

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 30—COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

(ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION)

PREFILED DECEMBER 20, 2014

Referred to Committee on Education

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to plans to improve the achievement of pupils enrolled in public schools in this State. (BDR 34-312)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets ***[omitted material]*** is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to education; revising provisions concerning the submission of a plan to improve the achievement of pupils enrolled in public school in this State; requiring the State Board to review each plan submitted by the principal of a school and make certain recommendations to the Department of Education; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires the principal of each school to prepare and submit a plan
2 to improve the achievement of the pupils enrolled in the school to the Superintendent of Public Instruction, the Governor, the State Board of Education,
3 the Department of Education, the Legislative Committee on Education, the Legislative Bureau of Educational Accountability and Program Evaluation and
4 the board of trustees of the school district in which the school is located or, if the
5 school is a charter school, the sponsor of the charter school and the governing body
6 of the charter school. (NRS 385.357) **Section 1** of this bill removes the requirement
7 that a principal must submit the plan to the Superintendent of Public Instruction, the
8 Governor and the State Board. **Section 2** of this bill requires the State Board to
9 review each plan submitted by the principal of each school to determine common
10 problems identified by the principal of each school and make recommendations to
11 the Department concerning how the Department can best support the needs of
12 schools.

13 Existing law requires the State Board to prepare and submit a plan to improve
14 the achievement of pupils in this State to various entities. (NRS 385.3593) **Section**
15 **2** requires this plan to include: (1) certain information regarding the manner in
16 which remediation will be provided to pupils who require remediation based on the



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19 results of an end-of-course examination or the results of the college and career
20 readiness assessment; and (2) strategies to improve the literacy skills of pupils.
21 **Section 2** also revises the date on which the State Board is required to submit the
22 plan or revised plan.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 385.357 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 385.357 1. The principal of each school, including, without
3 limitation, each charter school, shall, in consultation with the
4 employees of the school, prepare a plan to improve the achievement
5 of the pupils enrolled in the school.
6 2. The plan developed pursuant to subsection 1 must include:
7 (a) A review and analysis of the data pertaining to the school
8 upon which the report required pursuant to subsection 2 or 3 of NRS
9 385.347, as applicable, is based and a review and analysis of any
10 data that is more recent than the data upon which the report is based.
11 (b) The identification of any problems or factors at the school
12 that are revealed by the review and analysis.
13 (c) Strategies based upon scientifically based research, as
14 defined in 20 U.S.C. § 7801(37), that will strengthen the core
15 academic subjects, as defined in NRS 389.018.
16 (d) Policies and practices concerning the core academic subjects
17 which have the greatest likelihood of ensuring that each group of
18 pupils enrolled in the school and identified in the statewide system
19 of accountability for public schools will meet the performance
20 targets established for that group.
21 (e) Annual measurable objectives and performance targets,
22 consistent with the annual measurable objectives and performance
23 targets established pursuant to the statewide system of
24 accountability for public schools, for the continuous and substantial
25 progress by each group of pupils identified in the statewide system
26 of accountability for public schools who are enrolled in the school to
27 ensure that each group will meet the performance targets established
28 for that group.
29 (f) Strategies and practices which:
30 (1) Are consistent with the policy adopted pursuant to NRS
31 392.457 by the board of trustees of the school district in which the
32 school is located, to promote effective involvement by parents and
33 families of pupils enrolled in the school in the education of their
34 children; and
35 (2) Are designed to improve and promote effective
36 involvement and engagement by parents and families of pupils
37 enrolled in the school which are consistent with the policies and



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1 recommendations of the Office of Parental Involvement and Family
2 Engagement made pursuant to NRS 385.635.

3 (g) As appropriate, programs of remedial education or tutoring
4 to be offered before and after school, during the summer, or between
5 sessions if the school operates on a year-round calendar for pupils
6 enrolled in the school who need additional instructional time to pass
7 or to reach a level considered proficient.

8 (h) Strategies to improve the academic achievement of pupils
9 enrolled in the school, including, without limitation, strategies to:

10 (1) Instruct pupils who are not achieving to their fullest
11 potential, including, without limitation:

12 (I) The curriculum appropriate to improve achievement;
13 (II) The manner by which the instruction will improve the
14 achievement and proficiency of pupils on the examinations
15 administered pursuant to NRS 389.550 and 389.805 and the college
16 and career readiness assessment administered pursuant to NRS
17 389.807; and

18 (III) An identification of the instruction and curriculum
19 that is specifically designed to improve the achievement and
20 proficiency of pupils in each group identified in the statewide
21 system of accountability for public schools;

22 (2) Increase the rate of attendance of pupils and reduce the
23 number of pupils who drop out of school;

24 (3) Integrate technology into the instructional and
25 administrative programs of the school;

26 (4) Manage effectively the discipline of pupils; and

27 (5) Enhance the professional development offered for the
28 teachers and administrators employed at the school to include
29 the activities set forth in 20 U.S.C. § 7801(34) and to address the
30 specific needs of pupils enrolled in the school, as deemed
31 appropriate by the principal.

32 (i) An identification, by category, of the employees of the school
33 who are responsible for ensuring that the plan is carried out
34 effectively.

35 (j) In consultation with the school district or governing body, as
36 applicable, an identification, by category, of the employees of the
37 school district or governing body, if any, who are responsible for
38 ensuring that the plan is carried out effectively or for overseeing and
39 monitoring whether the plan is carried out effectively.

40 (k) In consultation with the Department, an identification, by
41 category, of the employees of the Department, if any, who are
42 responsible for overseeing and monitoring whether the plan is
43 carried out effectively.



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1 (l) For each provision of the plan, a timeline for carrying out
2 that provision, including, without limitation, a timeline for
3 monitoring whether the provision is carried out effectively.

4 (m) For each provision of the plan, measurable criteria for
5 determining whether the provision has contributed toward
6 improving the academic achievement of pupils, increasing the rate
7 of attendance of pupils and reducing the number of pupils who drop
8 out of school.

9 (n) The resources available to the school to carry out the plan. If
10 this State has a financial analysis program that is designed to track
11 educational expenditures and revenues to individual schools, each
12 school shall use that statewide program in complying with this
13 paragraph. If a statewide program is not available, each school shall
14 use the financial analysis program used by the school district in
15 which the school is located in complying with this paragraph.

16 (o) A summary of the effectiveness of appropriations made by
17 the Legislature that are available to the school to improve the
18 academic achievement of pupils and programs approved by the
19 Legislature to improve the academic achievement of pupils.

20 (p) A budget of the overall cost for carrying out the plan.

21 3. The principal of each school shall, in consultation with the
22 employees of the school:

23 (a) Review the plan prepared pursuant to this section annually to
24 evaluate the effectiveness of the plan; and

25 (b) Based upon the evaluation of the plan, make revisions, as
26 necessary, to ensure that the plan is designed to improve the
27 academic achievement of pupils enrolled in the school.

28 4. On or before December 15 of each year, the principal of
29 each school shall submit the plan or the revised plan, as applicable,
30 to:

31 (a) If the school is a public school of the school district, the
32 superintendent of schools of the school district.

33 (b) If the school is a charter school, the governing body of the
34 charter school.

35 5. If a Title I school is rated as underperforming pursuant to the
36 statewide system of accountability for public schools, the
37 superintendent of schools of the school district or the governing
38 body, as applicable, shall carry out a process for peer review of the
39 plan or the revised plan, as applicable, in accordance with 20 U.S.C.
40 § 6316(b)(3)(E) and the regulations adopted pursuant thereto. Not
41 later than 45 days after receipt of the plan, the superintendent of
42 schools of the school district or the governing body, as applicable,
43 shall approve the plan or the revised plan, as applicable, if it meets
44 the requirements of 20 U.S.C. § 6316(b)(3) and the regulations
45 adopted pursuant thereto and the requirements of this section. The



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1 superintendent of schools of the school district or the governing
2 body, as applicable, may condition approval of the plan or the
3 revised plan, as applicable, in the manner set forth in 20 U.S.C. §
4 6316(b)(3)(B) and the regulations adopted pursuant thereto. The
5 State Board shall prescribe the requirements for the process of peer
6 review, including, without limitation, the qualifications of persons
7 who may serve as peer reviewers.

8 6. If a school is rated as meeting the annual measurable
9 objectives and performance targets established pursuant to the
10 statewide system of accountability for public schools, or if a school
11 that is not a Title I school is rated as underperforming pursuant to
12 the statewide accountability system for public schools, not later than
13 45 days after receipt of the plan or the revised plan, as applicable,
14 the superintendent of schools of the school district or the governing
15 body, as applicable, shall approve the plan or the revised plan if it
16 meets the requirements of this section.

17 7. On or before January 31 of each year, the principal of each
18 school shall submit the final plan or the final revised plan, as
19 applicable, to the:

20 (a) ~~Superintendent of Public Instruction;~~

21 ~~(b) Governor;~~

22 ~~(c) State Board;~~

23 ~~(d) Department;~~

24 ~~(e) (b) Committee;~~

25 ~~(f) (c) Bureau; and~~

26 ~~(g) (d) Board of trustees of the school district in which the~~
27 school is located or, if the school is a charter school, the sponsor of
28 the charter school and the governing body of the charter school.

29 8. A plan for the improvement of a school must be carried out
30 expeditiously, but not later than February 15 after approval of the
31 plan pursuant to subsection 5 or 6, as applicable.

32 **Sec. 2.** NRS 385.3593 is hereby amended to read as follows:

33 385.3593 1. The State Board shall prepare a plan to improve
34 the achievement of pupils enrolled in the public schools in this
35 State. The plan:

36 (a) Must be prepared in consultation with:

37 (1) Employees of the Department;

38 (2) At least one employee of a school district in a county
39 whose population is 100,000 or more, appointed by the Nevada
40 Association of School Boards;

41 (3) At least one employee of a school district in a county
42 whose population is less than 100,000, appointed by the Nevada
43 Association of School Boards; and



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1 (4) At least one representative of the Statewide Council for
2 the Coordination of the Regional Training Programs created by NRS
3 391.516, appointed by the Council; and

4 (b) May be prepared in consultation with:

- 5 (1) Representatives of institutions of higher education;
- 6 (2) Representatives of regional educational laboratories;
- 7 (3) Representatives of outside consultant groups;

8 (4) Representatives of the regional training programs for the
9 professional development of teachers and administrators created by
10 NRS 391.512;

11 (5) The Bureau; and

12 (6) Other persons who the State Board determines are
13 appropriate.

14 2. A plan to improve the achievement of pupils enrolled in
15 public schools in this State must include:

16 (a) A review and analysis of the data upon which the report
17 required pursuant to NRS 385.3572 is based and a review and
18 analysis of any data that is more recent than the data upon which the
19 report is based.

20 (b) The identification of any problems or factors common
21 among the school districts or charter schools in this State, as
22 revealed by the review and analysis.

23 (c) Strategies based upon scientifically based research, as
24 defined in 20 U.S.C. § 7801(37), that will strengthen the core
25 academic subjects, as set forth in NRS 389.018.

26 (d) Strategies to improve the academic achievement of pupils
27 enrolled in public schools in this State, including, without limitation,
28 strategies to:

29 (1) Instruct pupils who are not achieving to their fullest
30 potential, including, without limitation:

31 (I) The curriculum appropriate to improve achievement;

32 (II) The manner by which the instruction will improve the
33 achievement and proficiency of pupils on the examinations
34 administered pursuant to NRS 389.550 and 389.805 and the college
35 and career readiness assessment administered pursuant to NRS
36 389.807 ~~☒~~, *including, without limitation, the manner in which
37 remediation will be provided to pupils who require remediation
38 based on the results of an examination administered pursuant to
39 NRS 389.805 and 389.807*; and

40 (III) An identification of the instruction and curriculum
41 that is specifically designed to improve the achievement and
42 proficiency of pupils in each group identified in the statewide
43 system of accountability for public schools;

44 (2) *Improve the literacy skills of pupils*;



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1 (3) Increase the rate of attendance of pupils and reduce the
2 number of pupils who drop out of school;

3 (4) Integrate technology into the instructional and
4 administrative programs of the school districts;

5 (5) Manage effectively the discipline of pupils; and

6 (6) Enhance the professional development offered for
7 the teachers and administrators employed at public schools in this
8 State to include the activities set forth in 20 U.S.C. § 7801(34) and
9 to address the specific needs of the pupils enrolled in public schools
10 in this State, as deemed appropriate by the State Board.

11 (e) Strategies designed to provide to the pupils enrolled in
12 middle school, junior high school and high school, the teachers and
13 counselors who provide instruction to those pupils, and the parents
14 and guardians of those pupils information concerning:

15 (1) The requirements for admission to an institution of higher
16 education and the opportunities for financial aid;

17 (2) The availability of Governor Guinn Millennium
18 Scholarships pursuant to NRS 396.911 to 396.945, inclusive; and

19 (3) The need for a pupil to make informed decisions about
20 his or her curriculum in middle school, junior high school and high
21 school in preparation for success after graduation.

22 (f) An identification, by category, of the employees of the
23 Department who are responsible for ensuring that each provision of
24 the plan is carried out effectively.

25 (g) A timeline for carrying out the plan, including, without
26 limitation:

27 (1) The rate of improvement and progress which must be
28 attained annually in meeting the goals and benchmarks established
29 by the State Board pursuant to subsection 3; and

30 (2) For each provision of the plan, a timeline for carrying out
31 that provision, including, without limitation, a timeline for
32 monitoring whether the provision is carried out effectively.

33 (h) For each provision of the plan, measurable criteria for
34 determining whether the provision has contributed toward
35 improving the academic achievement of pupils, increasing the rate
36 of attendance of pupils and reducing the number of pupils who drop
37 out of school.

38 (i) Strategies to improve the allocation of resources from this
39 State, by program and by school district, in a manner that will
40 improve the academic achievement of pupils. If this State has a
41 financial analysis program that is designed to track educational
42 expenditures and revenues to individual schools, the State Board
43 shall use that statewide program in complying with this paragraph.
44 If a statewide program is not available, the State Board shall use the



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1 Department's own financial analysis program in complying with
2 this paragraph.

3 (j) Based upon the reallocation of resources set forth in
4 paragraph (i), the resources available to the State Board and the
5 Department to carry out the plan, including, without limitation, a
6 budget for the overall cost of carrying out the plan.

7 (k) A summary of the effectiveness of appropriations made by
8 the Legislature to improve the academic achievement of pupils and
9 programs approved by the Legislature to improve the academic
10 achievement of pupils.

11 (l) A 5-year strategic plan which identifies the recurring issues
12 in improving the achievement and proficiency of pupils in this State
13 and which establishes strategic goals to address those issues. The
14 5-year strategic plan must be:

15 (1) Based upon the data from previous years which is
16 collected by the Department for the plan developed pursuant to this
17 section; and

18 (2) Designed to track the progress made in achieving the
19 strategic goals established by the Department.

20 (m) Any additional plans addressing the achievement and
21 proficiency of pupils adopted by the Department.

22 3. The State Board shall:

23 (a) In developing the plan to improve the achievement of pupils
24 enrolled in public schools, establish clearly defined goals and
25 benchmarks for improving the achievement of pupils, including,
26 without limitation, goals for:

27 (1) Improving proficiency results in core academic subjects;

28 (2) Increasing the number of pupils enrolled in public middle
29 schools and junior high schools, including, without limitation,
30 charter schools, who enter public high schools with the skills
31 necessary to succeed in high school;

32 (3) Improving the percentage of pupils who enroll in grade 9
33 and who graduate from a public high school, including, without
34 limitation, a charter school, with a standard or higher diploma upon
35 completion;

36 (4) Improving the performance of pupils on standardized
37 college entrance examinations;

38 (5) Increasing the percentage of pupils enrolled in high
39 schools who enter postsecondary educational institutions or who are
40 career and workforce ready; and

41 (6) Reengaging disengaged youth who have dropped out of
42 high school or who are at risk of dropping out of high school,
43 including, without limitation, a mechanism for tracking and
44 maintaining communication with those youth who have dropped out
45 of school or who are at risk of doing so;



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1 (b) Review the plan annually to evaluate the effectiveness of the
2 plan;
3 (c) Examine the timeline for implementing the plan and each
4 provision of the plan to determine whether the annual goals and
5 benchmarks have been attained; ~~and~~
6 (d) Based upon the evaluation of the plan, make revisions, as
7 necessary, to ensure that:
8 (1) The goals and benchmarks set forth in the plan are being
9 attained in a timely manner; and
10 (2) The plan is designed to improve the academic
11 achievement of pupils enrolled in public schools in this State ~~;~~ ;
12 *and*
13 (e) *Review the plans submitted pursuant to subsection 7 of*
14 *NRS 385.357 to:*
15 (1) *Determine common problems identified by the principal*
16 *of each school pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 2 of NRS*
17 *385.357; and*
18 (2) *Make recommendations to the Department concerning*
19 *how the Department can best support the needs of schools.*
20 4. On or before ~~January~~ *March* 31 of each year, the State
21 Board shall submit the plan or the revised plan, as applicable, to the:
22 (a) Governor;
23 (b) Committee;
24 (c) Bureau;
25 (d) Board of Regents of the University of Nevada;
26 (e) ~~Council to Establish Academic Standards for Public Schools~~
27 *created by NRS 389.510;*
28 ~~(f)~~ Board of trustees of each school district; and
29 ~~(g)~~ *(f)* Governing body of each charter school.
30 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2015.

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
