ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 426-COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

MARCH 25, 2019

SUMMARY—Creates the Committee on Systems Integration within the Office of Science. Innovation and Technology. (BDR 18-1121)

AN ACT relating to State Government; creating the Committee on Systems Integration within the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology; prescribing the membership and duties of the Committee; revising provisions relating to the duties of the Director of the Office; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law establishes the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology in the Office of the Governor. (NRS 223.600) Section 2 of this bill creates the Committee on Systems Integration within the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology and prescribes its membership. Section 3 of this bill requires the Committee to develop and maintain a plan to coordinate, integrate and optimize plans for systems in this State including: (1) energy; (2) communication; (3) information technology; (4) transportation; (5) public safety; and (6) emergency response. Additionally, section 3 requires the Committee to develop and maintain the plan in coordination with any federal agency and any private entity which is involved in planning for the same systems addressed by the Committee.

Existing law prescribes the duties of the Director of the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology. (NRS 223.610) **Section 4** of this bill additionally requires the Director, to the extent of the legislative appropriation and other available money, to provide support to the Committee created by section 2 and facilitate implementation in this State of the plans developed by the Committee.

Section 5 of this bill appropriates \$500,000 from the State General Fund to the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology for each year of the biennium for expenses related to the Committee.





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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 223 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

- Sec. 2. 1. The Committee on Systems Integration is hereby created within the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology. The Committee consists of:
 - (a) The following ex officio members:

- (1) The Director of the Office of Energy or his or her designee;
- (2) The Executive Director of the Office of Economic Development or his or her designee;
- (3) The Director of the Department of Motor Vehicles or his or her designee;
- (4) The Director of the Department of Transportation or his or her designee;
- (5) The Director of the Department of Public Safety or his or her designee;
- (6) The administrative head of the Desert Research Institute or his or her designee; and
- (7) The administrative head of a regional transportation commission in a county whose population is 100,000 or more or his or her designee; and
 - (b) The following members appointed by the Governor:
- (1) One representative of the general public with expertise in information technology or communication technology;
- (2) One representative of the general public with expertise in advanced transportation systems; and
- (3) One representative of the general public with expertise in energy production, transmission and distribution.
- 2. The Committee shall annually elect a Chair and a Vice Chair from among its members.
- 3. Each appointed member serves a term of 2 years. Members may be reappointed for additional terms of 2 years in the same manner as the original appointments. Any vacancy occurring in the appointed membership of the Committee must be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
- 4. The Director of the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology shall act as the nonvoting Secretary of the Committee.
- 5. The members of the Committee serve without compensation but are entitled to receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided for state officers and employees generally.





- 6. A member of the Committee who is an officer or employee of this State or a political subdivision of this State must be relieved from his or her duties without loss of regular compensation to prepare for and attend meetings of the Committee and perform any work necessary to carry out the duties of the Committee in the most timely manner practicable. A state agency or political subdivision of this State shall not require an officer or employee who is a member of the Committee to:
- (a) Make up time he or she is absent from work to carry out his or her duties as a member of the Committee; or
 - (b) Take annual leave or compensatory time for the absence.
- 7. The Committee shall meet at least quarterly every year and may meet at such further times as deemed necessary by the Chair.
- 8. A majority of the members of the Committee constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business, and a majority of a quorum present at any meeting is sufficient for any official action taken by the Committee.
- 9. On or before December 31 of each year, the Committee shall submit a report of its activities and findings, including, without limitation, any recommendations for legislation to the Governor and the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Legislature, or if the Legislature is not in session, to the Legislative Commission.
- **Sec. 3.** 1. The Committee on Systems Integration created by section 2 of this act shall:
- (a) Develop and maintain a plan to coordinate, integrate and optimize plans for systems in this State which include, without limitation:
 - (1) Energy production, transmission and distribution;
 - (2) Communication;
 - (3) Information technology;
 - (4) Transportation;
 - (5) Public safety; and
 - (6) Emergency response.
- (b) To the extent allowed by law, the Committee shall coordinate the plan developed pursuant to paragraph (a) with any federal agency and any private entity involved in planning for the systems described in paragraph (a).
- 40 2. In carrying out its duties pursuant to subsection 1, the 41 Committee may review, study and comment upon any plan:
 - (a) Submitted to the Committee by any office, department, division, bureau, board, commission or other agency of this State or a subdivision of this State; or





- (b) Required by law to be submitted to any office, department, division, bureau, board, commission or other agency of this State or a subdivision of this State.
- **Sec. 4.** NRS 223.610 is hereby amended to read as follows: 223.610 The Director of the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology shall:
- 1. Advise the Governor and the Executive Director of the Office of Economic Development on matters relating to science, innovation and technology.
- 2. Work in coordination with the Office of Economic Development to establish criteria and goals for economic development and diversification in this State in the areas of science, innovation and technology.
- 3. As directed by the Governor, identify, recommend and carry out policies related to science, innovation and technology.
- 4. Report periodically to the Executive Director of the Office of Economic Development concerning the administration of the policies and programs of the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology.
- 5. Coordinate activities in this State relating to the planning, mapping and procurement of broadband service in a competitively neutral and nondiscriminatory manner, which must include, without limitation:
- (a) Development of a strategic plan to improve the delivery of broadband services in this State to schools, libraries, providers of health care, transportation facilities, prisons and other community facilities:
- (b) Applying for state and federal grants on behalf of eligible entities and managing state matching money that has been appropriated by the Legislature;
- (c) Coordinating and processing applications for state and federal money relating to broadband services;
- (d) Prioritizing construction projects which affect or involve the expansion or deployment of broadband services in this State;
- (e) In consultation with providers of health care from various health care settings, the expansion of telehealth services to reduce health care costs and increase health care quality and access in this State, especially in rural, unserved and underserved areas of this State;
- (f) Expansion of the fiber optic infrastructure in this State for the benefit of the public safety radio and communications systems in this State:
- (g) Collection and storage of data relating to agreements and contracts entered into by the State for the provision of fiber optic assets in this State; and





- (h) Administration of the trade policy for fiber optic infrastructure in this State.
- 6. Provide support to the Advisory Council on Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics and direct the implementation in this State of plans developed by the Council concerning, without limitation, workforce development, college preparedness and economic development.
- 7. To the extent of the legislative appropriation and other available money, provide support to the Committee on Systems Integration created by section 2 of this act and facilitate implementation in this State of plans developed by the Committee pursuant to section 3 of this act.
- [7.] 8. In carrying out his or her duties pursuant to this section, consult with the Executive Director of the Office of Economic Development and cooperate with the Executive Director in implementing the State Plan for Economic Development developed by the Executive Director pursuant to subsection 2 of NRS 231.053.
- [8.] 9. Administer such grants as are provided by legislative appropriation.
- **Sec. 5.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology for the costs of the Committee on Systems Integration created by section 2 of this act the following sums:

For the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 \$500,000 For the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 \$500,000

- 2. Any balance of the sums appropriated by subsection 1 remaining at the end of the respective fiscal years must not be committed for expenditure after June 30 of the respective fiscal years by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after September 18, 2020, and September 17, 2021, respectively, by either the entity to which the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 18, 2020, and September 17, 2021, respectively.
- **Sec. 6.** The provisions of subsection 1 of NRS 218D.380 do not apply to any provision of this act which adds or revises a requirement to submit a report to the Legislature.
- **Sec. 7.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval for purposes of appointment of members and performing any other preparatory administrative tasks that are necessary to carry





out the provisions of this act and on July 1, 2019, for all other purposes. 1
