

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 408—ASSEMBLYWOMAN KASAMA

MARCH 25, 2021

Referred to Committee on Government Affairs

SUMMARY—Directs the Legislative Commission to appoint a committee to conduct an interim study on the role of online travel companies in promoting tourism in this State. (BDR S-673)

AN ACT relating to taxation; directing the Legislative Commission to appoint a committee to conduct an interim study concerning the role of online travel companies in promoting tourism in this State; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 This bill directs the Legislative Commission to appoint a committee to conduct
2 an interim study concerning the role of online travel companies in promoting
3 tourism in this State.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** (Deleted by amendment.)

5 **Sec. 4.5.** 1. The Legislative Commission shall appoint a
6 committee to conduct an interim study concerning the role of online
7 travel companies in promoting tourism in this State.

8 2. The interim committee must be composed of six Legislators
9 as follows:

10 (a) Two members appointed by the Majority Leader of the
11 Senate;



1 (b) Two members appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly;
2 (c) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
3 Senate; and

4 (d) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
5 Assembly.

6 3. The Legislative Commission shall appoint a Chair and Vice
7 Chair from among the members of the interim committee.

8 4. The interim committee shall study and examine:

9 (a) Statewide tourism and the promotion of tourism in Nevada;
10 and

11 (b) The role of online travel companies in promoting tourism in
12 this State.

13 5. The interim committee shall consult with and solicit input
14 from persons, organizations and agencies with expertise in matters
15 related to tourism in this State.

16 6. Any recommended legislation proposed by the interim
17 committee must be approved by a majority of the members of the
18 Assembly and a majority of the members of the Senate appointed to
19 the interim committee.

20 7. The Legislative Commission shall submit a report of the
21 results of the study and any recommended legislation to the Director
22 of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the 82nd
23 Session of the Nevada Legislature.

24 **Sec. 5.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
