SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to permits to carry concealed firearms issued by certain other states. (BDR 15-96)

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to weapons; authorizing persons who possess permits to carry concealed firearms that were issued by certain other states to continue to carry concealed firearms in this State pursuant to those permits after becoming residents of this State; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law provides that a person who possesses a permit to carry a concealed firearm which was issued by a state that meets certain requirements for reciprocity with this State may, pursuant to that permit, carry a concealed firearm in this State, but if the person becomes a resident of this State and wishes to continue to carry a concealed firearm, the person must obtain a permit from this State within 60 days after becoming a resident. (NRS 202.3688, 202.3689) This bill authorizes such a person who becomes a resident of this State to continue to carry a concealed firearm in this State with the permit issued from the other state until the expiration of that permit.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 202.3688 is hereby amended to read as follows:

202.3688 [1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a] A person who possesses a permit to carry a concealed firearm that was issued by a state included in the list prepared pursuant to NRS 202.3689 may carry a concealed firearm in this State in accordance

with the requirements set forth in NRS 202.3653 to 202.369, inclusive.

[2. A person who possesses a permit to carry a concealed firearm that was issued by a state included in the list prepared pursuant to NRS 202.3689 may not carry a concealed firearm in this State if the person:

(a) Becomes a resident of this State; and

(b) Has not been issued a permit from the sheriff of the county in which he or she resides within 60 days after becoming a resident of this State.]
