SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to local governments. (BDR 20-784)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact. Effect on the State: No.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to local governments; prohibiting the governing body of a county or city from restricting the parking of certain vehicles on streets or in certain driveways; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law authorizes the board of county commissioners and the governing
body of certain cities to regulate the length of time for which vehicles may be
parked upon the public streets and publicly owned parking lots. (NRS 244.357,
266.277; Caliente City Charter § 2.210, Carlin City Charter § 2.230, Carson City
Charter § 2.250, Elko City Charter § 2.260, Henderson City Charter § 2.210, Las
Vegas City Charter § 2.230, Mesquite City Charter § 2.200, North Las Vegas
Charter § 2.210, Sparks City Charter § 2.090, Wells City Charter § 2.230,
Yerington City Charter § 2.210)
Sections 1 and 4 of this bill prohibit the governing body of a county or city

9 Sections 1 and 4 of this bill prohibit the governing body of a county or city from restricting the parking of certain utility service vehicles, law enforcement vehicles, fire service vehicles or emergency service vehicles if, as a condition of a person's employment, the vehicle is required to be available at or in the vicinity of the person's residence. Sections 2, 3 and 5-15 of this act make conforming changes to existing provisions of Nevada Revised Statutes and city charters related to this limitation on the authority of the governing body of a county or city.





THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

17	services, fire services or emergency services, as applicable.
18	2. As used in this section:
19	(a) "Emergency services vehicle" means a vehicle:
20	(1) Owned by any agency of the Federal Government, the
21	State or a local government; and
22	(2) Identified by the agency which owns the vehicle as a
23	vehicle used to provide emergency services.
24	(b) "Fire service vehicle" means a vehicle:
25	(1) Owned by any agency of the Federal Government, the
26	State or a local government; and
27	(2) Identified by the agency which owns the vehicle as a
28	vehicle used to provide fire services.
29	(c) "Law enforcement vehicle" means a vehicle:
30	(1) Owned by any agency of the Federal Government, the
31	State or a local government; and
32	(2) Identified by the agency which owns the vehicle as a
33	vehicle used to provide law enforcement services. (d) "Utility service vehicle" means any vehicle:
34 35	(1) Used in the furtherance of repairing, maintaining or
35 36	operating any structure or any other physical facility necessary for
30 37	the delivery of utility services, including, without limitation, the
38	furnishing of electricity, gas, water, sanitary sewer, telephone,
39	cable or antenna service; and
40	(2) Except for any emergency use, operated primarily
41	within the service area of a utility's subscribers or consumers,



1 without regard to whether the motor vehicle is owned, leased or 2 rented by the utility.

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Sec. 2. NRS 244.357 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 244.357 Each board of county commissioners may enact 1. 5 and enforce such local police and sanitary ordinances and 6 regulations as are not in conflict with the general laws and regulations of the State of Nevada, but may not enact any ordinance 7 8 or regulation fixing a speed limit on any United States highway or 9 any highway or road which is constructed, reconstructed, improved or maintained by the Department of Transportation as provided in 10 11 chapter 408 of NRS.

2. Such police and sanitary ordinances and regulations may be enacted to apply throughout an entire county or, where the subject matter makes it appropriate and reasonable, may be enacted to govern only a limited area within the county which must be specified in the ordinance.

17 3. Each board of county commissioners may enact and enforce 18 loitering and prowling ordinances.

19 4. Subject to the restriction of subsection 1, each board of 20 county commissioners may, by ordinance, regulate:

(a) All vehicular, pedestrian and other traffic within the
unincorporated area of the county and provide generally for the
public safety on public streets, publicly owned parking lots, parking
areas to which the public is invited and the public rights-of-way.

(b) [The] Except as otherwise provided in section 1 of this act,
 the length of time for which vehicles may be parked upon the public
 streets and publicly owned parking lots.

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Sec. 3. NRS 266.277 is hereby amended to read as follows:

266.277 The city council may, by ordinance, regulate:

1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 707.375, all vehicular, pedestrian and other traffic within the city and provide generally for the public safety on public streets, publicly owned parking lots, parking areas to which the public is invited and public rights-of-way.
