SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to the recording of documents. (BDR 20-642)

AN ACT relating to records; authorizing the submission of a certified paper copy of an electronic document to certain county recorders; prescribing a certificate sufficient for certifying that a paper copy is a true and correct copy of an electronic document; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires a county recorder to receive, record and index certain 2345678 documents. Such documents must generally be submitted to a county recorder as a paper document. (Chapter 247 of NRS) Existing law authorizes a county recorder to receive, record, store, index, archive and transmit electronic documents in addition to paper documents. (NRS 111.366-111.3697, 247.115) Section 1 of this bill authorizes the submission of a certified paper copy of an electronic document for recording to a county recorder who has elected to receive and record electronic documents. Section 2 of this bill prescribes a certificate sufficient for certifying that 9 a paper copy is a true and correct copy of an electronic document. Section 3 of this 10 bill makes a conforming change to indicate the proper placement of section 2 in the 11 Nevada Revised Statutes.

11	2. This section allows a person to submit a certified paper
12	copy of an electronic document for recording only if a county
13	recorder has elected to accept electronic documents for recording
14	pursuant to NRS 247.115.
15	Sec. 2. Chapter 240 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
16	thereto a new section to read as follows:
17	Upon compliance with the requirements of NRS 240.1655, the
18	following certificate is sufficient for certifying that a paper
19	document is a true and correct copy of an electronic document:
