SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to services for persons with autism spectrum disorders. (BDR 40-999)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: Increases or Newly Provides for Term of Imprisonment in County or City Jail or Detention Facility. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public health; revising provisions relating to certified autism behavior interventionists; including social communication disorder as a disorder covered by the Autism Treatment Assistance Program; requiring certain policies of health insurance and health care plans to provide coverage for social communication disorder on the same basis as autism; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law provides for the certification and regulation of autism behavior interventionists by the Board of Psychological Examiners. (NRS 641.110, 641.172, 641.232) Sections 4-17, 21, 23-32 and 38 of this bill transfer the authority to certify and regulate autism behavior interventionists from the Board of Psychological Examiners to the Aging and Disability Services Division of the Department of Health and Human Services. Section 39 of this bill provides that a person who holds a current certificate as an autism behavior interventionist issued by the Board is not required to obtain a new certificate from the Division until the expiration of the certificate. Section 39 also makes regulations of the Board concerning autism behavior interventionists enforceable by the Division until the





Division adopts regulations to repeal or replace those regulations of the Board.
 Finally, section 22 of this bill revises the composition of the Board.

13 Existing law requires certain health care plans and policies of insurance to 14 provide an option or a requirement, as applicable, of coverage for the screening for, 15 including the diagnosis of, and the treatment of autism spectrum disorders in certain circumstances. (NRS 287.0276, 689A.0435, 689B.0335, 689C.1655, 695C.1717, 16 17 695G.1645) Existing law also establishes the Autism Treatment Assistance 18 Program within the Division to provide and coordinate the provision of services to 19 persons with autism spectrum disorders and requires the Health Division of the 20 21 22 23 Department to refer certain children to the Program. (NRS 427A.875, 442.770) Sections 2, 3, 18-20 and 33-37 of this bill include social communication disorder as a disorder covered by the Program and a disorder for which certain health care plans and policies of insurance must provide an option or a requirement of 24 coverage.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

4 Sec. 2. "Autism spectrum disorder" means a neurobiological
5 medical condition including, without limitation, autistic disorder,
6 Asperger's Disorder, Pervasive Developmental Disorder Not
7 Otherwise Specified and social communication disorder.

Sec. 6. "Division" means the Aging and Disability Services
Division of the Department.

Sec. 7. The Division may make and promulgate rules and regulations not inconsistent with the provisions of sections 4 to 17, inclusive, of this act governing its procedure, the examination and certification of applicants for certification as an autism behavior interventionist and the granting, refusal, revocation or suspension of such certificates.

- 25 Sec. 8. The Division may, under the provisions of sections 4 26 to 17, inclusive, of this act:
- Examine and pass upon the qualifications of the applicants
 for certification as an autism behavior interventionist.
 Certify qualified applicants.





3. Revoke or suspend certificates.

4. Collect all fees pursuant to section 13 of this act.

3 Sec. 9. 1. Each application for certification as an autism 4 behavior interventionist must be accompanied by evidence 5 satisfactory to the Division that the applicant:

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(a) Is at least 18 years of age.

(b) Is of good moral character as determined by the Division.

10 *(d) Has completed satisfactorily a written examination in* 11 *Nevada law and ethical practice as administered by the Division.*

12 (e) Has completed satisfactorily a standardized practical 13 examination developed and approved by the Division. The 14 examination must be conducted by the applicant's supervisor, who 15 shall make a videotape or other audio and visual recording of the 16 applicant's performance of the examination for submission to the 17 Division. The Division may review the recording as part of its 18 evaluation of the applicant's qualifications.

19 2. Within 120 days after receiving an application and the 20 accompanying evidence from an applicant, the Division shall:

(a) Evaluate the application and accompanying evidence and
determine whether the applicant is qualified pursuant to this

 licensed assistant behavior analyst or certified autism behavior
 interventionist.

(d) "Certified autism behavior interventionist" means a person

Division of the Department of Health and Human Services and
who provides behavior therapy under the supervision of:

12 (i) "Prescription care" means medications prescribed by a licensed physician and any health-related services deemed medically 13 14 necessary to determine the need or effectiveness of the medications.

15 (i) "Psychiatric care" means direct or consultative services 16 provided by a psychiatrist licensed in the state in which the 17 psychiatrist practices.

18 (k) "Psychological care" means direct or consultative services provided by a psychologist licensed in the state in which the 19 20 psychologist practices.

21 (1) "Screening for autism spectrum disorders" means all 22 medically appropriate assessments, evaluations or tests to diagnose 23 whether a person has an autism spectrum disorder.

(m) "Therapeutic care" means services provided by licensed or 24 25 certified speech pathologists, occupational therapists and physical 26 therapists.

27 (n) "Treatment plan" means a plan to treat an autism spectrum 28 disorder that is prescribed by a licensed physician or licensed 29 psychologist and may be developed pursuant to a comprehensive 30 evaluation in coordination with a licensed behavior analyst.

641.0204 "Autism interventionist" behavior defined. "Autism behavior interventionist" means a person who is certified as an autism behavior interventionist by the Board.

641.172 Qualifications of applicant for certification as autism behavior interventionist; Board to evaluate application and issue statement of determination; contents of statement.

Each application for certification as an autism behavior 1. interventionist must be accompanied by evidence satisfactory to the Board that the applicant:

- (a) Is at least 18 years of age.
- (b) Is of good moral character as determined by the Board.





(c) Is a citizen of the United States, or is lawfully entitled to remain and work in the United States.

(d) Has completed satisfactorily a written examination in Nevada law and ethical practice as administered by the Board.

(e) Has completed satisfactorily a standardized practical examination developed and approved by the Board. The examination must be conducted by the applicant's supervisor, who shall make a videotape or other audio and visual recording of the applicant's performance of the examination for submission to the Board. The Board may review the recording as part of its evaluation of the applicant's qualifications.

2. Within 120 days after receiving an application and the accompanying evidence from an applicant, the Board shall:

(a) Evaluate the application and accompanying evidence and determine whether the applicant is qualified pursuant to this section for certification as an autism behavior interventionist; and

(b) Issue a written statement to the applicant of its determination.

3. If the Board determines that the qualifications of the applicant are insufficient for certification, the written statement issued to the applicant pursuant to subsection 2 must include a detailed explanation of the reasons for that determination.

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
