SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the dissolution and annulment of marriage. (BDR 11-77)

AN ACT relating to domestic relations; removing the requirement concerning the period that a plaintiff or defendant must reside in this State to enable a court to have jurisdiction to grant a divorce or annulment; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law authorizes a divorce from the bonds of matrimony to be obtained by verified complaint to the district court of any county: (1) in which the cause therefor accrued; (2) in which the defendant resides or may be found; (3) in which the plaintiff resides; (4) in which the parties last cohabited; or (5) if the plaintiff resided 6 weeks in Nevada before the suit was brought. Existing law also generally provides that a court does not have jurisdiction to grant a divorce unless either the plaintiff or defendant has been a resident of Nevada for a period of not less than 6 weeks preceding the commencement of the action. (NRS 125.020) **Section 1** of this bill removes the provisions concerning the 6-week residency requirement, effectively providing that a court has jurisdiction to grant a divorce as long as the plaintiff or defendant is a resident of this State.

Existing law also provides that a district court in this State has jurisdiction to annul a marriage contracted, performed or entered into outside this State only if one of the parties has resided in this State for at least 6 weeks before seeking the annulment. (NRS 125.370) **Section 2** of this bill removes the 6-week residency requirement, effectively providing that a court has jurisdiction to grant an annulment as long as the plaintiff or defendant is a resident of this State.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 125.020 is hereby amended to read as follows: 125.020 1. Divorce from the bonds of matrimony may be obtained for the causes provided in NRS 125.010, by verified complaint to the district court of any county:

- (a) In which the cause therefor accrued;
- (b) In which the defendant resides or may be found;
 - (c) In which the plaintiff resides; *or*

- (d) In which the parties last cohabited. [; or
- (e) If plaintiff resided 6 weeks in the State before suit was brought.]
- 2. Unless the cause of action accrued within the county while the plaintiff and defendant were actually domiciled therein, no court has jurisdiction to grant a divorce unless either the plaintiff or defendant [has been] is a resident of [the] this State. [for a period of not less than 6 weeks preceding the commencement of the action.]
 - **Sec. 2.** NRS 125.370 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 125.370 1. Annulment of marriages contracted, performed or entered into [without the] outside this State [of Nevada] may, for any cause provided by law for annulment of marriage, be obtained by complaint, under oath, to the district court of [any]:
- (a) Any county if the plaintiff [shall have resided 6 weeks in the] is a resident of this State before suit [be] is brought [; otherwise, by complaint, under oath, to the district court of the]; or
- **(b) The** county in which:
- [(a)] (1) The defendant [shall reside] resides or [be] is found; or [(b)] (2) The plaintiff [shall reside,] resides, if the [latter be] plaintiff resides in the county in which the parties last cohabited.
- 2. No court in this State [shall have] has authority to annul any marriage contracted, performed or entered into [without the] outside this State [of Nevada] unless one of the parties [shall have resided] resides in this State. [for the period of 6 weeks before filing of the complaint.]
 - Sec. 3. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2015.
