ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 52-COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES

(ON BEHALF OF THE DIVISION OF STATE LANDS OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION AND NATURAL RESOURCES)

SUMMARY—Makes various changes related to the Land Use Planning Advisory Council. (BDR 26-342)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public lands; revising the membership and duties of the Land Use Planning Advisory Council; authorizing the removal of a voting member before the expiration of his or her term under certain circumstances; requiring the election of a vice chair of the Advisory Council; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law creates the Land Use Planning Advisory Council, which advises the Administrator of the Division of State Lands of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and the State Land Use Planning Agency on issues relating to land use planning. (NRS 321.740, 321.750) The Advisory Council consists of 17 voting members appointed by the Governor and 1 nonvoting member appointed by the Nevada Association of Counties. (NRS 321.740) **Section 1** of this bill adds to the Advisory Council: (1) one nonvoting member appointed by the Nevada Nevada League of Cities; and (2) one nonvoting member appointed by the Nevada Indian Commission.

Existing law provides that the term of a voting member of the Advisory Council is 3 years. (NRS 321.740) **Section 1** provides an exception to the 3-year term if a voting member is an elected official of the county that he or she represents on the Advisory Council and does not become a candidate for reelection or is defeated for reelection. In such a circumstance, **section 1** authorizes the board of county commissioners to end the person's membership on the Advisory Council before the expiration of the person's 3-year term. If the board of county commissioners ends the person's membership on the Advisory Council: (1) that





18 person's membership on the Advisory Council ends on the date on which his or her 19 term of office as an elected official of the county ends; and (2) a vacancy exists on the Advisory Council that must be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term.

Existing law requires the Advisory Council to elect a Chair. (NRS 321.740) Section 1 also requires the election of a Vice Chair.

20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 Existing law sets forth the duties of the Advisory Council. (NRS 321.750) Section 2 of this bill requires the Advisory Council to also: (1) advise any federal or state agency or local government on land use planning and policy; (2) assist and advise in the resolution of inconsistencies in land use plans, if requested; and (3) make recommendations related to areas of critical environmental concern.

Section 3 of this bill changes the minimum period required in existing law for notice of certain public hearings of the Advisory Council by publication in 30 newspapers from 20 days to 10 days before the hearing. (NRS 321.770)

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA. REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY. DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 321.740 is hereby amended to read as follows: 2 321.740 1. The Land Use Planning Advisory Council 3 consisting of 17] is hereby created. The Advisory Council consists 4 of:

5 (a) Seventeen voting members appointed by the Governor. fand 6 41

7 (b) One nonvoting member appointed by the Nevada Association of Counties, or its successor organization. [, is hereby 8 9 created.]

(c) One nonvoting member appointed by the Nevada League of 10 Cities and Municipalities, or its successor organization. 11

12 (d) One nonvoting member appointed by the Nevada Indian 13 Commission.

The provisions of subsection 6 of NRS 232A.020 do not 14 2. 15 apply to members of the Advisory Council who also serve as county commissioners, and the Governor may appoint any such member of 16 17 the Advisory Council to one other board, commission or similar body. 18

19 **[2.]** 3. One voting member must be appointed by the Governor 20to the Advisory Council to represent each county. At least 30 days before the beginning of any term of the representative of a county, 21 22 or within 30 days after the position of that representative becomes 23 vacant, the board of county commissioners of that county shall 24 submit to the Governor the name of its nominee or a list of the 25 names of not more than three nominees who are elected officials or 26 other representatives of the county for the position to be filled. If a 27 board of county commissioners submits the names of two or more 28 nominees, the board shall number its nominees in order of 29 preference. That order of preference is not binding upon the Governor. The Governor shall appoint the person so nominated or, 30



1 if more than one person is nominated, one of the persons from the 2 list of nominees.

3 [3.] 4. If a board of county commissioners fails to submit the 4 name of its nominee or a list of nominees within the time required 5 by this subsection or subsection [2,] 3, the Governor may appoint to 6 the Advisory Council any resident of that county as the 7 representative of the county. If a board has timely submitted the 8 name of its nominee or a list of nominees and the Governor fails to 9 appoint a person so nominated:

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(a) If one person has been nominated, that person; or

(b) If two or more persons have been nominated, the personlisted by the board first in order of preference,

13 → shall be deemed to be a voting member of the Advisory Council 14 as of the beginning of the new term or, in the case of an appointment 15 to fill a vacancy, the first meeting of the Advisory Council that is 16 held not less than 30 days after the submission of the nomination 17 unless, before that date, the Governor notifies the board in writing 18 that none of its nominees will be appointed to the Advisory Council. 19 Within 30 days after the date of any such notice, the board shall 20 submit to the Governor the name of a new nominee or a list of new 21 nominees.

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[4. After the initial terms,]

Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, each 23 5. voting member serves a term of 3 years. If a voting member is an 24 25 elected official of the county that he or she represents on the 26 Advisory Council and he or she does not become a candidate for 27 reelection or is defeated for reelection, the board of county 28 commissioners of that county may end the person's membership 29 on the Advisory Council before the expiration of his or her 3-year term. If the board of county commissioners ends the person's 30 31 *membership on the Advisory Council pursuant to this subsection:*

(a) That person's membership on the Advisory Council ends
on the date on which his or her term of office as an elected official
of the county ends; and

(b) A vacancy exists in the membership of the Advisory
Council that must be filled for the remainder of the unexpired
term pursuant to subsections 3 and 4, as applicable.

38 **6.** Any voting member is eligible for reappointment to the 39 Advisory Council.

40 **[5.] 7.** The nonvoting **[member]** *members* of the Advisory 41 Council **[serves]** *serve* at the pleasure of the **[Nevada Association of** 42 Counties, or its successor organization.

43 <u>-6.</u>] appointing authority.

44 **8.** At its first meeting each year, the Advisory Council shall 45 elect a Chair *and Vice Chair* from among its *voting* members.





7. 9. A majority of the voting members of the Advisory 1 2 Council constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business, and a 3 majority of a quorum present at any meeting is sufficient for any official action taken by the Advisory Council. 4

[8.] 10. A board of county commissioners may provide that, 5 6 while engaged in the business of the Advisory Council, a voting member of the Advisory Council is entitled to receive from the 7 8 county he or she represents the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided by law for state officers and employees 9 10 generally.

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NRS 321.750 is hereby amended to read as follows: Sec. 2.

321.750 The Land Use Planning Advisory Council shall:

13 Advise the Administrator on the development and 1. distribution to cities and counties of information useful to land use 14 15 planning.

16 2. Advise the State Land Use Planning Agency regarding the 17 development of plans and statements of policy pursuant to subsection 1 of NRS 321.7355. 18

19 Work cooperatively with the Attorney General and the 3. 20 Nevada Association of Counties as required pursuant to subsection 3 21 of NRS 405.204.

22 4. Advise any federal or state agency or local government on 23 land use planning and policy, including, without limitation, 24 developing a statement of policy, drafting a resolution or providing 25 formal comment on land use planning policies and land 26 management projects of any federal or state agency or local 27 government.

28 5. Assist and advise in the resolution of inconsistencies in 29 land use plans, if requested.

30 **6**. Make recommendations related to areas of critical 31 environmental concern pursuant to NRS 321.770. 32

Sec. 3. NRS 321.770 is hereby amended to read as follows:

321.770 1. The State Land Use Planning Agency shall 33 provide assistance in land use planning for areas of critical 34 35 environmental concern:

36 (a) When the Governor directs that the Agency review and assist 37 in land use planning for an area the Governor finds to be of critical 38 environmental concern.

39 (b) When one or more local government entities request that the 40 Agency advise and assist in land use planning for an area which affects them and which they consider to be of critical environmental 41 42 concern.

Upon receipt of a directive or a request pursuant to 43 2. 44 subsection 1, the Administrator shall study the problems of the area 45 described and meet with the affected local government entities to





receive their initial comments and recommendations. The
 Administrator shall then submit the matter of planning for the area
 of critical environmental concern to the Land Use Planning
 Advisory Council for consideration and recommendation.

5 3. The Land Use Planning Advisory Council shall include in its 6 procedures one or more public hearings upon notice given by at 7 least one publication at least [20] 10 days before the hearing in a 8 newspaper or combination of newspapers having general circulation 9 throughout the area affected and each city and county any portion of 10 whose territory lies within such area. The notice shall state with 11 particularity the subject of the hearing.

4. Following completion of the hearings and consideration of other information, the Land Use Planning Advisory Council shall make its final recommendations for land use planning policies in the area of critical environmental concern. The recommendations may include proposed land use regulations to carry out such policies.

5. No land use regulation adopted by the Land Use Planning
Advisory Council pursuant to this section may become effective
without the approval of the Governor.
