.

34 3. If the Council establishes standards of content and 35 performance for instruction on the Holocaust and other 36 genocides, the Department shall:





(a) Provide technical assistance to the board of trustees of a 1 school district or the governing body of a charter school that 2 3 offers instruction on the Holocaust and other genocides;

(b) Distribute information and resources on appropriate 4 5 materials or other resources for instruction on the Holocaust and other genocides to the board of trustees of a school district or the 6 7 governing body of a charter school that offers instruction on the 8 Holocaust and other genocides; and

9 (c) Provide training programs, which may include, without 10 limitation, training programs identified pursuant to NRS 11 233G.040, on providing instruction on the Holocaust and other 12 genocides for school personnel who administer instruction on the 13 Holocaust and other genocides.

The governing body of a private school may request 14 4. information on the technical assistance, information and 15 resources or training programs required to be developed pursuant 16 17 to subsection 3 from the Department. The Department may 18 provide such information to a governing body of a private school 19 that requests the information.

20 5. The State Board may adopt such regulations as necessary 21 to carry out the provisions of this section. 22

6. As used in this section:

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23 (a) "Genocide" means acts committed with the intent to 24 destroy, in whole or in part, a national ethnic, racial or religious group, including, without limitation: 25

(1) Killing members of the group;

27 (2) Causing serious bodily or mental harm to members of 28 the group;

29 (3) Deliberately inflicting conditions on the group 30 calculated to bring about the physical destruction of the group, in 31 whole or in part;

32 (4) Imposing measures intended to prevent births within the 33 group; or

(5) Forcibly transferring children of the group to another 34 35 group.

(b) "Holocaust" means the systematic, bureaucratic, state-36 sponsored persecution and murder of approximately 6 million 37 Jewish persons and 5 million other persons by the Nazi regime 38 and its collaborators between 1933-1945. 39

40 **Sec. 3.** NRS 389.500 is hereby amended to read as follows:

41 389.500 As used in NRS 389.500 to 389.540, inclusive, *and* 42 section 2 of this act, "Council" means the Council to Establish 43 Academic Standards for Public Schools.

44 **Sec. 4.** NRS 233G.040 is hereby amended to read as follows: 45 233G.040 The Council shall:



1 1. Consult with an organization with expertise in providing 2 instruction relating to the Holocaust and other genocides to 3 identify strategies and content for providing and enhancing 4 education in issues relating to the Holocaust and other genocides 5 in this State.

2. Develop programs for the education of children and adults in
issues relating to the Holocaust [,] and other genocides, make
reports and advise public and private bodies throughout the State on
matters relevant to education concerning the Holocaust [.] and other
genocides.

11 [2.] 3. Advise the Superintendent of Public Instruction, the 12 board of trustees of school districts, the governing bodies of 13 charter schools and the governing bodies of private schools on 14 strategies and content for providing and enhancing education in 15 issues relating to the Holocaust and other genocides in this State.

16 4. Identify programs and resources to train teachers in 17 providing education in issues relating to the Holocaust and other 18 genocides.

19 5. Promote the implementation of education in issues relating 20 to the Holocaust and other genocides in this State.

6. Develop programs to raise money for the use of the Council in carrying out its duties. Any money raised by the Council pursuant to this subsection must be accounted for separately in the State General Fund and is authorized for expenditure by the Council in carrying out its duties.

26 7. On or before February 1 of each year, submit a report on 27 the status of education in issues relating to the Holocaust and 28 other genocides in this State to:

(a) In odd-numbered years, the Director of the Legislative
 Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the next regular session of the
 Legislature; and

32 (b) In even-numbered years, the Legislative Committee on 33 Education.

Sec. 5. 1. The State Board of Education shall appoint a subcommittee to study the manner in which instruction on the Holocaust and other genocides is currently offered by public schools within this State.

2. The study conducted by the subcommittee pursuant to thissection must include, without limitation:

40 (a) The number of school districts, public schools and charter
41 schools that offer instruction in this State on the Holocaust and other
42 genocides;

43 (b) The number of school districts, public schools and charter 44 schools that use the technical assistance, information and resources





or training programs required to be developed by the Department of
 Education pursuant to section 2 of this act;

3 (c) A description of the manner in which school districts, public 4 schools and charter schools that offer instruction on the Holocaust 5 and other genocides conduct such instruction including, without 6 limitation, the number of hours provided in the instruction, the grade 7 levels in which the instruction is provided and the subject area 8 within which the instruction is provided; and

9 (d) Recommendations for the content of curriculum for 10 instruction on the Holocaust and other genocides, which must, 11 without limitation:

12 (1) Prepare students to confront the immorality of the 13 Holocaust, other genocides and other acts of mass violence and to 14 reflect on the causes of related historical events;

15 (2) Address the breadth of the history of the Holocaust, 16 including, without limitation, the dictatorship of the Third Reich, the 17 system of concentration camps, persecution of both Jewish and non-18 Jewish people, resistance to the Third Reich and the Holocaust by 19 both Jewish and non-Jewish people and trials that occurred after the 20 end of World War II;

(3) Develop the respect of pupils for cultural diversity and
 help pupils gain insight into the importance of the protection of
 international human rights for all people;

(4) Promote the understanding of pupils of how the
Holocaust contributed to the need for the term "genocide" and led to
international legislation that recognized genocide as a crime;

(5) Communicate the impact of personal responsibility, civic
 engagement and societal responses;

29 (6) Stimulate the reflection of pupils on the roles and 30 responsibilities of citizens in democratic societies to combat 31 misinformation, indifference and discrimination through 32 development of critical thinking skills and through tools of 33 resistance such as protest, reform and celebration;

(7) Provide pupils with opportunities to contextualize and
analyze patterns of human behavior by individual persons and
groups who belong in one or more categories, including, without
limitation, perpetrator, collaborator, bystander, victim and rescuer;

38 (8) Enable pupils to understand the ramifications of 39 prejudice, racism and stereotyping;

40 (9) Preserve the memories of survivors of genocide and 41 provide opportunities for pupils to discuss and honor the cultural 42 legacies of survivors;

43 (10) Provide pupils with a foundation for examining the 44 history of discrimination in this State;





1 (11) Include the use of personal narratives and multimedia 2 primary source materials, which may include, without limitation, 3 video testimony, photographs, artwork, diary entries, letters, 4 government documents, maps and poems; and

5 (12) Explore the various mechanisms of transitional and 6 restorative justice that help humanity move forward in the aftermath 7 of genocide.

3. The subcommittee must be composed of:

9 (a) The Superintendent of Public Instruction, or his or her 10 designee;

(b) Three members representing the Governor's Advisory
Council on Education Relating to the Holocaust created pursuant to
NRS 233G.020;

14 (c) Three members representing nonprofit organizations that 15 have developed curriculum regarding the Holocaust or other 16 genocides for use in public schools;

17 (d) At least one member representing a school district in a 18 county whose population is 700,000 or more;

19 (e) At least one member representing a school district in a 20 county whose population is less than 700,000; and

21 (f) At least one member representing a charter school located in 22 this State.

4. The subcommittee created pursuant to subsection 1 shall submit any recommendations for the curriculum content to provide instruction on the Holocaust and other genocides developed by the subcommittee pursuant to paragraph (d) of subsection 2 to the Council to Establish Academic Standards for Public Schools.

28 5. The subcommittee created pursuant to subsection 1 shall 29 report its findings to the State Board of Education on or before 30 April 8, 2022. The State Board of Education shall, on or before August 1, 2022, submit a report to the Legislative Committee on 31 32 Education which includes its recommendations to carry out the 33 instruction described in subsection 1, as well as any actions the State 34 Board has taken or intends to take to include the instruction in the 35 relevant courses.

The Legislative Committee on Education shall consider the 36 6. 37 report submitted by the State Board of Education and, on or before December 1, 2022, prepare and submit a written report to the 38 Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau, for transmittal to 39 the 82nd Session of the Nevada Legislature, concerning the 40 41 Committee's consideration of the matters described in this section 42 and any recommendations for legislation to ensure the instruction 43 described in subsection 1 is included in the curriculum for the 44 relevant courses.



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1 **Sec. 6.** The provisions of subsection 1 of NRS 218D.380 do 2 not apply to any provision of this act which adds or revises a 3 requirement to submit a report to the Legislature.

4 Sec. 7. 1. This section and sections 5 and 6 of this act 5 become effective upon passage and approval.

- 6 2. Sections 1 to 4, inclusive, of this act become effective:
- 7 (a) Upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting any 8 regulations and performing any other preparatory administrative
- 9 tasks that are necessary to carry out the provisions of this act; and
- 10 (b) On July 1, 2022, for all other purposes.

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
