SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to services for persons with intellectual disabilities and persons with related conditions. (BDR 39-416)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets for its material is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public welfare; requiring the Aging and Disability Services Division of the Department of Health and Human Services to enter into an agreement with the Rehabilitation Division of the Department Employment, Training and Rehabilitation to provide long-term support to persons with intellectual disabilities and persons with related conditions; authorizing the Administrator of the Aging and Disability Services Division to adopt regulations governing the provision of services to certain persons with intellectual disabilities and persons with related conditions; requiring the Aging and Disability Services Division to provide preferences for potential providers of jobs and day training services in issuing certificates authorizing the provision of such services and in entering into agreements concerning the provision of such services; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Rehabilitation Division of the Department of 1 $\frac{1}{3}$ Employment, Training and Rehabilitation to administer certain programs concerning employment and independent living for persons with disabilities.





4 (NRS 232.945) Existing law also requires the Aging and Disability Services 5 Division of the Department of Health and Human Services to regulate the provision 6 of jobs and day training services and supported living arrangement services to ž persons with intellectual disabilities and persons with related conditions. (NRS 8 435.130-435.339) Section 1 of this bill requires the Aging and Disability Services 9 Division to enter into a cooperative agreement with the Rehabilitation Division to 10 provide long-term support to persons with intellectual disabilities and persons with 11 related conditions. Section 1 also authorizes the Administrator of the Aging and 12 Disability Services Division to adopt regulations governing the provision of 13 services to persons with intellectual disabilities and persons with related conditions 14 who are unable or unwilling to be employed.

Existing law requires a natural person and certain entities to obtain a certificate from the Aging and Disability Services Division before providing jobs and day training services in this State, which are services provided to persons with intellectual disabilities or persons with related conditions to enhance selfsufficiency and success in employment. (NRS 435.176, 435.225) Existing law also authorizes the Aging and Disability Services Division to enter into agreements with public and private agencies as it deems necessary for the provision of jobs and day training services. (NRS 435.220)

Sections 1.5 and 2 of this bill require the Aging and Disability Services
Division to give preference to potential providers of jobs and day training services
who will provide persons with intellectual disabilities or persons with related
conditions with training and experience leading to employment that: (1) is
comparable to employment for persons without intellectual disabilities and persons
without related conditions; and (2) pays at or above the state minimum wage. The
Aging and Disability Services Division is required to give such a preference when:
(1) issuing certificates which authorize the provisions of jobs and day training
services; and (2) entering into agreements with public and private agencies for the
provision of jobs and day training services. Sections 1.5 and 2 also require each
application for the issuance or renewal of such a certificate and each such
agreement to include a provision that employment is the primary service option for
all adults of working age.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 435 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

The Division shall enter into a cooperative agreement with 3 1. the Rehabilitation Division of the Department of Employment, 4 Training and Rehabilitation to provide long-term support to 5 persons with intellectual disabilities and persons with related 6 7 conditions, including, without limitation, jobs and day training 8 services and supported living arrangement services. The agreement must include a provision stating that employment is the 9 10 preferred service option for all adults of working age.

11 2. The Administrator may adopt regulations governing the 12 provision of services to persons with intellectual disabilities and 13 persons with related conditions who are unable or unwilling to be 14 employed.





Sec. 1.5. NRS 435.220 is hereby amended to read as follows:

435.220 1. The Division shall adopt regulations governing 2 3 jobs and day training services, including, without limitation, 4 regulations that set forth:

5 (a) Standards for the provision of quality care and training by 6 providers of jobs and day training services;

7 (b) The requirements for the issuance and renewal of a 8 certificate; and

9 (c) The rights of consumers of jobs and day training services, 10 including, without limitation, the right of a consumer to file a 11 complaint and the procedure for filing the complaint.

12 2. The Division may enter into such agreements with public 13 and private agencies as it deems necessary for the provision of jobs 14 and day training services. Any such agreements must include a 15 provision stating that employment is the preferred service option 16 for all adults of working age.

17 For the purpose of entering into an agreement described in 3. 18 subsection 2, if the qualifications of more than one agency are equal, the Division shall give preference to the agency that will 19 provide persons with intellectual disabilities or persons with 20 21 related conditions with training and experience that demonstrates 22 a progression of measurable skills that is likely to lead to 23 competitive employment outcomes that provide employment that:

24 (a) Is comparable to employment of persons without intellectual disabilities and persons without related conditions; 25 26 and

27 (b) Pays at or above the minimum wage prescribed by regulation of the Labor Commissioner pursuant to NRS 608.250. 28 29

Sec. 2. NRS 435.225 is hereby amended to read as follows:

30 435.225 1. A nonprofit organization, state or local government or agency thereof shall not provide jobs and day 31 32 training services in this State without first obtaining a certificate 33 from the Division

34 2. A natural person other than a person who is employed by an 35 entity listed in subsection 1 shall not provide jobs and day training 36 services in this State without first obtaining a certificate from the 37 Division.

38 3. For the purpose of issuing a certificate pursuant to this 39 section, if the qualifications of more than one applicant are equal, the Division shall give preference to the natural person who, or 40 41 the nonprofit organization, state or local government or agency 42 thereof that, will provide persons with intellectual disabilities or 43 persons with related conditions with training and experience that 44 demonstrates a progression of measurable skills that is likely to
