ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 283-ASSEMBLYMEN DALY, HEALEY; BENITEZ-THOMPSON, CARRILLO, NEAL, PIERCE AND SPRINKLE

MARCH 15, 2013

Referred to Committee on Government Affairs

SUMMARY-Makes various changes to provisions governing bidding for public works. (BDR 28-658)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State: No.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets {omitted material} is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public works; extending the authority for the Department of Transportation to contract with a construction manager at risk for the construction, reconstruction, improvement and maintenance of highways on and after July 1, 2013; amending certain requirements governing contractors involved in public works; amending certain requirements governing bidding for public works when a public body decides to contract with a construction manager at risk; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires a person who serves as a contractor on a public work to 1 be licensed. (NRS 338.010) Section 2 of this bill limits that requirement so that a person who performs work that does not otherwise require licensure is not required to be licensed to provide services on a public work.

2345678 Existing law requires certain prime contractors who submit bids for a public work to include with the bid a list that discloses the first tier subcontractors who will perform a certain portion of the work on the public work. (NRS 338.141) Section 6 of this bill amends the provisions prescribing which subcontractors must ğ be named on the list. Section 6 also requires the prime contractor to include on the 10 list: (1) a description of the labor or portion of the work that the prime contractor 11 will perform; or (2) a statement that the prime contractor will perform all work 12 other than that being performed by a subcontractor named on the list.

13 Existing law allows a public body to contract with a construction manager at risk, which is a construction manager who is required to construct a public work 14 within a guaranteed maximum price, a fixed price or a fixed price plus reimbursement for certain costs. (NRS 338.169, 338.1696) Section 8 of this bill 15 16





17 requires a proposal for a construction manager at risk to include an explanation of 18 the experience that the applicant has as a construction manager at risk. Section 10 19 of this bill requires a construction manager at risk who has entered into a contract with a public body for services related to construction that are provided before actual construction begins to provide to the public body, before entering into a contract for construction of the public work, a list of the labor or portions of the work which are estimated by the construction manager at risk to exceed a certain percentage of the estimated cost of the public work.

20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 4 35 36 37 38 Existing law requires a public body to appoint a panel of at least three persons, with at least two having experience in the construction industry, to rank proposals and interview the top applicants for a public work. (NRS 338.1693) Section 9 of this bill limits such a panel to seven members and requires that a majority of the panel have experience in the construction industry. Section 9 also authorizes the public body to appoint another panel, similarly comprised, to interview the top applicants.

Section 11 of this bill provides that if a public work involves predominantly horizontal construction, a construction manager at risk who enters into a contract for the construction of the public work shall perform construction work equal in value to at least 25 percent of the estimated cost of construction himself or herself, or using his or her own employees. Section 2 of this bill defines the term "horizontal construction."

Sections 12 and 13 of this bill modify requirements governing the procedure 39 that a construction manager at risk is required to use when selecting and contracting 40 with subcontractors.

41 Under existing law, the Department of Transportation may award a contract for 42 the construction, reconstruction, improvement and maintenance of a highway to a 43 construction manager at risk on or before June 30, 2013. Section 5 of this bill 44 authorizes the Department of Transportation to contract with a construction 45 manager at risk for the construction, reconstruction, improvement and maintenance 46 of highways on and after July 1, 2013.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 338 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 1 2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

The Legislature hereby declares that the provisions of this section and NRS 338.169 to 338.16995, inclusive, relating to 3 4 5 contracts involving construction managers at risk, are intended to promote public confidence and trust in the contracting and 6 bidding procedures for public works established therein and, for 7 8 the benefit of the public, to promote the philosophy of obtaining 9 the best possible value as compared to low-bid contracting.

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Sec. 2. NRS 338.010 is hereby amended to read as follows:

338.010 As used in this chapter:

1. "Authorized representative" means a person designated by a 12 public body to be responsible for the development, solicitation, 13 14 award or administration of contracts for public works pursuant to this chapter. 15





1 2. "Contract" means a written contract entered into between a 2 contractor and a public body for the provision of labor, materials, 3 equipment or supplies for a public work. "Contractor" means: 4 3. 5 (a) A person who fisl: 6 (1) Is licensed pursuant to the provisions of chapter 624 of 7 NRS [.]; or 8 (2) Performs such work that the person is not required to be licensed pursuant to the provisions of chapter 624 of NRS; or 9 10 (b) A design-build team. "Day labor" means all cases where public bodies, their 11 officers, agents or employees, hire, supervise and pay the wages 12 13 thereof directly to a worker or workers employed by them on public 14 works by the day and not under a contract in writing. "Design-build contract" means a contract between a public 15 5 16 body and a design-build team in which the design-build team agrees 17 to design and construct a public work. 18 6 "Design-build team" means an entity that consists of: 19 (a) At least one person who is licensed as a general engineering 20 contractor or a general building contractor pursuant to chapter 624

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(b) For a public work that consists of:

(1) A building and its site, at least one person who holds a
 certificate of registration to practice architecture pursuant to chapter
 623 of NRS.

(2) Anything other than a building and its site, at least one
person who holds a certificate of registration to practice architecture
pursuant to chapter 623 of NRS or landscape architecture pursuant
to chapter 623A of NRS or who is licensed as a professional
engineer pursuant to chapter 625 of NRS.

7. "Design professional" means:

(a) A person who is licensed as a professional engineer pursuant
 to chapter 625 of NRS;

(b) A person who is licensed as a professional land surveyor
 pursuant to chapter 625 of NRS;

(c) A person who holds a certificate of registration to engage in
the practice of architecture, interior design or residential design
pursuant to chapter 623 of NRS;

(d) A person who holds a certificate of registration to engage in
 the practice of landscape architecture pursuant to chapter 623A of
 NRS; or

42 (e) A business entity that engages in the practice of professional 43 engineering, land surveying, architecture or landscape architecture.

44 8. "Division" means the State Public Works Division of the 45 Department of Administration.





9. "Eligible bidder" means a person who is:

2 (a) Found to be a responsible and responsive contractor by a 3 local government or its authorized representative which requests 4 bids for a public work in accordance with paragraph (b) of 5 subsection 1 of NRS 338.1373; or

6 (b) Determined by a public body or its authorized representative 7 which awarded a contract for a public work pursuant to NRS 8 338.1375 to 338.139, inclusive, to be qualified to bid on that 9 contract pursuant to NRS 338.1379 or 338.1382.

10 10. "General contractor" means a person who is licensed to 11 conduct business in one, or both, of the following branches of the 12 contracting business:

(a) General engineering contracting, as described in subsection 2of NRS 624.215.

(b) General building contracting, as described in subsection 3 ofNRS 624.215.

11. "Governing body" means the board, council, commission
or other body in which the general legislative and fiscal powers of a
local government are vested.

"Horizontal construction" means the construction of any 20 12. 21 fixed work, including any irrigation, drainage, water supply, flood 22 control, harbor, railroad, highway, tunnel, airport or airway, sewer or sewage disposal system, bridge, inland waterway, pipeline 23 for the transmission of petroleum or any other liquid or gaseous 24 25 substance, pier, and work incidental thereto. The term does not include vertical construction, the construction of any terminal or 26 27 other building of an airport or airway, or the construction of any 28 sewage plant, pump, transfer station or other building.

29 "Local government" means every political subdivision or *13*. 30 other entity which has the right to levy or receive money from ad 31 valorem or other taxes or any mandatory assessments, and includes, without limitation, counties, cities, towns, boards, school districts 32 33 and other districts organized pursuant to chapters 244A, 309, 318, 379, 474, 538, 541, 543 and 555 of NRS, NRS 450.550 to 450.750, 34 35 inclusive, and any agency or department of a county or city which prepares a budget separate from that of the parent political 36 subdivision. The term includes a person who has been designated by 37 38 the governing body of a local government to serve as its authorized 39 representative.

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[13.] 14. "Offense" means failing to:

(a) Pay the prevailing wage required pursuant to this chapter;

42 (b) Pay the contributions for unemployment compensation 43 required pursuant to chapter 612 of NRS;

44 (c) Provide and secure compensation for employees required
 45 pursuant to chapters 616A to 617, inclusive, of NRS; or

"Prime contractor" means a contractor who: 2 3 (a) Contracts to construct an entire project; (b) Coordinates all work performed on the entire project; 4 (c) Uses his or her own workforce to perform all or a part of the 5 6 public work: and 7 (d) Contracts for the services of any subcontractor independent contractor or is responsible for payment to any 8 contracted subcontractors or independent contractors. 9 → The term includes, without limitation, a general contractor or a 10 specialty contractor who is authorized to bid on a project pursuant to 11 12 NRS 338.139 or 338.148. 13 [15.] 16. "Public body" means the State, county, city, town, 14 school district or any public agency of this State or its political 15 subdivisions sponsoring or financing a public work. [16.] 17. "Public work" means any project for the new 16 17 construction, repair or reconstruction of: (a) A project financed in whole or in part from public money 18 19 for: 20 (1) Public buildings; 21 (2) Jails and prisons; 22 (3) Public roads: (4) Public highways; 23 (5) Public streets and alleys; 24 25 (6) Public utilities: (7) Publicly owned water mains and sewers; 26 27 (8) Public parks and playgrounds; (9) Public convention facilities which are financed at least in 28 29 part with public money; and (10) All other publicly owned works and property. 30 (b) A building for the Nevada System of Higher Education of 31 32 which 25 percent or more of the costs of the building as a whole are paid from money appropriated by this State or from federal money. 33 "Specialty contractor" means a person who is 34 [17.] **18**. licensed to conduct business as described in subsection 4 of 35 NRS 624.215. 36 "Stand-alone underground utility project" means an 37 [18.] **19**. underground utility project that is not integrated into a larger 38 39 project, including, without limitation: (a) An underground sewer line or an underground pipeline for 40 the conveyance of water, including facilities appurtenant thereto; 41 42 and 43 (b) A project for the construction or installation of a storm drain, 44 including facilities appurtenant thereto,

1 \rightarrow that is not located at the site of a public work for the design and 2 construction of which a public body is authorized to contract with a 3 design-build team pursuant to subsection 2 of NRS 338.1711.

"Subcontract" means a written contract entered into 4 [19.] **20**. 5 between.

(a) A contractor and a subcontractor or supplier; or

(b) A subcontractor and another subcontractor or supplier,

→ for the provision of labor, materials, equipment or supplies for a 8 9 construction project.

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> "Subcontractor" means a person who: [20.] 21.

(a) Is licensed pursuant to the provisions of chapter 624 of NRS 11 or performs such work that the person is not required to be licensed 12 13 pursuant to chapter 624 of NRS; and

14 (b) Contracts with a contractor, another subcontractor or a 15 supplier to provide labor, materials or services for a construction 16 project.

17 "Supplier" means a person who provides materials, [21.] 22. 18 equipment or supplies for a construction project.

19 "Vertical construction" means the construction or 23. 20 remodeling of any building, structure or other improvement that is predominantly vertical, including, without limitation, a building, 21 22 structure or improvement for the support, shelter and enclosure of persons, animals, chattels or movable property of any kind, and 23 any improvement appurtenant thereto. 24

25 26 **122.1 24.** "Wages" means:

(a) The basic hourly rate of pay; and

(b) The amount of pension, health and welfare, vacation and 27 holiday pay, the cost of apprenticeship training or other similar 28 29 programs or other bona fide fringe benefits which are a benefit to 30 the worker.

"Worker" means a skilled mechanic, skilled worker, 31 [23.] 25. 32 semiskilled mechanic, semiskilled worker or unskilled worker in the service of a contractor or subcontractor under any appointment or 33 contract of hire or apprenticeship, express or implied, oral or 34 35 written, whether lawfully or unlawfully employed. The term does not include a design professional. 36

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Sec. 3. NRS 338.018 is hereby amended to read as follows:

38 338.018 The provisions of NRS 338.013 to 338.018, inclusive, apply to any contract for construction work of the Nevada System of 39 Higher Education for which the estimated cost exceeds \$100,000 40 41 even if the construction work does not qualify as a public work, as 42 defined in subsection [16] 17 of NRS 338.010. 43

Sec. 4. NRS 338.075 is hereby amended to read as follows:

44 338.075 The provisions of NRS 338.020 to 338.090, inclusive, 45 apply to any contract for construction work of the Nevada System of





1 Higher Education for which the estimated cost exceeds \$100,000 2 even if the construction work does not qualify as a public work, as 3 defined in subsection [16] 17 of NRS 338.010.

Sec. 5. NRS 338.1373 is hereby amended to read as follows:

5 338.1373 1. A local government or its authorized 6 representative shall award a contract for a public work pursuant to 7 the provisions of NRS 338.1415 and:

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(a) NRS 338.1377 to 338.139, inclusive;

(b) NRS 338.143 to 338.148, inclusive;

(c) NRS 338.169 to 338.16995, inclusive [;], and section 1 of 10 11 this act: or 12

(d) NRS 338.1711 to 338.173, inclusive.

13 2. 25 (a) If the public body provides a list of the labor or portions of 26 the public work which are estimated by the public body to exceed 3 percent of the estimated cost of the public work, the name of each 27 first tier subcontractor who will provide such labor or portion of the 28 29 work on the public work which is estimated to exceed 3 percent of 30 the estimated cost of the public work; or

31 (b) If the public body does not provide a list of the labor or 32 portions of the public work which are estimated by the public body 33 to exceed 3 percent of the estimated cost of the public work, the name of each first tier subcontractor who will provide labor or a 34 35 portion of the work on the public work to the prime contractor for 36 which the first tier subcontractor will be paid an amount exceeding 5 percent of the prime contractor's total bid. 1 (2) If any one of the contractors who submitted one of the 2 three lowest bids will employ a first tier subcontractor who will 3 provide labor or a portion of the work on the public work to the 4 prime contractor for which the first tier subcontractor will not be 5 paid an amount exceeding \$250,000, the name of each first tier 6 subcontractor who will provide labor or a portion of the work on 7 the public work to the prime contractor for which the first tier 8 subcontractor will be paid 1 percent of the prime contractor's total 9 bid or \$50,000, whichever is greater. 10 (3) For each first tier subcontractor whose name is listed 11 pursuant to subparagraph (1) or (2), the number of the license 12 issued to the first tier subcontractor pursuant to chapter 624 of NRS.

2. The lists required by subsection 1 must include a description of the labor or portion of the work which each first tier subcontractor named in the list will provide to the prime contractor.

3. A prime contractor shall include his or her name on a list required by paragraph (a) or (b) of subsection 1. [if, as the prime contractor,] If the prime contractor will perform any [of the] work [required to be] which is more than 1 percent of the prime contractor's total bid and which is not being performed by a subcontractor listed pursuant to paragraph (a) or (b) of subsection 1 [1], the prime contractor shall also include on the list:

(a) A description of the labor or portion of the work that the
 prime contractor will perform; or

25 (b) A statement that the prime contractor will perform all work 26 other than that being performed by a subcontractor listed 27 pursuant to paragraph (a) or (b) of subsection 1.

42 5. A prime contractor shall not substitute a subcontractor for 43 any subcontractor who is named in the bid, unless:





1 (a) The public body or its authorized representative objects to the subcontractor, requests in writing a change in the subcontractor 2 and pays any increase in costs resulting from the change. 3

(b) The substitution is approved by the public body or its 4 5 authorized representative. The substitution must be approved if the 6 public body or its authorized representative determines that:

7 (1) The named subcontractor, after having a reasonable 8 opportunity, fails or refuses to execute a written contract with the 9 contractor which was offered to the named subcontractor with the 10 same general terms that all other subcontractors on the project were offered; 11

12 (2) The named subcontractor files for bankruptcy or becomes 13 insolvent;

14 (3) The named subcontractor fails or refuses to perform his 15 or her subcontract within a reasonable time or is unable to furnish a 16 performance bond and payment bond pursuant to NRS 339.025; or

17 (4) The named subcontractor is not properly licensed to 18 provide that labor or portion of the work.

19 (c) If the public body awarding the contract is a governing body, the public body or its authorized representative, in awarding the 20 21 contract pursuant to NRS 338.1375 to 338.139, inclusive:

22 (1) Applies such criteria set forth in NRS 338.1377 as are 23 appropriate for subcontractors and determines that the subcontractor 24 does not meet that criteria; and 25

(2) Requests in writing a substitution of the subcontractor.

6. If a prime contractor substitutes a subcontractor for any 26 27 subcontractor who is named in the bid without complying with the 28 provisions of subsection 5, the prime contractor shall forfeit, as a 29 penalty to the public body that awarded the contract, an amount 30 equal to 1 percent of the total amount of the contract.

31 7. If a prime contractor, *findicated pursuant to subsection* 3 that he or she would perform a portion of work on the public work 32 and, after the submission of the bid, substitutes a subcontractor to 33 perform [such work,] the work indicated pursuant to subsection 3 34 that the prime contractor would perform, the prime contractor shall 35 forfeit as a penalty to the public body that awarded the contract, the 36 lesser of, and excluding any amount of the contract that is 37 38 attributable to change orders:

1 (a) "First tier subcontractor" means a subcontractor who 2 contracts directly with a prime contractor to provide labor, materials 3 or services for a construction project.

(b) "General terms" means the terms and conditions of a 4 contract that set the basic requirements for a public work and apply 5 6 without regard to the particular trade or specialty of a subcontractor, 7 but does not include any provision that controls or relates to the specific portion of the public work that will be completed by a 8 9 subcontractor, including, without limitation, the materials to be used 10 by the subcontractor or other details of the work to be performed by 11 the subcontractor

12 13 **Sec.** 7. (Deleted by amendment.)

Sec. 8. NRS 338.1692 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 338.1692 1. A public body or its authorized representative 15 shall advertise for proposals for a construction manager at risk in a 16 newspaper qualified pursuant to chapter 238 of NRS that is 17 published in the county where the public work will be performed. If 18 no qualified newspaper is published in the county where the public 19 work will be performed, the required advertisement must be 20 published in some qualified newspaper that is printed in the State of Nevada and has a general circulation in the county. 21

22 2. A request for proposals published pursuant to subsection 1 23 must include, without limitation:

24 25 (a) A description of the public work;(b) An estimate of the cost of construction;

(c) A description of the work that the public body expects a
 (c) A description of the work that the public body expects a
 construction manager at risk to perform;

(d) The dates on which it is anticipated that the separate phases
of the preconstruction and construction of the public work will
begin and end;

(e) The date by which proposals must be submitted to the publicbody;

(f) If the project is a public work of the State, a statement setting
forth that the construction manager at risk must be qualified to bid
on a public work of the State pursuant to NRS 338.1379 before
submitting a proposal;

(g) The name, title, address and telephone number of a person
employed by the public body that an applicant may contact for
further information regarding the public work;

40 (h) A list of the selection criteria and relative weight of the 41 selection criteria that will be used to evaluate proposals; and

(i) A notice that the proposed form of the contract to assist in the
preconstruction of the public work or to construct the public work,
including, without limitation, the terms and general conditions of the
contract, is available from the public body.





A proposal must include, without limitation: 3.

2 (a) An explanation of the experience that the applicant has with 3 projects of similar size and scope in both the public and private sectors, including, without limitation, an explanation of the 4 5 experience that the applicant has in assisting in the design of such 6 projects and an explanation of the experience that the applicant has 7 in such projects in Nevada;

8 (b) An explanation of the experience that the applicant has as 9 a construction manager at risk;

10 (c) The contact information for references who have knowledge 11 of the background, character and technical competence of the 12 applicant;

13 (c) Evidence of the ability of the applicant to obtain the 14 necessary bonding for the work to be required by the public body;

15 (d) (e) Evidence that the applicant has obtained or has the 16 ability to obtain such insurance as may be required by law;

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((e) A statement of whether the applicant has been:

18 (1) Found liable for breach of contract with respect to a previous project, other than a breach for legitimate cause, during the 19 20 5 years immediately preceding the date of the advertisement for 21 proposals; and

22 (2) Disqualified from being awarded a contract pursuant to NRS 338.017, 338.13895, 338.1475 or 408.333; 23

24 (f) (g) The professional qualifications and experience of the 25 applicant, including, without limitation, the resume of any employee 26 of the applicant who will be managing the preconstruction and 27 construction of the public work;

28 (g) (h) The safety programs established and the safety records 29 accumulated by the applicant;

30 (h) Evidence that the applicant is licensed as a contractor 31 pursuant to chapter 624 of NRS;

(i) The proposed plan of the applicant to manage the 32 33 preconstruction and construction of the public work which sets forth in detail the ability of the applicant to provide preconstruction 34 35 services and to construct the public work **[]** and *which includes, if* 36 the public work involves predominantly horizontal construction, a 37 statement that the applicant will perform construction work equal 38 in value to at least 25 percent of the estimated cost of construction;

40 (i) If the project is for the design of a public work of the 41 State, evidence that the applicant is qualified to bid on a public work of the State pursuant to NRS 338.1379. 42 43

Sec. 9. NRS 338.1693 is hereby amended to read as follows:

44 338.1693 1. The public body or its authorized representative 45 shall appoint a panel consisting of at least three *but not more than*





seven members, [at least two] a majority of whom must have
 experience in the construction industry, to rank the proposals
 submitted to the public body by evaluating the proposals as required
 pursuant to subsections 2 and 3.

5 2. The panel *appointed pursuant to subsection 1* shall rank the 6 proposals by:

7 (a) Verifying that each applicant satisfies the requirements of 8 NRS 338.1691; and

9 (b) Evaluating and assigning a score to each of the proposals 10 received by the public body based on the factors and relative weight 11 assigned to each factor that the public body specified in the request 12 for proposals.

13 When ranking the proposals, the panel *appointed pursuant* 3. 14 to subsection 1 shall assign a relative weight of 5 percent to the 15 applicant's possession of a certificate of eligibility to receive a 16 preference in bidding on public works if the applicant submits a 17 signed affidavit that meets the requirements of subsection 1 of NRS 18 338.0117. If any federal statute or regulation precludes the granting of federal assistance or reduces the amount of that assistance for a 19 20 particular public work because of the provisions of this subsection, 21 those provisions of this subsection do not apply insofar as their 22 application would preclude or reduce federal assistance for that 23 work

4. After the panel *appointed pursuant to subsection 1* ranks the proposals, the public body or its authorized representative shall, except as otherwise provided in subsection $\{5, \}$ 8, select at least the two but not more than the five applicants whose proposals received the highest scores for interviews.

5. The public body or its authorized representative may appoint a separate panel to interview and rank the applicants selected pursuant to subsection 4. If a separate panel is appointed pursuant to this subsection, the panel must consist of at least three but not more than seven members, a majority of whom must have experience in the construction industry.

During the interview process, the *public body or its* 35 **6**. authorized representative] panel conducting the interview may 36 require the applicants to submit a preliminary proposed amount 37 38 of compensation for managing the preconstruction and construction 39 of the public work, but in no event shall the proposed amount of 40 compensation exceed 20 percent of the scoring for the selection of the most qualified applicant. All presentations made at any 41 interview conducted pursuant to this subsection or subsection 5 42 may be made only by key personnel employed by the applicant, as 43 44 determined by the applicant, and the employees of the applicant





who will be directly responsible for managing the preconstruction
 and construction of the public work.

After conducting such interviews, the panel *that conducted* 3 7. the interviews shall rank the applicants by using a ranking process 4 5 that is separate from the process used to rank [proposals] the 6 *applicants* pursuant to subsection 2 and is based only on 7 information submitted during the interview process. 8. If the public body did not receive at least two proposals, thepublic body may not contract with a construction manager at risk.

20 **16.** 9. Upon receipt of the final rankings of the applicants from the panel *it that conducted the interviews*, the public body or its 21 22 authorized representative shall enter into negotiations with the most 23 qualified applicant determined pursuant to [subsections 2, 3 and 4] the provisions of this section for a contract for preconstruction 24 25 services, unless the public body required the submission of a proposed amount of compensation, in which case the proposed 26 27 amount of compensation submitted by the applicant must be the 28 amount offered for the contract. The public body or its authorized representative shall 41 make available to all applicants and the public the final rankings of 42 the applicants , as determined by the panel that conducted the 43 interviews, and shall provide, upon request, an explanation to any 44 unsuccessful applicant of the reasons why the applicant was 45 unsuccessful.
